- 1.AALIYAH (עליָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Aliya, meaning "to ascend, to go up."
- 2.**ABICHAIL** (אֲבִיחַיִל): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abiyhayil, meaning "father of might."
- 3.ABIGAYIL (אָבִיגּיִל): Hebrew name meaning "father rejoices." In the bible, this is the name of the wife of King David. Also spelled Avigavil.
- 4.**ABIHAYIL** (אֲבִיחֵיִל): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abiyhayil, meaning "father of might."
- 5.ABIY (אֶבִי): Hebrew name meaning "my father." In the bible, this is the name of the mother of King Hezekiah. Also spelled Avi.
- 6.ABIYAH (אֶבּיֶּה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "Yahweh is my father." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Samuel, the mother of Hezekiah, a member of the tribe of Benjamin, a king of Judah, and several other characters. Also spelled Aviyah.
- 7.ABIYHAYIL (אֲבִיחֵיִל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "father of might." In the bible, this is the name of the wife of Rehoboam, the father of Esther, a Levite who was the head of the house of Merari, and several other characters. Abihail is the Anglicized form. Also spelled Avichavil.
- 9.ABIYTAL (אֲבִיטֵל): Hebrew name meaning "my father is dew." In the bible, this is the name of one of David's wives.

- 10. **ABRA**: Short form of Hebrew Abrahamit, meaning "father of a multitude." This name was popular in 17th century England. Also spelled Avra.
- 11. ABRAHAMIT (אַבְרָהָמִ ית): Feminine form of Hebrew Abraham, meaning "father of a multitude." Also spelled Avrahamit.
- 12. ACENATH (אָסְנֵת): Hebrew name of Egyptian origin, meaning "belonging to the goddess Neith." In the bible, this is the name of Joseph's Egyptian wife.
- 13. ADA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Adah, meaning "ornament." Compare with other forms of Ada.
- 14. ADAH (עָדָה): Hebrew name meaning "ornament." In the bible, this is the name of Lamech's wife and also Esau's wife.
- 15. ADARA: Hebrew name meaning "noble." Compare with another form of Adara.
- 16. ADDIE: Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Adi, meaning "my ornament" or "my witness." Compare with another form of Addie.
- 17. ADI (יְבֵּיִי): Hebrew unisex name meaning "my ornament" or "my witness."
- 18. ADIRA (אַדִּירָה): Hebrew name meaning "noble; powerful."
- 19. ADIVA (אָדֵיבָה): Hebrew name meaning "gentle, gracious, pleasant."
- 20. **ADIYNA** (עֵר ינָא): Hebrew unisex name meaning "slender." In the bible, this is a masculine name only, the name of one of King David's captains.
- 21. AFFRA: Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Afra, meaning "ashes, dust" and "clay, loam."
- 22. **AFRA** (רפּע): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Aphra, meaning "ashes, dust" and "clay, loam." Compare with another form of Afra.

- 23. AHAVA (אַהְבָה): Hebrew name meaning "water" or "I shall subsist." In the bible, this is the name of an area in Babylonia where Ezra gathered the exiles.
- 24. AHUVA (אֲהוּבָה): Hebrew name meaning "beloved."
- 25. ALEEZA (על יזַה): Hebrew name meaning "joy."
- 26. **ALISA** (עֲלֵיסָה): Hebrew name meaning "joy." Also spelled Aleeza. Compare with other forms of Alisa.
- עַל ִיצָה): Hebrew name meaning "joy."
- 28. ALIYA (עליָה): Hebrew name meaning "to ascend, to go up." Compare with another form of Aliya.
- 29. **ALIYAH** (עליָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Aliya, meaning "to ascend, to go up." Compare with another form of Aliyah.
- 30. **ALIZA** (על יזָה): Variant spelling of both Hebrew Aleeza and Alitza, meaning "joy."
- 31. ALIZAH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Aliza, meaning "joy."
- 32. ALMA (עַלְמֵה): Hebrew name meaning "maiden." Compare with another form of Alma.
- 33. **ALMAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Alma, meaning "maiden." Compare with another form of Almah.
- 34. ALONA (האַלוּג): Feminine form of Hebrew Alon, meaning "oak tree."
- 35. ALYA (אַלְיָה): Aramaic and Hebrew name meaning "dirge, elegy" or "sheep's tail." In astronomy, this is the traditional name for Theta Serpentis, a star in the constellation Serpens.
- 36. AMALYA (עֲמֵלְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "industrious" or "work of Yahweh."
- 37. AMINA (אַמִּינָה): Hebrew name meaning "faithful, trusted." Compare with another form of Amina.
- 38. AMINE: Variant spelling of Hebrew Amina, meaning "faithful, trusted."

- 39. **AMINTA** (אַמִּ יְתָּה): Hebrew name meaning "truth, friendship." Compare with another form of Aminta.
- 40. AMINTAH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Aminta, meaning "defender."
- 41. AMIRA (אָמִירָה): Hebrew name meaning "speech, utterance." Compare with another form of Amira.
- 42. **AMIT** (עַמִּ יִת): Hebrew unisex name meaning "friend."
- 43. AMITA (אַמְתָּה): Hebrew name meaning "honest, upright." Compare with another form of Amita.
- 44. ANAT (ענת): Unisex form of Hebrew Anath, meaning "answer (to prayer)." Compare with another form of Anat.
- 45. **APHRA** (רפּע ): Hebrew unisex name derived from the word *aphra*, meaning "ashes, dust" and "clay, loam." In the bible, this is part of the name of a Philistine city, Bethelaphrah.
- **46. APHRODIT** (אַפְרוֹדָ ית): Hebrew form of Greek Aphrodite, meaning "risen from the foam."
- 47. **ARI'EL** (אָר יאֵל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "lion of god." In the bible, this is a name applied to the city of Jerusalem, and the name of a chief of the returning exiles. In the Apocrypha, this is the name of an archangel who rules the waters. It is also the name of a moon of Uranus, and the name of a spirit in Shakespeare's play "The Tempest."
- 48. **ASHERAH** (אֲשׁרָה): Hebrew name meaning "groves (for idol worship)" or "blessed, fortunate." In the bible, this is the Hebrew name for the Babylonian-Canaanite goddess Astarte. It is also the name for her images and sacred trees or poles used for worshiping her.
- 49. **ASHERDU**: Hittite form of Hebrew Asherah, perhaps having the same meaning "groves (for idol worship)" or "blessed, fortunate."
- (עַשׁאָתְּ רוֹת): Hebrew name, meaning "star." In the bible, this is the name applied to false goddesses in the Canaanite religion, usually related to a

