Yes, we have a library and it is growing! Each month I will highlight some aspect of the library.


This month will be the author, Eleanor Burns. We have a number of books by Eleanor Burns. Eleanor is a master quilter and former TV series host of the "Quilt in a Day" series which aired in 1994 on PBS for 6 seasons. Growing up Eleanor was dyslexic and taught herself to sew at a young age. She developed an extraordinary ability to make difficult things simple and she enjoyed teaching others. Over 30 years ago Eleanor introduced her first Quilt in a Day book. Even though Quilt in a Day is over 30 years old it is very contemporary today.


The books we have in our library are:


- Applique in a Day & Night (2)

- ⇒ 2 new spools of thread if you want to play Quilter's Bingo (at least 250 yds each)
- ⇒ 3 fat quarters if you want to play Left, Right Center (animal theme)
- ⇒ Your Mystery Quilt fabric (Bette Runnels sent out instructions for cutting last month)
- ⇒ Your Fat Quarter Challenge (Nancy picked a great one this year!)

Driving directions to the retreat center and a list of quilt shops.

To Viña de Lestonnac Retreat Center—39300 De Portola Rd., Temecula, CA 92591 (541) 302-5571 x222

- Take I-15 North to Hwy 79 (Temecula Parkway) in Temecula. Exit on ramp and turn right. Go about 5.1 miles to Anza Rd. and turn left.
- You will pass Home Depot and Wal-Mart before Anza Rd. At the next stop sign, (a short ways,) turn right on De Portola Rd. You will pass horse ranches and vineyards.
- About 4.2 miles on the left you will see Viña de Lestonnac. It is the very next left after the Danza del Sol Winery. You will see the bright blue roofs of the various buildings.
- Make a left into the entrance, which is a long driveway and follow this road to the bottom of the hill to the dorm rooms, (two story buildings) where you will find ample parking.
- Farther down are the classrooms and parking. Go here first to unload sewing supplies. Dorm rooms will be ready after 10:00am.

The Traveling Quilter ~ Kathy Cadwell

I attended the Garden Quilt Show sponsored by the Iowa Quilt Guild at Reiman Gardens on Saturday, 26 August. The Gardens are located on the grounds of Iowa State University in Ames, Iowa and are very extensive, including an enclosed butterfly garden, Children's Garden and extensive landscaped grounds with statues and water features. It's home to the world's largest concrete garden gnome, Elwood (see picture). They were also holding a special exhibit of sculptures, all made totally from recycled items.

If you look closely at the edges of the eagle's wings, you will see spatulas, knives, spoons and an array of kitchen gadgets. The dragonfly's wings are ironing boards and his legs are constructed of the bottom supports for the boards!

It was a small quilt show but included a range of styles and techniques. My favorite was "Plaid Cats in my Garden" by Judy Reynolds. I immediately thought of Laurel as each cat was individually shaded with crayons and hand embroidered. It was really stunning. I've included a close up picture of one of the squares so you can see the details.

The next picture is from a row quilt featuring "Persian Embroidery" that the quilter said in her description was popular in the 17th century. It looked like some type of fussy cut applique but I could not see any stitches attaching it. Have any of you heard of this technique? Several of the quilt descriptions said the makers had found completed squares at garage sales, antique shops or vintage stores. Just a heads up to keep our eyes open!

The rest of the pictures are quilts that caught my eye that I thought you might enjoy and a few of the gardens. Note the navy blue whole cloth quilt. It was tie dyed with a shibori technique. She then outlined each area with sashiko embroidery and had it custom quilted. The maker said it was a table cloth she bought in China years ago on a hot and muggy day. By the time she got back to her hotel, she was covered with the dye! She certainly turned it into a beautifully quilted work of art.

Hope you all enjoy reading about this show and that the pictures turn out well. I'll be back in September and look forward to seeing you all. -Kathy Cadwell
