

AKC Delegate Report

The Annual meeting of the AKC was held March 11-12, 2024 in Newark, NJ. Delegates elected Directors for the Class of 2028 with the candidates put forward by the Nominating Committee all being elected on the first ballot. Congratulations go to:

Dr. Carmen L. Battaglia, PhD, German Shepherd Dog Club of America

Sally Fineburg, Hatboro Dog Club

Dr. Michael Knight, PhD, Texas Kennel Club

In addition, Dr. Thomas M. Davies (Springfield Kennel Club) was reelected as the Chairman of the Board and Dominic Palleschi Carota (Pharaoh Hound Club of America) was reelected as Vice Chairman of the Board at a meeting of the AKC Board of Directors, convened after the Delegates Meeting.

In other business, an amendment to *Rules Applying to Dog Shows* was passed which deletes the requirements to publish complete addresses for judges, owners, and exhibitors in show catalogs. The new requirements will list only city and state for each, to address growing privacy and identity concerns.

The Dog Obedience Club of Hollywood was voted in as the newest Member club of the AKC.

Once again the subject of term limits for the AKC Board of Directors was raised. This subject has been hotly debated and attempts to remove term limits have been narrowly defeated a few times in recent years. A proposal was read which will be voted on at the June Delegates Meeting which would eliminate the current term limits.

Ron Furman and Bill Ellis gave a presentation on the AKC's activities in television and



streaming video services. Significant growth statistics were offered for AKC.TV but particular note was made of expanding presence on network TV platforms. The AKC relationship with ESPN continues to grow and connections are now being forged with the NFL. Both of these highly popular platforms greatly expand the reach of AKC messaging and presence.

I had reported last fall of meeting the Archivist for the AKC and of her invitation to meet at the library in NYC to discuss archival services available to the PRTAA. Unfortunately, I learned that she has since left the AKC and a new Archivist, Kim Ross has just come on board. After giving Ms. Ross a little time to settle in, I hope to restart that discussion.

And one final note, the AKC has launched a new venture to enter the pet medicine market with AKC Rx. It was soft launched in December 2023 and marketing began in February 2024. It is touted to be very easy to use and to offer significant savings. I have not tried it yet but members can find it at AKCPetRx.com.

The next meeting of AKC Delegates will be held on June 10-11, 2024 in Newark. As always I welcome input from members and the board.

The members of the PRTAA have been gracious with their compliments of The Parson's Nook for many years. Some have gone so far as to suggest the Nook is of a caliber worthy of recognition among other like publications. The Dog Writers Association of America hosts an annual contest to honor dog related works in a number of different categories. Here a shout out is due to **Dawn Antoniak Mitchell** who nudged the Media Committee to enter The Parson's Nook in the 2023 contest.

Contest rules dictate that the entry must have been published within the preceding 12 months. This left the committee to choose which of the previous four issues we would enter. The Summer 2023 issue featuring "Parsons & Their Kids" was ultimately selected for submission. The committee felt it was a well balanced example and member contributions and response to it had been very favorable.


The Nook was entered in the category, Club Publications in Newsletter Format, which is open to any dog related club. The entry was



also submitted for consideration in the special category, AKC Club Publication Excellence Award.

After several months of waiting we were thrilled to learn that the Nook was chosen as a Finalist in both of the categories in which entered. DWAA Announces Writing Competition Winners

The Dog Writers of Association of America (DWAA) recently announced the winners of its 2023 Writing Competition. DWAA, founded in 1935, is the nation's oldest professional organization dedicated to those involved in promoting the interest of dogs. The competition is open to all writers, photographers, editors and publishers - with no distinction between amateurs and professionals. "We are thrilled to be able to provide recognition for the hundreds of journalists, photographers and communicators who cover the science, health, sport and enjoyment of our 'best friends'," said Therese Backowski, DWAA president.

This year's competitors submitted close to 500 entries in 47 regular and 17 sponsored categories from every state in the US, Canada, Hong Kong and New Zealand. Each entry was reviewed by three judges. "This year's competition was rewarding," said Contest Chair Dr. Merrie Meyers. "I got to work with hundreds of members and non-members involved in the profession. Plus, as a judge, I learned a lot about the interaction between dogs and their people I didn't know before."

