Purpose

- 1. Share one member's work in depth
- 2. Build enthusiasm
- 3. Inspire others
- 4. Teach exhibit design
- 5. Teach show hanging procedures

Requirements for participating

- 1. Must be a current member
- 2. Have 5 10 guilts/pieces to share
- 3. Help design the exhibit
- 4. Help hang and tear down the exhibit
- Write an artistic statement (1-2 paragraphs about the work) to be published in the newsletter prior to the showcase.

The showcased member may speak during the meeting if they choose and time permitting. This is not intended as a sale (any negotiating or transactions should not be carried out at or during meeting.)

I volunteer to go first at June potluck as a trial run (with my series of 7 silk quilts) and if all goes well, would be happy to chair the project for a year.

I chose a challenge for my theme.

My first quilt, Only God Can Make a Tree, was inspired Piecemaker's 2002 calendar. Instead of the silks, velvets, and lace of the traditional Crazy Quilt, I used cotton fabrics, crochet and lace for embellishments. It took me over two years to complete it.

The second quilt, Lives Intertwined, was my first (and last) bargello quilt. The challenge was to get all 6,497 pieces in their proper places when my cat had other ideas.

The remaining quilts remaining were all made using the challenge fabrics from retreats I have attended.

I hope you all enjoy my efforts.


