
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

A Quilter's Journey by Shelly Swanland

For 20 years, Shelley has been creating Cathedral Window Quilts entirely by machine. This technique uses three-dimensional piecing to construct the top and during quilting, the bias folds are rolled and stitched in place to create a finished quilt.

She is the author of Machine Stitched Cathedral Windows and Machine Stitched Cathedral Stars, among numerous patterns.

She lectures and teaches nationally.



OK, Ladies, It's time to Get Cracking!!

Our Annual Quilt Show and Vendor Mall is May 2 and 3, 2025

Happy New Year to everyone! The start of the New Year also means we need to get moving on preparations for our upcoming show. Last year's show was our biggest and best attended ever. If we want to repeat that success, everyone needs to participate. Here are some things to remember and some ways you can help:

- Our Show is a week earlier this year so the DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES WILL BE
 MID-APRIL! Please plan accordingly! It's important to submit your entries
 ASAP so that Shawnie Meeks, our Registrar, isn't overwhelmed with a glut of
 forms at the last minute. There will be an entry form in the February and March
 Newsletters that you can submit electronically and paper copies at the February
 and March meetings for those of you without a printer.
- We did not have enough people express an interest in adding a hand quilting
 category to the show so they will be the same as last year: Large Quilts, Medium
 Quilts, Small Quilts, Challenge (Yo-yos), Soft Creations and Youth. See the article
 elsewhere in this newsletter for a full description of each category and advise
 for where to put your entries.
- In addition to your entries, start working on your Boutique items. It's a good time to clean out your sewing room to find things for the Sew and Craft Booth.
 You can also be thinking ahead for items to donate for the Basket Raffle.
- As soon as Susan Allers and Ann McGregor have your Opportunity Quilt tickets ready, please pick them up AND return them ASAP. Remember, we ask that everyone sell (or buy!) \$20 worth of tickets. This is our major fundraiser for the year that supports paying our speakers and allows us to keep our dues at \$30 annually.
- We'd like to target the local assisted living places this year with some publicity
 as they are likely to have many residents interested in quilting. If you know a
 contact person, like the Social Activities Director, at any of the local retirement
 homes, please send that info to Jacque Blix, our publicity chair, at
 jacqueblix@msn.com.

- If you know anyone that might want to be a vendor, please send that info to Debbie Elliott, our vendor chair, at dlelliott01@gmail.com

Here are the activities that your Show Committee has been up to:

- Melody Cernitz has obtained five new quilt racks and replacement parts for some
 of our older racks. Lindy Wilhelm is working on replacements parts for one of our
 Savage racks. Melody also made a replacement carrying case for the big silver
 steel quilt stand that we display the Opportunity Quilt on at the show.
- Bob Stevenson is making more tangs (the pieces with holes on the end of the crossbars that allow us to link quilt racks) and some additional telescoping cross racks.
- Laurel Maloney is making repairs to one of the rack carrying cases (these have taken a lot of abuse over the years)!
- Susan Bellis has obtained the participation ribbons for the 2025 show.

That's it for now. Please pay close attention to the show articles in the upcoming newsletters, especially the category descriptions and size limits for entries. We hope everyone has a lovely holiday and we look forward to collaborating with you in the New Year to make our show another success!

Categories for the 2025 Quilt Show

- 1. Large Quilt (longest side over 70 ")
- 2. Medium Quilt (longest side 40 to 70 ")
- 3. Small Quilt (longest side under 40")
- 4. Challenge (longest side under 40") Yo-yos are this year's challenge
- Soft Creations (*see description, below)
- Youth (maker 14 years or younger, longest side under 40")

These are the same categories as we had last year. The number of categories and size restrictions are primarily dictated by:

- 1. Sizes of available display space
- 2. Quilt rack availability
- 3. Felt backing numbers and sizes
- 4. Number of entries historically in each class
- 5. Hoffman Challenge hanging requirements
- 6. Space for our guild booths (Admission Desk, Opportunity Quilt, Basket Raffle, Boutique, Sew and Craft, etc.)
- 7. Spaces for the vendors

So, what class does my entry belong in?

- If your item is primarily flat (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE LONGEST SIDE.
- If your entry is NOT flat, it goes in the Soft Creations Category. Soft Creations includes wearables, hats, pillows, totes,
 jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, book covers, whatever. If we can't put a sleeve on it to hang from a quilt rack, it goes
 into this category.
- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Class. This year's challenge is Yo-yos as a main feature of your entry. (Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS)!
- Youth Class entries are <u>MADE</u> by people 14 years or younger. Please indicate maker and age on your entry form. Longest side cannot exceed 40 inches.
- If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved but this takes up valuable time during our busiest period just
 before the show. Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size
 limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class! If you have a table runner, please put the sleeve on the
 SHORT side so it hangs down from the display dowel.

Let's prevent the most common errors :

- CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Category and are limited to 40 inches on the longest side.
- . You must include the name and AGE of the maker of entries in the Youth Class.
- Measure the LONGEST side of your piece to determine the class.