The State of Our Sport

Parent Club Registration Statistics





Statistics on breeding, registration and event participation are updated biannually by the AKC and sent to each Parent Club. The PRTAA receives detailed numbers for Parsons, a summary for the Terrier Group, and the totals for all AKC breeds. Each club is encouraged to share this information with its membership to stimulate discussion about registration and possible changes or improvement initiatives.

Important Notes:

The attached includes the counts of litters, litter complement, and dogs registered for each year since 2011. The reports also include the counts of unique dogs and bitches that were bred or that participated in a sport. Those counts are finite and will change only minimally over time and generally only due to cancellations of litters, dogs and/or awards. However, the reports also contain numbers that are "To Date" which will often change each time we produce these statistics (see definition below).

Complement: This is the count of pups from each AKC litter.

To Date: TThere are a number of rows that indicate "to date," such as "Total Complement in Conformation (to date)." All rows with "to date" information are refreshed every time we reprocess this report. This is so you will have an accurate picture of the puppies produced in any given year. For instance, of the 1,211,576 puppies produced in AKC Litters in 2011 (a.k.a., the Litter Complement for 2011), 43,010 or 3.5% have thus far gone on to

participate in conformation as of March 2024. Every time we update this chart, the system looks at all litters from 2011 to see if any additional dogs have started in conformation. Obviously, there will not be many 2011 pups entering Conformation or Breeding for the first time in 2023, but there will be many updates to the information known about pups born in more recent years.

Unique: "Unique" indicates the number of individual dogs participating in an activity such as breeding or exhibiting, counting each unique dog only once. For example, the same dog might have participated multiple times in a sport during a single year, but is only counted as one unique dog for that entire year.

"Competing In" vs "Placing In": While we are able to accurately count unique dogs participating (i.e., entering) in Conformation and Companion events, we do not have complete entry data for all Performance events for the time period. Therefore, you will notice that for Performance Events we provide counts of uniques placing in performance.


Parent Club Membership: Data relating to breeder and litter counts has been added. This data, from 2016 through 2023, gives a general picture of the breeding activity of Parent Club members relative to the overall breeding activity within the breed.

Rankings: Also now included are breed rankings by dog and litter registrations form among the AKC recognized breds..




Breed Registration Statistics

Parson Russell Terriers




Chart 1: Number of Litters per Year

Local Terrier Saved in Dramatic Rescue at Limestone Quarry

don't even know where to begin! Long post to a crazy story with a very happy ending!! Yesterday around 6:00 p.m. I received a voicemail from a gentleman who was walking down Lower Road past the quarry. He stated that he heard a dog barking when he walked by. I went down there as soon as I could with my sister Ashley Burr and contacted John and Bobby Foley who work and run the quarry.

I was driven down into the quarry to see if we could get eyes on the dog and hear it again. We heard barking but we could not see a dog. A little while later I contacted Brian Ohler who without question came out and flew his drone. No heat signatures from a dog were detected (this drone would have seen it).

We found out by a post on Facebook (by friends of the owner) that a dog went missing close to Lower Road on Saturday May 4th. With no luck we went home.

This morning I received a phone call from the dog's owner who gave me more information on her dog. He was a 30 lb Terrier mix who was a sandy white color. I let her know about the call last night regarding a barking dog in the quarry and that if it was in fact her dog that he was still alive last night. At noon the guys at the quarry went on lunch break and Bobby Foley heard him barking like crazy again in the same spot that we thought he was last night. He called me right away and I collected some items that I needed and headed right down.



The Safety Manager of Specialty Minerals and the Plant Manager came out to assess the situation. They stated that they would not be able to get to the dog and that I would need to call the Northwest Rope Rescue Teams. I called dispatch and they were called out to the quarry. They came as soon as they could along with North Canaan Fire Company and North Canaan Ambulance. The Rope Rescue Team had 2 members who rappelled roughly

50 ft down to the dog Rippy who fell down the cliff and was stuck. He could have been stuck there since Saturday night but no one will know for sure. Rippy was caught and safely brought back up the cliff. I called his owner right away who came and picked him up so he could go home to decompress, get cleaned up and then checked out.

I want to thank everyone who was involved in this crazy rescue. Rippy's mom thanks everyone as well!! He is one very lucky dog to



have survived a fall off one of those cliffs!! Other animals have not been that lucky! He would not have made it home safe without all of you!!