- fertility cult. It is also the name of a city in Bashan east of the Jordan given to Manasseh.
- 51. **ASHTORETH** (עַשׁאָתֹּרֶת): Hebrew name meaning "star." In the bible, this is the name of the principal female deity of the Semitic nations, worshiped in war and fertility. Equated with Assyrian Ishtar and Greek Astarte.
- 52. ATARA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Atarah, meaning" crown" or "wreath."
- 53. **ATARAH** (אֲטֵרָה): Hebrew name meaning "crown" or "wreath." In the bible, this is the name of the wife of Jerahmeel.
- 54. **AVAGAIL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Avigayil, meaning "father rejoices."
- 55. **AVI** (אֲבֵי): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiy, meaning "my father." Compare with masculine Avi.
- 56. **AVICHAYIL** (אָבִיחַיִּל): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abihayil, meaning "father of might."
- 57. **AVIGAIL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Avigavil, meaning "father rejoices."
- 58. **AVIGAL** (אָבִיגַל): Unisex form of Hebrew Avigayil, meaning "father rejoices."
- 59. **AVIGAYIL** (אָבִיגִּיל): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abigayil, meaning "father rejoices." In the bible, this is the name of the wife of King David.
- (אֶבִישֵׁג): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiyshag, meaning "my father is a wanderer" or "father of error." In the bible, this is the name of a young girl who cared for David in his old age.
- 61. AVIVA (אֲבֵיבָה): Feminine form of Hebrew Aviv, meaning "springtime."
- 62. **AVIYAH** (אֲבַיָּה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abiyah, meaning "Yahweh is my father."
- 63. AVRA: Short form of Hebrew Avrahamit, meaning "father of a multitude." Also spelled Abra.

- 64. **AVRAHAMIT** (אַבְרָהְמִית): Feminine form of Hebrew Avraham, meaning "father of a multitude." Also spelled Abrahamit.
- אָיָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Ayah, meaning "falcon" or "vulture." Compare with another form of Aya.
- 66. **AYAH** (אֵיָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "falcon" or "vulture." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Rizpah, and a Horite, the son of Zibeon.
- 67. AYALA (אֵלֶה): Feminine form of Hebrew Ayal, meaning "deer; gazelle."
- 68. AYALAH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Ayala, meaning "deer; gazelle."
- 69. **AYELET** (אֵיֶלֶת): Hebrew name derived from a name for the morning star, meaning "deer; gazelle."
- 70. AYLA (אֵלָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Eila, meaning "oak tree, terebinth tree." Compare with another form of Ayla.
- 71. AZENETH (אָסְ נַת): Variant form of Hebrew Acĕnath, meaning "belonging to the goddess Neith."
- 72. **AZUVAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Azuwbah, meaning "forsaken."
- 73. **AZUWBAH** (עְזוּבָה): Hebrew name meaning "heaps of ruins," i.e. "forsaken." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including Caleb's wife and the mother of Jehoshaphat. Also spelled Azuvah.
- 74. BARA (בַּכָּה): Hebrew name meaning "to choose."
- 75. BARRA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bara, meaning "to choose." Compare with masculine Barra.
- 76. BASIA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Basya, meaning "daughter of God."
- 77. BASMA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bosma, meaning perfumed."

- 78. BASMAT: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bosmat, meaning "spice" or "sweet smelling."
- 79. **BASYA**: Ashkenazic form of Hebrew Batya, meaning "daughter of God."
- 80. **BAT-EL** (אֵל-בַּת): Hebrew name meaning "daughter of God."
- 81. **BATH-SHEBA** (שֶׁבֵע-בַּת): Hebrew name meaning "daughter of the oath." In the bible, this is the name of a wife of Uriah then later King David, and mother of Solomon. Also spelled Bat-Sheva, Bathsheba, and Bathsheva.
- 82. **BATHSHEBA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bath-Sheba, meaning "daughter of the oath." In the bible, this is the name of a wife of King David and mother of Solomon.
- 83. **BATHSHEVA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bath-Sheba, meaning "daughter of the oath."
- 84. **BATH-SHUA** (בַּתשׁשׁעַ): Variant spelling of Hebrew Bath-Shuwa, meaning "daughter of wealth."
- 85. **BATH-SHUWA** (בַּתשׁשׁע): Hebrew name meaning "daughter of wealth." In the bible, this is another name Bath-Sheba is known by.
- 86. BATSHEBA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bathsheba, meaning "daughter of the oath."
- 87. **BAT-SHEVA** (שֶׁבַע-בַּת): Variant spelling of Hebrew Bath-Sheba, meaning "daughter of the oath."
- 88. **BATYA** (בַּתְ יָה): Hebrew name meaning "daughter of God."
- 89. **BATYAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Batya, meaning "daughter of God."
- 90. **BERURA** (בְּרוּכָה): Hebrew name meaning "clean, pure."
- 91. **BETH-EL** (לאֵ -בֵּית): Variant spelling of Hebrew Beyth-El, meaning "house of God." In the bible, this is the name of an ancient city of the Canaanites, later of the Benjamites.
- 92. **BEULA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Beulah, meaning "she who is married."

