

Hi my name is Melisha & I just recently moved out of Rebekah's Haven. I ended up in a shelter because I was homeless, living in a garage. I was not alone either, I had just recently had a baby girl on February 2, 2019.

My story started in 2012 when I went to prison on a 4 ½ year sentence for drug related offenses. The relationship I was in at the time was centered around my using drugs. Drug use had become the only life I knew. During this time, I was pregnant & just had a baby boy. Two weeks before I was due the father of my son



was arrested. He was sentenced 10 years for the crime he had committed. At this point, I had no idea how I was going to live or take care of myself, let alone my child. For the 5 years up until then I was taken care of & worried about nothing. I was very broken & had no idea how I was going to survive. So, I did what I knew how to do best, selling & using. My house was broken into & robbed. I was smothered with a pillow & had a gun put to my head. I was trying to provide for my newborn, but a few months later my door got kicked in by the local police department.

I was a 23 year old mother waiting to serve a 4 ½ year sentence. I was sent to ORW, the women's prison in Marysville, Ohio. When I arrived there, I thought that my life was completely over with. I had no idea how I was going to do my time while not being the mother that I should have been for my son. Watching him grow into a little boy while I was away was the hardest part of my time - knowing all that I was missing & not being able to be there for him. After doing my first 6 months, I told myself that I was not going to let this place defeat me. I was going to get all the good that I could out of this place so that I could be the person that I was created to be.

That is exactly what I did. Coming out of prison, I can honestly say that I was a totally new person. The world was definitely a new place to me. Learning how to live on the outside in the real world was hard to adapt to. I was doing great the first 6 months. I had a job & my own

apartment. How far I had come brought me such happiness, because it was my hard work & dedication that had gotten me there. Soon after though, I met the wrong people & fell on my face. Three weeks before I got an eviction notice, I found out that I was pregnant again.

Again, I found myself with nowhere to go. A friend shared with me about a program called Chrysalis, at Harbor Behavioral Health. This facility is designed for pregnant & postpartum women who had or have a drug problem. I completed an inpatient program for drug & alcohol treatment. I got clean & had my little baby girl while I was there. I stayed 6 months & 1 day. That's when they came to

me & told me that I had until the next morning to find somewhere to go because my insurance was not going to cover anymore. At this point I was clean for only 6 months with a newborn! It was on a Friday night, it was snowing & we had no place to go, & the facility had no recommendations where I should go with my newborn.

Fortunately, my fiancés' parents let me stay in their garage. I was able to go in to take showers & eat. This was very kind of them, but it was not an ideal situation with me being pretty new in recovery & with a newborn baby. So, I called 211 & they gave me information about Rebekah's Haven. It wasn't long after I called that I decided Rebekah's Haven is where I needed to be. Being able to have a roof over my small family's head was more than I could ask for. This situation has opened my eyes to how strong I truly am & I wouldn't change it for anything. While staying at Rebekah's Haven, I built a relationship with God, as well as strong & healthy relationships with the other guests & the staff. Being at Rebekah's Haven, honestly, saved our lives & I would like to thank all of you that had part in making it possible. I was able to get permanent housing for myself & my family. I'm now 8 months clean & my baby girl is 3 months old. My kids are the reason, season, and motivation to improve my life. I realize that my current situation is not my final destination. Also, that God did not put anything in my path that we could not handle together!
