Mr. Gary Young currently serves as the Director of Bands at LeBlanc Middle School in Sulphur, Louisiana. He earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from Northeast Louisiana University (now the University of Louisiana at Monroe) in 1979.

Mr. Young has devoted 44 years to teaching band in District V, sharing his passion for music education across Allen, Cameron, and Calcasieu Parishes. His teaching experience includes positions at Kinder High School and Kinder Middle School in Allen Parish; South Cameron High School and South Cameron Elementary in Cameron Parish; and LaGrange High School, F.K. White Middle, S.J. Welsh Middle, J.I. Watson Middle, Reynaud Middle, and LeBlanc Middle in Calcasieu Parish.

He has also served as Middle School Vice President for the District V Band and Orchestra Directors Association. Now in his 14th year at LeBlanc Middle School, Mr. Young has led the band program's growth from approximately 30 students to well over 120. Under his direction, LeBlanc Middle bands have achieved consistent success at performance assessments, honor band events, and solo & ensemble competitions. Many of his students have continued their musical journeys into higher education and professional careers.

Outside the classroom, Mr. Young enjoys gardening, hunting, fishing, carpentry, raising honeybees, and traveling.

This Award is given in memory of Dr. Norman E. Smith. Dr. Smith was Professor Emeritus of Music at McNeese State University. Not only a teacher, but also a friend to all educators and musicians. A great deal of Dr. Smith's teaching career was spent as a band director.

Aleisa Hudlow, Conductor

Aleisa Hudlow is currently in her nineteenth year of teaching and in her eleventh year serving Natchitoches Parish Schools. She attended Northwestern State University where she earned her Bachelor of Music Education degree in 2007 and her Master of Music degree in 2019. Mrs. Hudlow taught in Bellville Independent School District in Bellville, TX from 2007-2009, Northshore High School in Slidell, LA from 2009-2013, Pineville High School in Pineville, LA from 2013-2015, and has served Natchitoches Parish Schools since 2015. These positions resulted in numerous Superior and Excellent ratings for marching and concert bands at both the district and state level.

Mrs. Hudlow first came to Natchitoches Parish as a Talented Music Instructor. She started the Marthaville Junior High School band program in 2016 and then transitioned to Director of Bands at Natchitoches Central High School in 2017. While at Natchitoches Central, she also started the band program at Natchitoches Magnet School in 2018. While at Natchitoches Central, Mrs. Hudlow increased the band size as well as Honor Band, Solo and Ensemble, and All-State participation, where her students were awarded many Superior ratings and also had their first All-State musician in over fifteen years. The "Pride of the Tribe" Marching Band returned to marching contests for the first time in many years and were able to bring home several awards in both marching competitions and parade performances. The concert band returned to LMEA Large Ensemble Assessment for the first time in over a decade and earned their first Superior rating in Sight Reading in 2019, their first Superior Rating in Concert in 2021, and their first Sweepstakes Awards in 2022 for both the Concert Band and Symphonic Band. Mrs. Hudlow has now transitioned back to middle school teaching and currently serves as the band director for Natchitoches Magnet School.

Since her arrival in Natchitoches Parish, Mrs. Hudlow has also worked closely with the district to revive band programs in the area, which has resulted in the number of Natchitoches Parish band programs to double and has greatly increased the amount of students with access to music programs. She has also worked closely with other music educators in the area to guide the district in how to improve music education for the parish, which led to new positions, new general music programs for elementary schools, and new instruments for all the music programs. She now proudly serves with other local educators on the Teacher Advisory Council for Natchitoches Parish Schools.

In 2020, Mrs. Hudlow was selected by her colleagues as the District II Band Director of the Year. She is a member of Sigma Alpha Iota, Kappa Kappa Psi, NAfME, LMEA, and Phi Beta Mu organizations. She currently serves as Past-President for the District 2 Band Directors Association, the Louisiana Music Educators Association District 2 Director, and the President of the Louisiana Music Adjudicators Association. She resides in Natchitoches with her husband Adam, two children Jack and Lily, and their dogs Indy and Vinny.

Quincy Hilliard, Conductor

Quincy C. Hilliard's compositions for wind band are published by a variety of well-known publishers. Most recently, he was selected to receive the 2023 Eminent Faculty, Distinguished Professor Award from his university – the University of Louisiana. In 2021, he was commissioned by Trinity College Press (London) to compose eight pieces for their new Woodwind Examination Syllabus. Currently, he has completed a book with two other distinguish music educators entitled Teaching Instrumental Music Across Settings: Contemporary Perspectives and Pedagogies which was released by Oxford University Press. In addition, he has just complete a rhythm book for training middle and high school students entitled Counts of Silence published by Wingert-Jones music publishers. In 2014, Hilliard received the prestigious Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Award in the Classical Music Division. He was also recognized with a second Global Music Award for his work as a composer. In 2012, one of his pieces, Coty (clarinet and piano) was recorded on a CD that was nominated for a Grammy Award. In 2008, he was commissioned by the Library of Congress to compose a work in celebration of the bicentennial of the birth of Abraham Lincoln. He is frequently commissioned to compose works, including one for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and a score for a documentary film, The Texas Rangers. For many years, the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP) has recognized him with annual awards for the unusually frequent performance of his compositions. Hilliard is regularly invited to conduct, demonstrate effective techniques, and adjudicate festivals throughout the world.

