# March Program ~ Carolina Moore

## **CUTTING MACHINES AND QUILTING**

CAROLINA MOORE

As you mark that template, carefully outline and cut one of those many applique pieces you need for your quilt pattern, or slice and sub-cut the numerous squares you need for your bed-size quilt, do you find yourself yearning for a cutting machine that could be doing this work for you with more speed and precision than you would ever be likely to accomplish on your own? That's what's why there's a proliferation of cutting machines for quilters and crafters on the market today.



You've seen Accuquilt, Cricut, Sizzix and other cutting machines, but the cost, the feature variations and other unknown pros and cons make you hesitate before you invest another quilting gadget. Would a cutting machine be a godsend that would enable you to plow through your stash so fast that you'd have to go shopping for fabric? Or would you find that it's just not useful enough with your style of quilting to make it a good purchase for you?

Our March speaker, Carolina Moore, will help you answer those questions, and will give you an opportunity to compare some of the popular models face-to-face.

She's a quilter, pattern designer, teacher and YouTube video caster. You can find links to tutorials, patterns and other quilt-relate information on her website, <a href="http://www.alwaysexpectmoore.com">http://www.alwaysexpectmoore.com</a>

At our meeting, she will be explaining how the machines work, and discussing the advantages and disadvantages of different makes and models. She will focus primarily on the Cricut Maker and the Accuquilt, two favorites among quilters. She is also familiar with the Crafter's Companion, Gemini and the Sizzix Fabi, and has used the Silhouette, Brother Scan and Cut, and Sizzix eClips. By the end of the evening, we will all be well-informed and prepared to shop. DM

These are the most important points to put in your notices. Pick and choose as you see fit, depending on your audience. Please don't forget to pick up bookmarks and posters to distribute. The success of our show depends on getting people to come see it! Thanks to all of you who have taken the Opportunity Quilt and bookmarks to the various shops and guilds.

We will be passing around the sign up sheets for show workers at the March and April meetings. We're asking EVERY member to sign up for at least one slot! It's only 2 hours of your time but will make a significant contribution to the success of the show.

One change in sign ups this year: we will have three slots on the Admission Desk from 10 - 12 each day. The show was so popular last year that we had quite a lineup waiting to get in on the mornings of both days. Hopefully, with three people to split up the tasks, we can alleviate this problem.

We will be sending out an email with the entry form attached so that you can open it, make your entries, save it and send it on as an attachment in an email to Shawnie Meeks, our Registrar. We will also have paper forms available at the March and April meetings and are still hoping for a "cloud" version when Gloria gets back from the U.K.

That's all for now but things are moving into high gear so we expect to have additional announcements at our March 8 meeting.

# Categories for the May 2023 Show

\*\*Please read carefully as there are CHANGES in the Category Titles, Contents and Size Requirements!!!\*\*

Here are the categories for the May 2023 Show:

Large Quilt (longest side <u>over</u> 70 ")

Medium Quilt (longest side 40 to 70 ")

Small Quilt (longest side under 40")

Challenge (longest side under 40")

Soft Creations (\*see description, below)

Youth (maker 14 years or younger, longest side under 40")



The changes in, and consolidation of categories, from previous years are not random decisions. Bayview is a lovely location for us but it is split up into more spaces than the Congregational Church was so we have to adjust accordingly. The Show Committee had to take many issues into account as we set up the categories, including:

Sizes of available display space
Quilt rack availability
Felt backing numbers and sizes
Number of entries historically in each class
Hoffman Challenge hanging requirements

Space for our guild booths and displays (Admission Desk, Opportunity Quilt, Basket Raffle, Boutique, Sew and Craft, etc.)
Spaces for the vendors

### So, what class does my entry belong in?

- If your item is primarily flat (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE LONGEST SIDE. It doesn't matter if this is a top or side measurement the LONGEST side determines your category.
- \*If your entry is NOT flat, it goes in the new Soft Creations Category. This new class combines the old OTHER and WEARABLES categories. Soft Creations includes wearables, hats pillows, totes, jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, book covers, whatever. If we can't put a sleeve on it to hang from a quilt rack, it goes into this category.
- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Class (<u>Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS</u>)!
- Youth Class entries are <u>MADE by people 14 years or younger</u>. Please indicate maker and age in your description. Longest side cannot exceed 40 inches.
- If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved but this takes up valuable time during our busiest period just before the show. Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class!

With the Hoffman Challenge serving as our Special Exhibition this year, we will be designing spaces for seven different categories. This takes time and effort on the part of our Show Designer and Registrar, so PLEASE help us out! We had to move many entries around last year as people entered their items into the wrong categories. Please read the above information that we've painstakingly developed over many discussions within the Show Committee and enter your piece in the correct class. Let's prevent the most common errors from last year:

- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Category and are limited to 40 inches on the longest side.
- You must include the name and AGE of the maker of entries in the Youth Class.
- Measure the LONGEST side of your piece to determine the class.
