DIARRHEA

Imodium Follow BRAT diet (bananas, rice, applesauce & toast)

Call the office if > 24 hours of diarrhea without improvement

GERD, UPSET STOMACH

Tums Simethicone Gas-X Cimetidine (Tagamet) Aluminum Hydroxide (Gaviscon) Famotidine (Pepcid)

Rolaids ** DO NOT USE **

PEPTO-BISMOL

KAOPECTATE ALKA SELTZER

(contains asprin)

HEMMOROIDS

Preparation H (safe throughout pregnancy)

Tucks Pads

Witch Hazel Pads

CALL THE OFFICE if you think you have a thrombosed hemorroid (firm, exquisitely painful)

TOOTHACHE

Oraiel

INSOMNIA

Benadryl Unisom

LEG CRAMPS

Increase hydration. Drink an electrolyte beverage or potassium rich foods

Take Magnesium Glycinate at night, up to 500mg per day

GO TO THE ER: If only one leg is hurting all the time, swelling, red, warm

NOSE BLEEDS OR **GUM BLEEDS**

Common in pregnancy

Continue with regular dental exams

COME IN TO SEE DOCTOR: if persistent or you are worried

LICE TREATMENT

RID is safe

YEAST INFECTION

Monistat 7

NAUSEA / VOMITING

1/2 tab Unisom with Vit B6 25mg 3x/day (every 6-8hrs)

Small frequent meals

Vitamin B6 3x/day (every 6-8hrs)

Ginger containing products

Sea Bands (form of accupressure on wrists)

Peppermint

CALL THE CLINIC: If unable to keep liquids down for more than one day or 24 hrs.

PAIN MEDICATIONS

Tylenol (acetaminophen) for minor aches and pains, headaches

Tylenol Extra Strength 2 tabs every 6 hours (not to exceed 4,000 mg per day in a 24 hr period

** DO NOT USE **

Aspirin, Motrin, Advil, Aleve (unless prescribed by your OB provider)

INSECT REPELLENT

DEET containing repellent is safe in pregnancy

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
