



**Any retired law enforcement officer desiring to carry a concealed firearm pursuant the Retired Law Enforcement Officer's Safety Act of 2004 (HR-218) must achieve a minimum score of 80% (thirty-two rounds) on the following 40 round course of fire. This standard must be met every 12 months to remain valid under the provisions of this law. Only a Florida Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission firearms instructor may administer this course of fire.**

A passing score is a minimum score of 80%, which are 32 of 40 rounds in the scoring area. A scored hit is any hit that is inside or touches the exterior scoring line of the 4 and 5 zone of the B-21E law enforcement silhouette target. The course of fire must begin at Stage 1 and follow the order sequence through Stage 6. The target used is pictured below.