- 93. **BEULAH** (בְּעוּלָה): A derivative of Hebrew Ba'al ("to marry; to be lord, master, possessor"), meaning "she who is married." In the bible, this is an allegorical name for the land of Israel.
- 94. **BEYTH-EL** (אֵל-בֵּית): Hebrew name meaning "house of God." In the bible, this is the name of an ancient city of the Canaanites, later of the Benjamites.
- 95. **BILHAH** (בַּלְהָה): Hebrew name meaning "weak, troubled, old." In the bible, this is the name of Rachel's handmaid whom she gave to Jacob as a concubine.
- 96. **BINA** (בּינָה): Hebrew name meaning "intelligence, wisdom."
- 97. **BINAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bina, meaning "intelligence, wisdom."
- 98. **BITHYAH** (בּתְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "daughter of God." In the bible, this is the name of a daughter of Pharoah.
- 99. **BITYA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bityah, meaning "daughter of God."
- 100. **BITYAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Bithyah, meaning "daughter of God."
- 101. BOSMA (בַּשְׁמָה): Hebrew name meaning "perfumed."

- 147. **DEGANA** (דְּגְנָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Deganya, meaning "grain."
- 148. **DEGANIA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Deganya, meaning "grain."

- 161. DOR (דוֹר): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Dowr, meaning "generation" or "period of time." In the bible, this is the name of a coastal city in Manasseh, south of Carmel.

- 163. **DOWR** (דוֹר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "generation" or "period of time." In the bible, this is the name of a coastal city in Manasseh, south of Carmel.
- 164. **DVORAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Devorah, meaning "bee."
- 165. ECTER (אָסְתֵּר): Hebrew form of Persian Esther, meaning "star."
- 166. **EDEN** (אָדֶן): Hebrew unisex name meaning "delight" or "place of pleasure." In the bible, this is the name of the garden in which Adam and Eve lived.
- 167. **EDER** (עֶדֶּר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "herd, flock." In the bible, this is the name of a Levite who lived in the time of David, and the name of a town in the south of Judah. Compare with another form of Eder.
- 168. EDNA (שֶּרְנָה): Hebrew name meaning "delight, pleasure, rejuvenation." In the apocryphal Book of Tobit, this is the name of the mother of Sarah. Compare with another form of Edna.
- 169. **EDNAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Edna, meaning "delight, pleasure, rejuvenation."

- 170. **EFA** (עֵיפָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex **Efah**, meaning "darkness" or "gloomy." Compare with another form of **Efa**.
- 171. **EFAH** (עֵיפָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Eyphah, meaning "darkness" or "gloomy."
- 172. **EIFA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex **Efah**, meaning "darkness" or "gloomy."
- 173. EILA (אֵלָה): Hebrew name meaning "oak tree, terebinth tree."
- 174. ELA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Eila, meaning "oak tree, terebinth tree." Compare with another form of Ela.
- 175. **ELIANA** (אֶלִיעַנָה): Hebrew name meaning "my God has answered." Compare with another form of Eliana.

- 181. **ELIYSHEBA** (אֱלִישֶׁבַע): Hebrew name meaning "God is my oath." In the Old Testament bible, this is the name of the wife of Aaron.
- 182. **ELKE**: Feminine form of Hebrew Elkanah, meaning either "God bought" or "God is jealous." Compare with another form of Elke.
- 183. **EMET** (אֶמֶת): Hebrew name meaning "truth." The masculine form is spelled **Emmet**.

- 184. ETNA (אֶתְ נָה): Hebrew name meaning "hire" or "for hire." Compare with another form of Etna.
- 185. **EYPHAH** (עיפה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "darkness" or "gloomy." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Midian and one of Caleb's concubines. Also spelled Efah. The Anglicized form is Ephah.
- 186. GAL (גַל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "mound, wave."
- 187. GALA (גּלָה): Feminine variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Gal, meaning "mound, wave." Compare with another form of Gala.
- 188. GALIA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Galya, meaning "hill of God."
- 189. **GALILA** (גֵּלִילָה): Feminine form of Hebrew Galil, meaning "cylinder" or "boundary." Compare with another form of Galila.
- 190. GALINA (גֵּלִינָה): Hebrew form of Greek Helénē, possibly meaning "torch." Compare with another form of Galina.

- 287. MORIYA (מוֹרְ יָּה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Mowriyah, meaning "chosen by God."
- 288. **MOWRIYAH** (מוֹרְיָּה): Hebrew name meaning "chosen by God." In the bible, this is the name of the mountain where Abraham prepared to sacrifice Isaac to God.
- 289. NAAMAH (נְעֶמְה): Hebrew name meaning "beautiful, pleasant." In the bible, this is the name of the Ammonite wife of Solomon.
- 290. NAAMI: Variant spelling of Hebrew Naamiy, meaning "loveliness."

- 337. **QETSIYAH** (קְצִיעָה): Hebrew name meaning "cassia," a bark similar to cinnamon. In the bible, this is the name of the second daughter of Job, born after his trial.
- 338. **QETUWRAH** (קטוּכָה): Hebrew name meaning "incense." In the bible, this is the name of Abraham's second wife.
- 339. RACHAB (בְּחָבֵּ): Hebrew name meaning "ample, broad, spacious, wide." In the bible, this is the name of a harlot of Jericho who aided the spies in their escape and was saved from destruction.
- 340. RACHAV (בָּחָבּ): Variant spelling of Hebrew Rachab, meaning "ample, broad, spacious, wide."
- 341. RACHEL (בְּחֵל): Hebrew name meaning "ewe." In the bible, this is the name of Jacob's favorite wife, and mother of Joseph and Benjamin. Compare with other forms of Rachel.
- 342. RAFAELA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Refaela, meaning "healed of God" or "whom God has healed." Compare with another form of Rafaela.

