The Leadership Mastery II training certification is granted for demonstration of the competencies of establishing believers in their faith, building strong families and godly households according to biblical standards and sound doctrine, and developing the skills of handling the word with confidence with a vision for the Church and the unfolding of the great commission.

The leadership training is designed for the following:

- Type II Ministry Leaders Elders; deacons; men's/women's/youth/family ministry workers, etc
- Individuals who have completed the competencies associated with Leadership Mastery I and desire to continue their growth
- Individuals interested in pursuing higher Leadership Mastery certifications as well as the accredited Certificate, Bachelors, Masters, and Doctorate degrees in Ministry or Theology

General objectives of this program as well as ensuing ministry certifications and degrees:

- Comprehensive development in character, skills, and knowledge for effective ministry.
- Life development and lifelong learning orientation.
- Recognition of and participation in the centrality of the local church in the plan of God.
- Ability to master biblical content, benefit from significant contributions of scholars, and build strategic models of ministry accordingly.
- Develop a foundational understanding through an integrated core of interdisciplinary studies.

The general objective of all Ministry Degrees and programs is to help train those who desire to be part of a leadership and ministry team that is one-minded in ministry, vision, and philosophy. Out of this team would come those who commit themselves long term to local church leadership or those who desire to train to be part of a missionary team involved in planting or establishing churches in other areas.

Specific program objectives of the Leadership Mastery II Program:

- Establish and strengthen believers in their faith with the ability to teach and disciple others as well
- Orient individuals and families in an understanding of the household texts in Scripture
- Prepare individuals for future roles in ministry and church planting instilling confidence in their ability to handle the word
- Provide experience through teaching and application in real life and ministry situations
- Developing leaders through whole life mentoring
- Prepare individuals for further educational opportunities toward accredited bachelors, masters, and doctorate degrees through the development of lifelong learning habit.

Whole Life Mentoring and Discipleship

Through Life and Ministry Development, you will work with other leaders and mentors to grow in every area of your life and develop an individually tailored life and ministry plan for each of your life dimensions. Credit will be given as you interact with the material and your mentor monthly.

08 Church and Ministry - As a fellow worker with Christ, living out the functions of His church according to sound doctrine, building up one another in love and doing good to all people, especially those who are the household of the faith.

09 Bible and Prayer - Devoting yourselves to prayer, praying at all times without ceasing, growing in the handling of the word with confidence.

10 *Personal and Leadership Development* - Seeking knowledge, discernment, wisdom, and understanding and growing in favor with God and men.

Ministry Practicums (must complete at least two)

Credit for learning that took place through guided ministry experience, particularly related to Implementation and impact of lessons learned elsewhere in the programs (Credit is granted at a rate of 1 semester hour of credit for each 45 hours of approved ministry practicum.) Credit given for Ministry Practicum report that includes experience, reflections, concepts, and implementation. Individuals will choose from two of the following or work with their mentors to determine a tailored practicum specific to work in their existing ministry.

- □ **Missions** Cultivate a world vision, experiencing cross-culture ministry and training of national church leaders, and becoming well informed about the church and culture in a country outside the US
- **Biblical Counseling** Developing the skills necessary to become a more skilled biblical counselor for individuals who are struggling with life-controlling problems such as anger, fear, depression and foolishness, for pre-engaged and engaged couples seeking premarital counseling, and for married couples seeking to reconcile or strengthen their marriage.
- **Evangelism** Growing you to become a more skilled personal evangelist, able to skillfully equip other personal evangelists, and becoming more skilled in establishing new Christians in the faith
- **Preaching, Teaching, and Worship** Developing a basic understanding of preaching, teaching, and worship in the early church, their application in a modern church, and integrating them into a weekly Lord's Supper gathering.

Teaching Practicums

Credit for learning that takes place through use of the BILD resources to teach others, particularly related to the lessons learned related to the content of the BILD resources and the skills of teaching effectively.

- The Exchanged Life conference workbook Credit for learning that takes place through interacting with the Exchanged Life conference workbook and teaching the material to others on multiple occasions. Conference material should be presents on at least two separate occasions to different audiences.
- **The First Principles Series 1** Credit for learning that takes place through interacting with The First Principles Leader's Guide as well as teaching The First Principles Series I to others, particularly related to new lessons learned related to the content of The First Principles Series 1 and effective teaching skills.
- **The First Principles Series 2** Credit for learning that takes place through interacting with The First Principles Leader's Guide as well as teaching The First Principles Series 2 to others, particularly related to new lessons learned related to the content of The First Principles Series 2 and effective teaching skills.

Ministry Philosophy and Strategy

Demonstrations of integration of ministry philosophy and strategy related to one's ministry context (or anticipated context) and integration of competencies associated with First Principles Series I-III and The Story, particularly the work associated with the Apply the Principles sections and the final chapters on Reshaping our *Lives*, as well as your work developed for your individual Life and Ministry Plan.

- Initial Ministry Philosophy - Reflected on your ministry philosophy. Described the fundamental aspects of the faith, especially related to the role of expanding and establishing the church, while also describing the purposes for establishing churches.
- **Initial Ministry Strategy** Reflected on your ministry strategies. Described your habits and strategy to fully participate in the ministry. Especially describe your one-year and then five-year plans, focusing on what it would take to accomplish your ministry philosophy.