Because Hilliard, the composer, conductor, and educator, is also a scholar of Aaron Copland's music and life, Copland estate administrators authorized Hilliard to publish the educational performance edition, Copland for Solo Instruments (Boosey and Hawkes, 1999). He is also the co-author of Teaching Instrumental Music: Contemporary Perspectives and Pedagogies to aid in the teaching of music education students at the college level. To train school band students, he wrote Superior Bands in Sixteen Weeks (FJH Music Company, 2003), Chorales and Rhythmic Etudes for Superior Bands (FJH Music Company, 2004), Scales and Tuning Exercises for Superior Bands (FJH Music Company, 2009), Theory Concepts, Books One and Two. He is the co-author of the Skill Builders, Books One and Two (Sounds Spectacular Series, Carl Fischer, 1996). Hilliard is also the co-author of Percussion Time (C.L. Barnhouse Company) which is a collection of music written specifically for the beginning percussion ensemble. He has presented scholarly papers on music theory and analysis at meetings of the College Music Society and the Central Gulf Society of Music Theory (of which he is past president). He has published articles in Opera Journal, The Instrumentalist, School Musician, Bandworld, American Music Teacher, Florida Music Director, and Tennessee Musician.

Currently, Hilliard holds the position of Composer in Residence and is the Heymann Endowed Professor of Music at the University of Louisiana, Lafayette. Previous teaching positions were at Nicholls State University, Florida International University, North Marion High School (Sparr, Florida) and White Middle Station Junior and Senior High School (Memphis, Tennessee).

He holds the Ph.D. in Music Theory and Composition from the University of Florida where, in 1999, he was recognized as the Outstanding Alumnus of the School of Music. He holds the Masters of Music Education from Arkansas State University and the Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Mississippi State University where he was selected as the College of Education 1998 Alumnus of the Year. Hilliard's early music experience was as a trumpet player in the public elementary and high school of his native Starkville, Mississippi. Dr. Hilliard is also president of Hilliard Music Enterprises, Inc. a personal consulting firm, which has a corporate board of distinguished music educators.

Craig Millet, Conductor

Craig Millet was born in Alexandria, Louisiana in 1966. He graduated from Alexandria Sr. High School, where he was under the direction of Edmund Winston III. In 1989, Mr. Millet earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Instrumental Music Education from Louisiana Tech University. While at Louisiana Tech, he participated with the Saxophone Quartet, Marching Band, Jazz Band, Symphonic Band, and the Ruston Symphony Orchestra. While attending Louisiana Tech, he was under the direction of Raymond Young and Daniel Pittman. He has also studied privately with Dr. Edmund Winston II, Alan Keating, Dr. Larry Gwodz, and Sigurd Rascher. In 1990, he accepted the Assistant Director position under Carl Schexnayder at St. Amant High School. In 1999, Mr. Millet accepted the Director of Bands position and held that position until the spring of 2020.

All of the St. Amant Bands, including Marching Band, Jazz Band, Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Symphony, consistently receive superior ratings at District and State Festival. The Wind Symphony has never made less than Sweepstakes at the District Festival since the school opened its doors in 1978. Under Mr. Millet's direction, performing grade IV and V literature, the Wind Symphony has made straight Superiors and Sweepstakes at every LMEA State Festival since he became director of bands in 1999. In 2001, Mr. Millet received the Band Master of the Year Award for excellence in the field of music education from Louisiana Tech University. In 2022 Mr. Millet was named Alumni of the year for Louisiana Tech's Music Department and was also inducted into the LMEA Hall of Fame. The St Amant Bands have performed at Carnegie Hall, Disney World, Six Flags, and the GNAI. They have also traveled to Italy, Ireland, and Scotland.

Mr. Millet's professional affiliations include Phi Mu Alpha, Phi Beta Mu, MENC, LMEA, TBA, LMAA, and NBA. He has also a Past President of the District IV Band Directors Association. He served on the LMEA Board as Band Division Chairman for 2 terms and was instrumental in implementing the State Solo Festival as well as the newly formed Class D classification for struggling large ensembles. He is a charter member and founding member of LMAA (Louisiana Music Adjudicators Association) In May 2023 Mr Millet (after 33 years at St Amant High) happily retired from St Amant high and currently stays busy consulting, adjudicating, and recording school bands across the state. Craig and Julie Millet have been happily married for 35 years and live in Prairieville, Louisiana. They have two children, Lindsey and Matthew.

Dr. Cliff Croomes, Conductor

Cliff Croomes serves as the Associate Director of Bands and Director of the Longhorn Band at the University of Texas at Austin. Prior to his return to Austin, he was the Assistant Director of Bands at Louisiana State University and the Music Director and Principal Conductor of the Civic Orchestra of Baton Rouge. Previous to his appointment the faculty he studied at LSU for his Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees. Prior to his time at LSU Dr. Croomes served as the Director of Bands at Georgetown High School in Georgetown, Texas. He has also had the pleasure of serving on the faculty of the University of Texas Longhorn Music Camp from 2001-2014.

Dr. Croomes earned his Bachelor of Music Studies degree from the University of Texas at Austin and is an alumnus of the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps from Rosemont, Illinois. He has performed with ensembles throughout the United States and Europe as well as serving as an international consultant in Japan. He has served as an adjudicator and clinician for marching and concert bands throughout the United States.

Dr. Croomes holds an artist/educator endorsement with Innovative Percussion Inc. and is a founding board member of the composer diversity initiative "And We Were Heard" as well as a member of the Dr. William P. Foster Project advisory board. Dr. Croomes is currently the President of the Minority Band Directors Association. He also holds professional memberships in the Texas Bandmasters Association, Texas Music Adjudicators Association, the Percussive Arts Society, Louisiana Music Educators Association, Florida Music Educators Association, the Texas Music Educators Association, and Phi Beta Mu, the international bandmasters fraternity.