- 343. RAYA (בע): Hebrew name meaning "friend." Compare with another form of Raya.
- 344. **REBA**: Pet form of Hebrew Ribqah, meaning "ensnarer." Compare with masculine Reba. Compare with another form of Reba.
- 345. **REENA**: Feminine variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Rina, meaning "joy."
- 346. **REFAELA** (רְפָאֵלָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Rephaela, meaning "healed of God" or "whom God has healed."
- 347. **REPHAELA** (רְפָאֵלָה): Feminine form of Hebrew Rephael, meaning "healed of God" or "whom God has healed."
- 348. **REUT** (בעוּת): Hebrew name meaning "friend."

- 353. **RITSPAH** (בְצְפָּה): Hebrew name meaning "hot coal" or "pavement." In the bible, this is the name of one of King Saul's concubines.
- 354. RITZPA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Ritspah, meaning "hot coal" or "pavement."
- 355. RITZPAH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Ritspah, meaning "hot coal" or "pavement."
- 356. **RIVA** (בּיבָה): Pet form of Hebrew Rivka, meaning "ensnarer." Compare with another form of Riva.

- 364. **RUWTH** (תוּר): Hebrew name meaning "appearance" or "friendship." In the bible, this is the name of a Moabite who marries Naomi's son.
- 365. SABA (סָבָא): Hebrew unisex name meaning "aged, old." Compare with strictly masculine Saba.
- 366. SABRA (סבְּרָה): Hebrew name for a native-born Israeli, of Arabic origin, meaning "thorny cactus."
- 367. SALMA (שַּלְמָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "garment." In the bible, this is a masculine name only, the name of the father of Boaz. Compare with another form of Salma.
- 368. SAPHIRA (סְפִירָה): Hebrew form of Greek Sapphira, meaning "sapphire."
- 369. SARAH (שֶּׁרָה): Hebrew name meaning "noble lady, princess." In the bible, this is the name that God gave to Sarai, wife of Abraham.

- 370. **SARAY** (שְׁרֵי): Hebrew name meaning "my princes?" or "nobility." In the bible, this is the name of the wife of Abraham before God changed her name to Sarah.
- 371. SARIT (שָׁבֵּית): Diminutive form of Hebrew Sarah, meaning "noble lady, princess."
- 372. SAVA (סָבָא): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Saba, meaning "aged, old." Compare with strictly masculine forms of Sava.
- 373. SEMADAR (סְמָדֵר): Hebrew name meaning "bud" or "blossom."
- 374. SHACHAR (שַחַר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "dawn" or "morning."

- 15. **ABIYMELEK** (אָבִימֶלֶךְ): Hebrew name meaning "Melek is father" or "my father is king." In the bible, this is the name name of several characters, including the king of Gerar who took Abraham's wife Sarah and was forced by God to return her. Also spelled Avimelech.
- 16. ABIYNO'AM (אֶבִינֹעֵם): Hebrew name meaning "father of pleasantness." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Barak.

- 77. AMOWN (אָמוֹן): Hebrew name meaning "skilled workman." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Judah, a governor of Samaria, and a descendant of one one of Solomon's servants.
- אַמוֹץ): Hebrew name meaning "strong." In the bible, this is the name of the father of <u>Isaiah</u> the prophet.
- 79. **AMRAM** (עַמְרָם): Hebrew name meaning "kindred of the Most High." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Bani, and the father of Moses.
- 80. AMYAS: Variant spelling of Hebrew Amias, meaning "my people have been gathered in (reunited)."
- 81. ANAEL: Variant spelling of Hebrew Hanael, meaning "graciousness of Yahweh." In Jewish lore, this is the name of angel associated with the planet Venus.
- 82. ANAH (עֶנָה): Hebrew name meaning "answer." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Zibeon.
- 83. ANAK (עֲנָק): Hebrew name meaning "collar, neck-chain." In the bible, this is the name of the progenitor of the Anakim/Anakites who were descendants of the giant Nephilim. Also spelled Anag.

- 84. ANAN (עֲנָן): Hebrew name meaning "cloud." In the bible, this is the name of one of heads of the people who signed the covenant with Nehemiah. Compare with another form of Anan.
- 85. **ANANIY** (עֶנְנִי): Hebrew name meaning "my cloud." In the bible, this is the name of the 7th son of Elioenai, descendant of David.
- 86. ANANYA (עְנֵנְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "Jehovah clouds" or "what Jehovah covers." In the bible, this is the name of an ancestor of Azariah who lived in the time of Nehemiah and assisted in rebuilding the city wall.
- 87. ANAQ (עְנָק): Variant spelling of Hebrew Anak, meaning "collar, neck-chain." In the bible, this is the name of the progenitor of the Anakim/Anakites who were descendants of the giant Nephilim.
- 88. **ANAT** (עַנָת): Unisex form of Hebrew Anath, meaning "answer (to prayer)."
- 89. **ANATH**: Hebrew name meaning "answer (to prayer)." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Shamgar.
- 90. APHRA (רפּע): Hebrew unisex name derived from the word aphra, meaning "ashes, dust" and "clay, loam." In the bible, this is part of the name of a Philistine city, Bethelaphrah.
- 91. ARAM (אַכְם): Hebrew name meaning "exalted." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a grandson of Noah. It is also an ancient name for Syria. Compare with other forms of Aram.
- 92. **ARDIY** (אַרְדָּיִי): Hebrew name meaning "I shall subdue." In the bible, this is the name of a son or grandson of Benjamin.
- 93. **ARDOWN** (אַרְ דּוֹן): Hebrew name meaning "fugitive." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Caleb.
- 94. **AR'ELIY** (אַרְאֵלִיי): Hebrew name meaning "lion of God." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Gad.

