AUDIT SCOPE:

Review of a conventional watermelon open and dry packinghouse operation which operates from about late-May to mid-June. The facility size is about 5,000 square feet with no cooler and the water source for cleaning is a well. During the audit product was received by bus from the Langford-Reed Melon Farm, was transferred by hand from the bus and was placed onto a conveyor. Product moved over a dry brusher unit and down the conveyor, was manually sorted, culls were removed, product was graded and a sticker was affixed to each watermelon. Product continued by conveyor where it was again inspected visually and physically to remove culls. Product continued on the conveyor where it was manually sized and placed carefully by hand into a multi-layer palletized corrugated bin which meets customer specifications. Each bin was labeled with a bin tag and product was stored temporarily at ambient temperature in the packinghouse awaiting ambient loading onto a truck for delivery to customers. Observed during the audit was the packing of 36-, 45- and 60-count seedless melons and 28- and 35-count seeded melons. Eighteen male workers were present during the audit.
