## Time to Prepare for the 2023 Quilt Show!

Hard to believe, but it's time to start seriously working on our next show, scheduled for 12 and 13 May 2023. Once again, we will be having it at Bayview Orthodox Presbyterian Church (BV), thanks to the generosity of guild member Sherry Wagner, her husband, Pastor Roger, and the church congregation. Most of the Show Sub-chairs for individual areas are reprising their roles, please see the list in the "Show Sub-chairs" article in this newsletter. We welcome Debbie Elliott as our new Vendor Chair and Janice Lambert to the Admission Desk team. We do need a volunteer for Publicity, however. Getting word out about the show is the responsibility of ALL guild members but we need to have someone coordinate the major activities. We sent out the job requirements on a separate e-mail the last week in Dec. Please step up and help us out! This job is NOT a major time consumer!

Our 2023 Opportunity Quilt, coordinated by Carol Adair, is titled, "Crowning Beauty." She hopes to have it ready to display at our January Meeting – it's stunning!! Thanks to the Thursday Morning Hand Quilting group for their beautiful work. Susan Allers has once again volunteered to chair our Opportunity Quilt ticket <u>sales but she needs an assistant</u>. We are a little late starting our sales this year but, once you see "Crowning Beauty," you'll agree with us that the tickets will almost sell themselves!

Please mark your calendars with these dates:

April 22, 2023 - cut off for show entries

May 10, 2023 – equipment drop off and Quilt Take – in at BV

May 11, 2023 - Show set up

May 12 and 13, 2023 - Quilt Show and Vendor Mall

May 13, 2023 after 3 pm - show take down



As with every show, there will be some changes in how we do things. The 2022 Show was by far our most successful ever with a record of 384 guests attending! However, the Show Committee has carefully evaluated last year's show and come up with some suggestions for making 2023's show even better:

- There will be fewer show classes this year due to display space limitations and having the Hoffman Challenge back with us (thanks, Janet Stevenson!!) See the "Show Categories" article elsewhere in this newsletter.
- We will be separating out our guild booths from our exhibit areas, except for the Opportunity Quilt display. Raffle Baskets will move to the Courtyard sidewalk and the Boutique and Sew and Craft Booths will be in separate rooms without any exhibits in those areas.
- The Admission Desk will be located in the small room just to the right of last year's entry door and will be staffed with 3 people during the morning shifts. The increased attendance last year really put a strain on this area when it was only staffed with two people.
- **We will limit our vendors to 6** and all vendor spaces will be on the sidewalks surrounding the Courtyard.
- The entry form for the show has been completely revamped and contains detailed instructions for which class to place your quilt in. In addition to having the entry form in the Newsletter, we will be sending it out in Word and Adobe formats in separate e-mails.

  Shawnie, our Registrar, prefers electronic or typed submissions (legibility was terrible on many entries last year) so please follow the directions on the entry form carefully. Printed forms will be available at guild meetings starting in February as a last resort. If you use one of these, PRINT your information!!!!

## Categories for the May 2023 Show

\*\*Please read carefully as there are CHANGES in the Category Titles, Contents and Size Requirements!!!\*\*

Here are the categories for the May 2023 Show:

Large Quilt (longest side <u>over</u> 70 ")

Medium Quilt (longest side 40 to 70 ")

Small Quilt (longest side under 40")

Challenge (longest side under 40")

Soft Creations (\*see description, below)

Youth (maker 14 years or younger, longest side under 40")



The changes in, and consolidation of categories, from previous years are not random decisions. Bayview is a lovely location for us but it is split up into more spaces than the Congregational Church was so we have to adjust accordingly. The Show Committee had to take many issues into account as we set up the categories, including:

Sizes of available display space
Quilt rack availability
Felt backing numbers and sizes
Number of entries historically in each class
Hoffman Challenge hanging requirements

Space for our guild booths and displays (Admission Desk, Opportunity Quilt, Basket Raffle, Boutique, Sew and Craft, etc.) Spaces for the vendors

#### So, what class does my entry belong in?

- If your item is primarily flat (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE LONGEST SIDE. It doesn't matter if this is a top or side measurement the LONGEST side determines your category.
- \*If your entry is NOT flat, it goes in the new Soft Creations Category. This new class combines the old OTHER and WEARABLES categories. Soft Creations includes wearables, hats pillows, totes, jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, book covers, whatever. If we can't put a sleeve on it to hang from a quilt rack, it goes into this category.
- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Class (<u>Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS</u>)!
- Youth Class entries are <u>MADE by people 14 years or younger</u>. Please indicate maker and age in your description.
   Longest side cannot exceed 40 inches.
- If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved but this takes up valuable time during our busiest period just before the show. Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class!

With the Hoffman Challenge serving as our Special Exhibition this year, we will be designing spaces for seven different categories. This takes time and effort on the part of our Show Designer and Registrar, so PLEASE help us out! We had to move many entries around last year as people entered their items into the wrong categories. Please read the above information that we've painstakingly developed over many discussions within the Show Committee and enter your piece in the correct class. Let's prevent the most common errors from last year:

- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Category and are limited to 40 inches on the longest side.
- You must include the name and AGE of the maker of entries in the Youth Class.
- Measure the LONGEST side of your piece to determine the class.