- 95. **ARIAV** (אָר יאָב): Hebrew name meaning "father is a lion."
- 96. **ARI'EL** (אָר יאַל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "lion of god." In the bible, this is a name applied to the city of Jerusalem, and the name of a chief of the returning exiles. In the Apocrypha, this is the name of an archangel who rules the waters. It is also the name of a moon of Uranus, and the name of a spirit in Shakespeare's play "The Tempest."
- 97. **ARIK** (אָרֵיק): Pet form of Hebrew Aryeh, meaning "lion." Compare with another form of Arik.
- 98. **ARIYDAY** (אָרִידֵי): Hebrew name of Persian origin, meaning "the lion is enough." In the bible, this is the name of the ninth of Haman's ten sons who were hanged by the Jews.
- 99. **ARPAKSHAD** (אַרְפּלְשַׁד): Hebrew name of foreign origin, possibly meaning "by the border of Asia." In the bible, this is a place name and the name of a son of Shem.
- 100. ARTACHSHASHTA (אֵרְתַּחְשַׁשִּׁתְּ א): Hebrew form of Persian Artachshatra, meaning "great warrior" or "lionking." In the bible, this is the name of the son and successor of Xerxes as emperor of Persia.
- 101. ARYE: Variant spelling of Hebrew Aryeh, meaning "lion."
- 102. **ARYEH** (אָרִי): Hebrew name meaning "lion." In the bible, this is the name of an officer of king Pekahiah.
- 103. **ASAR'EL** (אֲשֵׂרְאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "whom God has bound (by a vow)." In the bible, this is the name of a descendant of Judah.
- 104. **ASHCHUWR** (אַשְׁ חוּר): Hebrew name meaning "blackness." In the bible, this is the name of a son of the father of Temeni.
- אָשֵׁר): Hebrew name derived from the word *ashar*, meaning "happy." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Jacob. In use by the English.

- 106. **ASHSHUWR** (אַשׁוּר): Hebrew name meaning "a step." In the bible, this is the name second son of **Shem**. It is also a name applied to the nation of Assyria and its people.
- 107. **ASIF** (אָסִיף): Hebrew name meaning "harvest." Compare with another form of Asif.
- 108. **ASRIY'EL** (אַשְׂרָיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "vow of God." In the bible, this is the name of a son and greatgrandson of Manasseh, and a son of Gilead.
- 109. ATIR (עַטִייר): Hebrew name meaning "crown, wreath."
- 110. ATSEL (אַצֵל): Hebrew name meaning "noble." In the bible, this is the name of a place near Jerusalem, and a descendant of Saul.
- 111. AVDON (עַבְּדּוֹן): Variant form of Hebrew Abdown, meaning "servant, worshiper." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including one of the judges who ruled over Israel.
- 112. AVI (אֲבִי): Pet form of Hebrew Avraham, meaning "father of a multitude." Also spelled Abi. Compare with feminine Avi.
- 113. **AVICHAYIL** (אֲבִיחַיִּל): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abihayil, meaning "father of might."
- 114. AVIDAN (אֲבִידָן): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiydan, meaning "my father is judge."
- 115. AVIGAL (אָבִיגֵל): Unisex form of Hebrew Avigayil, meaning "father rejoices."
- 116. **AVIMELECH** (אֲבִימֶלֶךְ): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiymelek, meaning "Melek is father" or "my father is king."
- 117. AVIRAM (אֲבֵירָם): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiyram, meaning "my father is mighty."
- 118. AVISHAI (אֲבִישֵׁי): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiyshay, meaning "my father is my gift."
- 119. **AVISHALOM** (אֲבִישָׁ לוֹם): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abiyshalowm, meaning "father of peace."

- 120. AVIV (אָבִיב): Hebrew name meaning "spring."
- 121. **AVIYAH** (אָב יָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Abiya, meaning "Yahweh is my father."
- 122. **AVNER** (אָבְנִיאֵל): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abner, meaning "father of light."
- 123. AVRAHAM (אַבְרָהָם): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abraham, meaning "father of a multitude."
- 124. AVRAM (אַבְרָם): Variant spelling of Hebrew Abram, meaning "father of elevation."
- 125. AVSALOM (אֲבְשָׁ לוֹם): Variant spelling of Hebrew Avshalom, meaning "father of peace."
- 126. **AVSHALOM** (אָבְשָׁ לוֹם): Contracted form of Hebrew Abiyshalowm, meaning "father of peace."
- 127. AYA: Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Ayah, meaning "falcon" or "vulture."
- 128. AYAH (אֵלֶה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "falcon" or "vulture." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Rizpah, and a Horite, the son of Zibeon.
- 129. AYAL (אַיָל): Hebrew name meaning "deer, gazelle."
- 130. AYALON (אֵיֶּלוֹן): Variant form of Hebrew Ayal, meaning "deer, gazelle."
- 131. AZANYAH (אֲזַנְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "God hears." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Jeshua.
- 132. AZAR'EL (עַזְרָאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God has helped" or "whom God helps." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a son of Bani, one of King David's warriors, and a priest and musician.
- 133. AZARYA (עֲזֵרְ יָה): Aramaic and Hebrew name meaning "help of God." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including one of the three young men thrown into the fiery furnace by Nebuchadnezzar.
- 134. AZA'ZEL: (עָזָאזֵל): Hebrew word (not name), meaning "entire removal" and "scapegoat." In the bible, this word is found in the law of the day of atonement (Leviticus 16:8,

