

# REMEMBERING CATHY CLARK



I have to inform you that my mother, Cathy Clark, passed away on July 13, 2022 after celebrating her 100th birthday in April. She has been a member of the CVQG and the Wednesday morning quilt class since 2014.

Born in Brooklyn NY, she attended Central Needle High School where she began her lifelong love of sewing. (As a child I always remember her with a thimble on her finger!) Before she came to live with me, she was a charter member of the Citrus Friendship Quilters Guild in Inverness Florida and a founder and treasurer of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Foundation.

My Mom so enjoyed sewing quilts for her friends and family including her children, six grandchildren, eight great grandchildren and an infinite number of charity quilts over the years. Her hand work was loved and adored. We attended retreats together, car trips to national quilt shows and hundreds of quilt shops. She always had something in her hands she was sewing."

Karen is a popular speaker and teacher at quilt guilds and conferences throughout California and across the country, as well as on quilt cruises.

She has been designing "unique, lively and happy" quilt patterns since 1996, under the name of Java House Quilt. She specializes in animal themes with both pieced and appliqued blocks. She is currently working on a line of fabrics with Hoffman California, with whom she regularly collaborates.

Her work has been published in national magazines, books, calendars and catalogs, and has been seen at AQS, Quilt Market, Quilt Festival, Pacific International and Road to California shows.

For our October meeting, she will be presenting her "SMUGGLE Principles" program --Seven design elements which make a quilt "sing!"

# 2023 Show News and Show Category Descriptions

It's time to start the planning for our 2023 Show! **May 12 and 13, 2023** are reserved at the Bayview Orthodox Presbyterian Church for our Annual Quilt Show and Vendor Mall. While our 2022 Show was an enormous success, we did uncover some issues with our new venue. Displaying the entries across many different rooms and combining them with our booths resulted in some rooms being overcrowded and confusion among our guests as to where exhibits were located. As a result of discussions at the Show Committee's After-Action Meeting, next year's show will have some changes. This includes Show Categories and requirements. Please read the information below and plan accordingly.

## **2023 Show Categories**

Large Quilts (Longest side measures over 70"

Medium Quilts (longest side measures from 40 to 70")

Small Quilt (longest side under 40") – includes wall hangings and table runners

Dimensional Shape (combines the old Other and Wearable categories)

Challenge (longest side UNDER 40")

Youth (maker 14 years or younger) – reduced from the previous 16-year age limit

Special Exhibit: Hoffman Challenge

<u>Please use these guidelines as you determine what category your entry belongs in:</u>

**If your item is primarily flat** (quilt, wall hanging, table runner), it goes in a Small, Medium or Large Quilt Class BASED ON THE MEASUREMENT OF THE <u>LONGEST</u> SIDE. It doesn't matter if this is a top or side measurement - the <u>LONGEST</u> side determines your category.

**If your entry is <u>NOT</u> flat**, it goes in the Dimensional Shape category. This includes wearables, pillows, totes, bowls, handbags, jewelry, furniture, stuffed animals, hats, etc.

CVQG Challenge pieces go in the Challenge Class (Longest side CANNOT exceed 40 inches, NO EXCEPTIONS)! Youth Class entries are MADE by people 14 years or younger. Please indicate maker and age in your description so the Registrar can put it on the display card.

If you enter your quilt in the wrong class, it will be moved but this takes time. *Please help the Registrar and Designer by MEASURING the LONGEST SIDE, LOOKING at the size limitations/class descriptions and entering the correct class!* 

All entries, other than in the Dimensional Category, must have a sleeve. For Table Runners, please place your sleeve on the SHORTEST side. This helps the designer arrange them in a more space-saving pattern.

Next year, we will not be mixing exhibits with our vendors or CVQG booth spaces. Current plans call for restricting our vendors to six, all placed in the patio walkways. The Boutique and Sew and Craft Booths will be in separate rooms.

We hope this helps everyone with planning their entries. Please call us if you have any questions.


