Yes, we do wait all year to say that! It's shaping up to be another really great show for us! With the Hoffman, we will have over 160 items on display. Thanks to all who have signed up to work at the show. <u>Since you have to come by to pick up your entries, on Saturday anyway, please stay and help us clean up to the extent you are physically able</u>. Remember, Bayview does NOT employ a custodian, so WE are responsible for returning the church spaces to normal.

Let's go over some final details:

Show workers:

- 1. Please wear your CVQG T-shirt if you have one and stop by the Admission Desk to pick up your paper flower lei. This will make it easy for guests to find someone to ask directions or questions. <u>Please return them on Friday and Saturday</u> at the end of the show and we can use them next year.
- 2. Free bottled water is available at the food service door for workers, just ask the ladies to give you one. There is also a water fountain to refill reusable bottles. Food service is available for purchase.
- 3. Please make sure that everyone, guild members, vendors and guests, respects the church spaces. Here are some general guidelines that we make all the vendors agree to. If you see anyone not complying, please ask them to stop or call Laurel or myself.
 - ♦ ABSOLUTELY NO FOOD/DRINK in the exhibit areas.
 - ♦ The usual fire/safety requirements must be met: no blocking of exits, fire extinguishers, bathrooms or sidewalks, no cords crossing the walkways. No open flames. Nothing attached to the walls, even tape, without specific permission from Sherry Wagner, our Bayview Facilities Manager.

Parking:

- 1. Guild members, please park behind the church on the FAR grassy section to the right or left of the basketball hoop/play area. This will free up parking for our guests. Pull in as far as you can, and we can park 2-3 cars deep
- 2. **ABSOLUTELY NO PARKING ON THE GRASS IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO THE CHURCH BUILDING** (sprinkler damage). We will have this area roped off with stakes Bob Peterson made and yellow caution tape.
- 3. <u>Unless you absolutely can't walk the short distance from the grassy area</u>, **please don't use the handicapped spaces** as there are only 4 of them. Please leave them for our guests. During Thursday Set-up, the vendors will use these spaces to unload.

Publicity:

<u>PLEASE help us get the word out about our show.</u> We've sent out four notices to the Electronic Newsletter, QuilterzNooz and Sylvia and Linda posted flyers in many of the 3rd Ave. businesses. Rosie Gonzalez published a notice about the show in her shop's weekly sales e-mail and I have seen a couple of posts by members on Facebook, but we need as much publicity as possible. Please publish on Instagram, Nextdoor, Twitters, etc. and talk it up among your friends and neighbors. Thanks!

IMPORTANT QUILT DROP OFF INFO—PLEASE READ!!!

Delivering your quilt on Take in Day

- FOLD your quilt, RIGHT SIDE OUT, with top right corner of the entry as it will be displayed on top. This will speed up receiving your quilt at take in.
- If it is not folded like the above description, you may be asked to wait for help until others have checked in their quilts. Thank you for your patience.
- Bring your entries to Bayview Orthodox Presbyterian Church, 505 E. Naples St, CV, 91911, on Wed, 10 May, between Noon and 3 pm.
- If you need to arrange another drop off time/ place, you MUST contact Jeri Nolfi-Brown

IMPORTANT QUILT PICK UP INFO—PLEASE READ!!!

Entries must be picked up Saturday, May 13, between 3:30 and 4:30 PM.

- Note this change!! As quilts are taken down from the different areas, they will be taken to the patio area, where tables will be labeled (Large Quilts, Medium Quilts, etc.) with the categories the entries were in. If you need help, we will be there to help you find your entries.
- •We expect all members, if physically able, to help with show Take Down BEFORE you pick up your quilts. Please bear in mind that many of the chair people have been there everyday since Wednesday setting the show up. We need help transporting equipment to trucks/SUVs, driving it back to the Congregational Church storage area and setting the Bayview spaces back up. A special thanks to those of you who have volunteered your trucks. If everyone pitches in, it only takes about 90 minutes.

Admission Desk Update



I remember Sandy Corbin's 2019 presentation to our Guild, when her high-impact quilts with lots of black and white and polka dot fabric sent me shopping right away! At our May meeting, we welcome her back with a new program, *Let's Talk Borders*.

For a special quilt, the border is more than a last-minute afterthought. It's part of the quilt's design that complements and enhances the other elements, giving your quilt that zing that ties everything together. In her 40 years of quilting, Sandy has encountered and analyzed many opportunities to create the best possible border for a particular quilt. She will illustrate the impact a border can make on your quilt explain how to determine whether the quilt actually needs a border, show us different styles of borders, and teach us how to size the border to fit any quilt.






LAST CALL APPROACHING FOR WENDY MATHSON'S MAY 20th WORKSHOP!!

STORM AT SEA AND SNAIL'S TRAILS BLOCKS- PIECING WITH TRIMPLATES



In January, Wendy Mathson inspired us with her beautiful quilts made with combinations of two classic quilt patterns, Storm at Sea and Snail's Trail. Now, in her full-day (6 hour) workshop on Saturday, May 20, Wendy will teach us how to accomplish these stunning quilts ourselves. You can choose between the Easy or Advanced options. Her simplified method for creating these complex-looking blocks without templates or foundation piecing utilizes easy, but oversized, cuts of fabric, which are then trimmed down accurately to the size and shape needed with her Trimplate tools.


She will bring enough of the Trimplates for all class members to use, and will also have them available for optional purchase after the class, and her class materials list to provided to enrollees consists of things you already have on hand.

With our member, Nona Fontenot, having procured free use of her mobile home park's recreation room for the workshop, and our Guild guaranteeing the cost for members at \$30, this is half the price you would currently expect for a full-day workshop, and a real bargain for us. It's so much fun to learn new skills together and to see how our fabric choices result in very different quilts from the same patterns. I hope everyone who has a chance to fit this class into their schedule will take advantage of this opportunity.

We will be offering enrollment to non-members at \$40 if we have open slots after our May meeting, so please bring your \$30 payment to the meeting and sign up.