- 10, 26). It refers to a goat used for sacrifice for the sins of the people. In modern times, *Azazel* was interpreted as a Satanic, goat-like demon. The name has even been used for the "Angel of Death."
- 135. AZAZYAHUW (עַחֵיָּהוּ): Hebrew name meaning "Yahweh is mighty." In the bible, this is the name of several minor characters, including the father of Hoshea.
- 136. **AZIZ** (עַדִּיִּז): Hebrew name derived from the word *oz*, meaning "might, strength." Compare with another form of Aziz.
- 137. AZRIY'EL (עַזְרֵיאֵל): Hebrew name composed of the elements 'azar "help" and 'el "God," hence "help of God." In the bible, this is the name of several minor characters.
- 138. BA'AL (Hebrew: בעל): Semitic name of several storm gods, and the first king of Hell who had three heads and commanded 66 legions of demons, derived from the word ba'al, meaning "lord, master" or "possessor." In the bible, this is the name of a member of the tribe of Reuben, and the grandfather of Saul.
- 139. BA'AL-ZEBUWB (בּעלֹזְבוּב): Hebrew name meaning "lord of the fly." In the bible, this is the name of a Philistine deity worshiped at Ekron.
- 140. **BANIY** (בְּנִי): Hebrew name derived from the word banah, meaning "built." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including one of David's warriors.
- 141. **BARAQ** (בְּכְּק): Hebrew name meaning "flash of lightning." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Abinoam who, incited by the prophetess Deborah, delivered the Israelites from the yoke of Jabin.
- 142. **BARUWK** (בְּרוּךְּ): Hebrew name meaning "blessed." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a faithful attendant of Jeremiah to whom the apocryphal *Book of Baruch* is ascribed.
- 143. BARZILLAY (בּרְזַלִי): Hebrew name meaning "man of iron." In the bible, this is the name of several characters,

- including a Gileadite leader who helped <mark>David</mark>against <mark>Absalom's rebellion.</mark>
- 144. BAZAK (בָּזָק): Hebrew name meaning "flash of light."
- 145. **BELA** (בֶּלֵע): Hebrew name meaning "destruction." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a king of Edom.
- 146. **BELSHA'TSTSAR** (בֵּלְאשׁצֵּר, בְּלְשׁ אצֵר): Aramaic and Hebrew forms of Babylonian Beltesha'tstsar, meaning "Ba'al's prince" and Bel-Shar-Usur, "Ba'al protect the king." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Babylon at the time of its fall; he to whom Daniel interpreted the writing on the wall.
- 147. **BENAYAH** (בְּנֵיה): Hebrew name meaning "God has built." In the bible, this is the name of the captain of David's guard and many other characters.
- 148. **BENAYAHU** (בּנְיָהוּ): Variant form of Hebrew Benayah, meaning "God has built." This form of the name also appears in the Old Testament bible.
- 149. **BEN-OWNIY** (אוֹנִי־בֶּן): Hebrew name meaning "son of my sorrow." In the bible, this is the name given to Benjamin by his mother Rachel as she died giving birth to him.
- 150. **BENYAMIN**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Binyamin, meaning "son of the right hand."
- 151. **BENZECRY**: Hebrew patronymic name meaning "son of Zechariah."
- 152. **BETHUW'EL** (בְּתוֹאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God destroys" or "man of God." In the bible, this is the name of a town and also the name of the father of Rebecca.
- 153. **BETSALEL** (בְּצֵלְאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "in the shadow." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Uri who was one of the architects of the tabernacle, and the name of an Israelite.
- 154. **BIGVAY** (בּגְוַי): Hebrew name meaning "gardener, husbandman" or "in my bodies." In the bible, this is the

- name of a man who was a leader amongst the Babylonian exile returnees.
- 155. **BILHAN** (בְּלְהַ): Hebrew name meaning "modest." In the bible, this is the name of a Benjamite.
- 156. **BINYAMIN** (בְּמֵמִין): Hebrew name meaning "son of the right hand." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including one of the founders of the twelve tribes of Israel, the youngest of Jacob's twelve sons. His original name was Benoni, given to him by his mother who died giving birth to him. Not wanting his son to bear such an illomened name, Jacob changed it to Binyamin (Benjamin), a more fortunate name.
- 157. **BINYAMIYN**: Older spelling of Hebrew Binyamin, meaning "son of the right hand."
- 158. **BO'AZ** (בּעֵז): Hebrew name meaning "swiftness." In the bible, this is the name of a Bethlehemite who married Ruth.
- 159. **BRAM**: Short form of Hebrew Abram "father of elevation" and Abraham "father of a multitude."
- 160. BROS: Hebrew name meaning "cypress tree."
- 161. **BUWZ** (Na): Hebrew name meaning "contempt." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Nachor.
- 162. CANCHERIYB (סְמְרֵר יב): Hebrew form of Akkadian Sinahheeriba, meaning "Sin (moon god) has taken the place of brothers to me." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Assyria, son of Sargon II.
- 163. CARNI (קְרְנִי): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Karni, meaning "my horn," a symbol of strength.
- 164. CELA (סְלֵע): Hebrew name meaning "a rock." In the Old Testament bible, this is the name of the capital city of Edom, possibly an early name for Petra.
- 165. **CHABAQQUWQ** (חֲבֵקוּק): Hebrew name meaning "embrace." In the bible, this is the name of a prophet.
- 166. CHADAD (דַּהַה): Hebrew name meaning "mighty" or "sharpness." In the bible, this is the name of one of the twelve sons of Ishmael. Also spelled Hadad.

