## 2022 Show Update

PUBLICITY



Hard to believe it, but it is only about 9 weeks until our 2022 show! **It is really critical at this point that every guild member starts publicizing the show as much as possible, especially since we are in a new location.** We need all of you to put entries

on your social media accounts (FB, Twitter, Nextdoor, etc.), tell all their friends and families and distribute posters and bookmarks. Katie Petty will have bookmarks available at our March meeting. Please print out the show posters from the Newsletters and distribute them around town – stores, quilt shops, church meetings, social clubs, hairdressers, doctor offices, whatever you can think of! No sense putting on a show if nobody knows about it!

**Show Entries!** Nancy has been having some health problems so she will not be able to serve as our Show Registrar. **Shawnie Meeks has stepped up to take her place with assistance from Janet Stevenson. Be sure to mail or give your entry form (s) to Shawnie !** Her info is listed in the notes on the bottom of the Show Entry Form on p.6 in this Newsletter.



**Quilt Drop Off!!** It will be at the Bayview Orthodox Presbyterian Church (BOPC) on Wed, 11 May, between 12-3 pm unless you make other arrangements with Billie Crino. That info is also included in on the bottom of the Show Entry Form included in this Newsletter.

**Vendors!** One of our fabric vendors (Sunlight Fabrics and Avi8tor Lady Pincushions) has withdrawn but another one has signed up for the show so we are holding steady at 6 vendors. Our newest vendor is Judipatuti Fabrics (fabric, notions, patterns, precuts, etc.)

**Food!** Laurel has a line on a local charitable group that may be able to provide food during the show; stay tuned.

**Sign up Lists!** We will start passing around sign up lists for the various quilt show work areas at the March meeting and, also, in April. The May meeting will be the night before show setup where we can discuss any final details.

**Masking!** We are waiting to see what the current recommendations are from the state and CDC in May on mask wearing. We will need to decide by 1 May whether masks are recommended, required or obsolete so we can get the word out. I know the current state restrictions on indoor mask wearing have been lifted but we need to remain alert and stay flexible as the virus has mutated and fooled us before! Page 1 has the CDC website for recommendations in every state and county.



**We need moving help!! Does anyone know of any high school students that need community service hours?** As Laurel and I have mentioned before, BOPC does not employ a janitor that we could use to move furniture back into position after the show. We could sure use them on Saturday during take down so that we have help moving the chairs and other furniture back where they belong at BOPC and getting the guild equipment back over to the CCC basement storage area. Please let either Laurel or I know if you have someone willing to help.

# 2022 Show Categories

Below you will find the categories listed for entries for our 2022 show. **Please read this information carefully before filling out your Show Entry Forms , paying special attention to which category your entry belongs in, which is primarily determined by SIZE (as measured on longest side of your item).** The Show Entry Form is on p.6 of this newsletter.

Please note that we have separated the Challenges into TWO categories. Please turn your entries in to Shawnie Meeks, our new Registrar, AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. You don't need to wait until the April 30<sup>th</sup> deadline! The sooner she gets them, the sooner she can organize them, print display cards & get our program printed.

## **A couple of things of special importance:**

PLEASE remember that we need to **HANG** as many exhibits as possible. **That means that things like table runners and other flat objects (except Wearables and Others) MUST have a hanging sleeve.** We simply do not have enough room to display them on tables.

**\*\*Also note that the primary determinant for which category an item goes into is the SIZE\*\*.** Most table runners, for example, will end up in the Wall Hanging Category. Yes, that means they must have a hanging sleeve.

**Please also note the size LIMITS** on the categories, especially the Challenge and Youth Group. This is not meant to limit creativity; we only have so many racks and so much exhibit space to use.

## Here are the 2022 Show Categories:

1. Large Quilts (Longest side exceeds 75")
2. Small Quilts (Longest side measures between 40 and 75 inches)
3. Wall Hanging/Table Runner (Longest side measures under 40 inches)
4. Other (pillows, objects, etc. Things that need to sit on a flat surface)
- Wearables (clothing, totes, purses, jewelry, etc. Anything you wear or carry as an accessory)
5. CVQG Challenge: Circles (longest side measures under 40 inches)
6. CVQG Challenge: Forced Perspective (longest side measures under 40 inches)
7. Youth Group (Must measure 40 inches or smaller on longest edge; **maker must be 16 years or under**). This will be a non-judged category. All entrants will receive a participation ribbon.

## CVQG MARCH PROGRAM – FUN WITH FREE MOTION QUILTING Postponed from January and February

If all goes well with my audio-visual aspirations, we will view the special video program created for quilting guilds to show at their meetings by LEAH DAY, entitled *FUN WITH FREE MOTION QUILTING*.

Our guild purchased this program at the outset of the COVID shutdowns, but we haven't had an opportunity to show it at an in-person meeting until now. A couple of members previously received a link to the Vimeo site where they could view it, but now we can all see it together via my laptop and the AV system at our meeting.

This is a pre-recorded 1-hour class online class, easy enough for near-beginners to understand, but full of tips and valuable information for more experienced free-motion quilters.

## FROM OUR SHOW DESIGNER: HOW TO HAVE YOUR QUILT LOOK ITS BEST!

For our show, every quilt needs a sleeve:

- ♦ A sleeve allows us to hang close to 200 quilts in 3-4 hours.
- ♦ A sleeve helps your quilt look it's best by hanging flat and level.
- ♦ A sleeve can be a temporary thing, basted on, that you remove after the show.
- ♦ If you are entering A VERY LARGE QUILT (100"+) please make the sleeve in 2 sections so there is a 6" gap in the middle. (The big quilts are sometimes really heavy and need a pole in the middle to support the weight.)

**When filling out your entry form, PLEASE measure carefully and round up if is a fraction of an inch. We plan the layout based on the WIDTH of your quilt.**

We think we'll have lots of space this year so let's see all of your cool projects from the last 2 years! We can always winnow later if need be.
