PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CONTINUED...

I am also putting out a request for help. The quilt show is aggressively being planned and it takes a village to be successful. I see those that helped in positions last year are graciously returning but Kathy Cadwell still needs some help. One area of help needed is hanging the Hoffman challenge quilts. Please ask yourself if you could offer support in this. If everyone does a little, the task is lighter. I'm sure Kathy will be informing us of what other areas she needs support in and I trust we will all jump in where we can to have another great show. More to come on this as the time gets closer.

It's time to be working on quilts for our sew-in next month. With the holidays coming there is a need for quilts within the organizations we support.

Speaking of that, if you remember last month we were visited by a speaker from the Armed Services YMCA. They provide quilts to children whose parents are deployed. We were asked to help make quilts. They provide the pictures printed on fabric and a prepaid address label. The pattern they suggest is a simple block pattern with borders. They are small cuddle guilt size and we are free to use our imaginations in fabric choices. I requested five kits and they are all in the mail to the waiting children. So fast and simple to make. I cannot explain the joy I felt looking at the adorable faces of children with their deployed parent as I was designing and sewing the quilt. I used some novelty fabric for the squares in between the pictures. It was fun to look at the little boy for example (aged three) and deciding if he looked like he was a truck or fire engine kind of guy. I chose the truck fabric. I pondered over a little six year old girl thinking about what her favorite color might be. Looking at her clothes and accessories in the picture I guessed it was purple. So, I pulled out some purple fabric. We dont always know who our quilts go to and we wonder. These quilts were a joy because I saw the child and could almost feel their joy opening the box. They take very little fabric and a great scrap buster. The design is simple enough for a beginner, the guild will provide batting and the shipping is free. All it cost me was some thread and about an hour of time. Most of that time was spent auditioning fabric and imagining how happy these children will be to hug a guilt with a parent who is deployed. I encourage you to participate in this, even if you only make one, I understand they have a wait list and that is heart breaking to me. A few quilters can reduce the wait list in no time and fulfill the need. I have pictures on my phone if you would like to see or if you want to help, but need more information, grab me. We can make a difference with very little effort.