- 167. CHADAR (גיה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Hadar, meaning "honor." In the bible, this is the name of an Edomite king.
- 168. **CHAGAI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chaggay, meaning "festive."
- 169. **CHAGGAI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chaggay, meaning "festive."
- 170. CHAGGAY (תֵגִּי): Hebrew name meaning "festive." In the Old Testament bible, this is the name of one of the minor prophets. Haggai is the Anglicized form.
- 171. CHAGGIY (חַבִּי): Hebrew name meaning "festive." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Gad. Haggi is the Anglicized form.
- 172. **CHAGI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chaggiy, meaning "festive."
- 173. **CHAIM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayim, meaning "life."
- 174. CHAKLAI (חַייק על): Hebrew name meaning "farmer."
- 175. **CHAM** (Dn): Hebrew name meaning "blackness" or "heat." In the bible, this is the name of Noah's second son. The Anglicized form is Ham.
- 176. CHAMMUW'EL (חַמּוּאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "heat of God." In the bible, this is the name of a man of Simeon. Also spelled Chamuel. Hamuel is the Anglicized form.
- 177. CHAMRAN (חַמְכִּן): Hebrew name meaning "the people is exalted" or "their slime." In the bible, this is the name of a son of a descendant of Esau. Amran is the Anglicized form.
- 178. **CHAMUEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chammuw'el, meaning "heat of God." Also, according to pseudo-Dionysius, this is the name of an archangel.
- 179. CHANAN (pp): Hebrew name meaning "compassionate, merciful." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a chief of the tribe of Benjamin. Canan and Hanan are Anglicized forms.

- 180. **CHANANI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chananiy, meaning "gracious" or "favorable."
- 181. **CHANANIY** (מְנֵייִ): Hebrew name meaning "gracious" or "favorable." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a brother of Nehemiah.
- 182. **CHANANIA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chananya, meaning "whom Jehovah has graciously given."
- 183. **CHANANIAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chananya, meaning "whom Jehovah has graciously given."
- 184. CHANANYA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chananyah, meaning "whom Jehovah has graciously given."
- 185. CHANANYAH (תְּנֵיֶה): Hebrew name meaning "whom Jehovah has graciously given." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a friend of Daniel, a general, a priest, and an officer who lived during the reign of King Uzziah. Hananiah is an Anglicized form.
- 186. CHANANYAHU (תְּנֵיְהוּ): Variant form of Hebrew Chananya, meaning "whom Jehovah has graciously given."
- 187. CHANIEL: Variant spelling of Hebrew Channiy'el, meaning "favored of God."
- 188. CHANNIY'EL (מְנָּיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "favored of God." In the bible, this is the name of a leader of the tribe of Asher.
- 189. **CHANOCH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chanowk, meaning "dedicated" or "initiated."
- 190. **CHANOWK** (חֲמוֹךְ): Hebrew name meaning "dedicated" or "initiated." In the bible, this is the name of the eldest son of Cain, and a son of Jared the father of Methuselah. Enoch is the Anglicized form.
- 191. **CHASHSHUWB** (בושׁהַ): Hebrew name meaning "considerate." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Pahath-moab.
- 192. **CHAVILA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chaviylah, meaning "circle."

- 193. **CHAVIVA** (חֲבִּיבָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "beloved."
- 194. **CHAVIYLAH** (מְנִילָּה): Hebrew name meaning "circle." In the bible, this is the name of a part of Eden through which the river Pison flowed, and the name of a son of Cush after whom a district in Arabia was named. Havilah is the Anglicized form.
- 195. **CHAYIM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayyim, meaning "life."
- 196. **CHAYYIM** (number of the word *chayyim*, meaning "life."
- 197. **CHAYYM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayyim, meaning "life."
- 198. CHAZA'EL (חֶזְאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "one who sees God." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Syria.
- 199. **CHEBER** (תֶבֶר): Variant spelling of Hebrew Heber, meaning "the region beyond; on the other side (of a stream or sea)."
- 200. **CHEBROWN** (תֶבְרוֹן): Variant form of Hebrew <mark>Ebron</mark>, meaning "alliance, association."
- 201. CHETSROWN (תֶּצְרוֹן): Hebrew name meaning "enclosed; surrounded by a wall." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Reuben.
- 202. **CHEVER** (תֶּבֶּר): Variant spelling of Hebrew Cheber, meaning "the region beyond; on the other side (of a stream or sea)."
- 203. **CHEVRON**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chebrown, meaning "alliance, association."
- 204. CHILKIA: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chilkiya, meaning "my portion is God."
- 205. **CHILKIYA** (תַּלְקְיָּה): Variant spelling of Hebrew Chilqiyah, meaning "my portion is God."
- 206. **CHILQIYAH** (תַּלְקְיֶּה): Hebrew name meaning "my portion is God." In the bible, this is the name of many

- characters, including the father of Eliakim, and a High Priest who lived in the time of King Josiah. Also spelled Chilkiya. Hilkiah is the Anglicized form.
- 207. CHINAN (מְבֵּוֵ): Aramaic and Hebrew name meaning "gracious."
- 208. **CHIY'EL** (חיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God lives." In the bible, this is the name of one of the rebuilders of Jericho.
- 209. **CHIYRAH** ('בְּחֵיּ): Hebrew name meaning "a noble race; nobility." In the bible, this is the name of a friend of Judah.
- 210. **CHIYRAM** (חֵיבֶם): Hebrew name meaning "free-born; noble." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Tyre and the name of the chief architect of Solomon's temple.
- 211. CHIZKIYAH (תְּקְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "God is my strength." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Judah.
- 212. CHIZQIYAH (תְּשְׁיֵה): Hebrew name meaning "God is my strength." In the bible, this is the name of a king of Judah and several other characters. Also spelledChizkiyah. Hezekiah, Hizkiah and Hizkijah are Anglicized forms.
- 213. CIYCERA (סִיסְרָא): Hebrew name meaning "field of battle." In the bible, this is the name of a Canaanite general and enemy of the Israelites.
- 214. **COWDIY** ('אָדָוֹס): Hebrew name meaning "an acquaintance of God." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Gaddiel.
- 215. **DAG**: Hebrew name meaning "fish." Compare with another form of Dag.
- 216. DAN ([]): Short form of Hebrew Daniy, meaning "judge." In the bible, this is the name of Jacob's fifth son (of 12).
- 217. **DANIY** (יְבֶּיֵי): Hebrew name meaning "judge." In the bible, this is the name of Jacob's fifth son (of 12). Dan is the Anglicized form.

