A report from Eric Dekruif


n May, I joined a group of three others from my local church, Southwest Community Church, on a trip to Kenya. This was my third time visiting Kenya in the last three and a half years! We were blown away to see God's hand and faithfulness in the timing and details of the trip, as we worked to accomplish the objectives that God laid on hearts for our time in Kenya. After stopping in Nairobi for a day and visiting HEART ministries, we headed to Kisii. One of the highlights from this part of the trip was seeing Pastor Joash, who originally got us connected with the church in Kenya. It was encouraging to see his spiritual growth and renewed vision for his local church. He has planted multiple churches since 2022 and now continues in our leadership training program. While in



Kisii, we also visited the new church facility of Pastor Wilson Atambo. We were able to spend a couple days with his church family, worshiping together. I had the opportunity to preach during their Sunday gathering and help commission their new building. From Kisii, we travelled to Kakamega where we spent some time with some new ministry partners including Rush Kenya and Pastor Ronnie and his church, Presence Celebration Chapel in Matete, teaching and dialoguing using The First Principles Resources. From Kakamega, we travelled to Eldoret, staying with Phylis and her husband Kevin and visiting their local church. Our last weekend was spent with Pastor Josphat Idaya in his church in Kitale, where we led a leadership conference and each person on the trip had a chance to preach on Sunday in different local churches throughout the area. Our final stop before returning to Colorado, which was also one of the highlights of the trip, was visiting Mully Children's Family, about two hours outside of Nairobi. Over 35 years ago, Mully started taking orphaned street children into his home and has since rescued over 30,000 children! The visit was very encouraging and inspiring and a true testimony of what God can do through a single family who takes up the Lord's call. Overall, the trip was a great experience for everyone who went, and we all look forward to returning soon. PHYLIS AMUKOWA