- 218. **DANIYEL** (בְּנִיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God is my judge." In the bible, this is the name of the hero of the *Book of Daniel*, who was cast into a den of lions but saved by God.
- 219. **DANIYYEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Daniyel, meaning "God is my judge."
- 220. DAR (בּר): Hebrew name meaning both "mother-of-pearl" and "marble."
- 221. DARA (קֶּבֶע): Hebrew name meaning "the arm." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Zerah. Compare with other forms of Dara.
- 222. DAR`YAVESH (בּרְיֵוֶשׁ): Hebrew form of Persian Dârayavahush (Latin Darius), meaning "possesses a lot, wealthy." In the bible, this is the name of several characters including Darius the Mede, son of Ahasuerus, king of the Chaldeans.
- 223. **DATAN**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Dathan, meaning "belonging to a fountain."
- 224. DA'THAN (נְתָּוּ): Variant spelling of Hebrew Dathan, meaning "belonging to a fountain."
- 225. **DATHAN** ([[]]): Hebrew name meaning "belonging to a fountain." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Eliab who, with his brother Abiram, joined Korah in his rebellion against Moses.
- 226. **DAVID** (דוָד, דיוִד): Hebrew name meaning "beloved." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Jesse. David was the second king of Israel and father of KingSolomon. As a youth he killed a giant named Goliath with his slingshot.
- 227. **DEKEL** (יֶּקֶל): Hebrew name meaning "date/palm tree."
- 228. **DELAYA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Delayah, meaning "God has drawn."
- 229. **DELAYAH** (בְּלְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "God has drawn." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a descendant of Zerubbabel.

- 230. **DELAYAHU** (קליהוי): Variant form of Hebrew Delayah, meaning "God has drawn."
- 231. **DIBRIY** (בּבְרֵי): Hebrew name meaning "my word" or "eloquent." In the bible, this is the name of a man whose daughter married an Egyptian. Also spelled Divri.
- 232. **DIQLAH** (הַקְלָה): Hebrew name of foreign origin, meaning "palm grove." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Joktan.
- 233. **DIVRI** (בְּרֵיִי): Variant spelling of Hebrew Dibriy, meaning "my word" or "eloquent."
- 234. **DIYSHAN** (יְדִּישֵׁן): Hebrew name meaning "a species of gazelle" or "a thresher." In the bible, this is the name of the fifth son of Seir.
- 235. **DODI**: Hebrew name meaning "my beloved" or "my uncle." Compare with strictly feminine Dodi.

- 238. **DORON** (וְוֹחֹזן): Variant spelling of Hebrew Doran, meaning "gift."
- 239. **DORRAN**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Doran, meaning "gift."
- 240. **DOV** (בוֹד): Hebrew name meaning "bear."
- 241. **DOVEV** (דוֹבֵב): Hebrew name meaning "whisper."
- 242. **DOWR** (דוֹר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "generation" or "period of time." In the bible, this is the name of a coastal city in Manasseh, south of Carmel.
- 243. **EBEN** (پچچا): Variant spelling of Hebrew Even, meaning "stone."
- 244. **EBEN-HAEZER** (עֵזֶר-אֶבֶן): Hebrew name meaning "foundation stone, stone of help." In the bible, this is the name of the place where the Israelites were defeated by the

- Philistines. It is also the name of a memorial stone set up by Samuel after the Israelites got their revenge.
- 245. **EBER** (עבֶר): Variant spelling of Greek/Hebrew Heber, meaning "the region beyond; on the other side (of a stream or sea)." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a great grandson of Shem. Compare with other forms of Eber.
- 246. **EBRON** (עֶבְּחֹן): Hebrew name meaning "alliance, association." In the bible, this is the name of a city in south Judah near where Abraham built an altar. It is also the name of the third son of Kohath and a descendant of Caleb. The Anglicized form is Hebron.
- 247. **ECHUWD** (אַחוּד): Hebrew name meaning "joining together, united." In the bible, this is the name of a great grandson of Benjamin.
- 248. **EDEN** (ינדן): Hebrew unisex name meaning "delight" or "place of pleasure." In the bible, this is the name of the garden in which Adam and Eve lived.
- 249. **EDER** (עֶדֶּר):Hebrew unisex name meaning "herd, flock." In the bible, this is the name of a Levite who lived in the time of David, and the name of a town in the south of Judah. Compare with another form of Eder.
- 250. **EDI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Eidi, meaning "my witness." Compare with another form of Edi.
- 251. **EDOM** (אֶדוֹם): Hebrew name meaning "red." In the bible, this is the name of an ancient kingdom, and a name applied to Esau and his descendants.
- 252. EFA (עֵיפָה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Efah, meaning "darkness" or "gloomy."
- 253. **EFAH** (עֵיפָּה): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Eyphah, meaning "darkness" or "gloomy."
- 254. **EFRAIMA**: Variant form of Hebrew **Efrayim**, meaning "double-land; twin-land."

- 264. **EL'ADAH** (אֶלְעָהֵה): Hebrew name meaning "whom God puts on." In the bible, this is the name of a descendant of Ephraim.
- 265. **ELAZAR** (אֶלְעְזָר): Hebrew name meaning "god has helped." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a high priest son of Aaron. In use by the Basques.
- 266. **ELCHANAN** (אֶלְחָנִן): Hebrew name meaning "God is gracious." In the bible, this is the name of a warrior of King David's army.
- 267. **ELDAD** (אֶלְדָּדִי): Hebrew name meaning "beloved of God" or "friend of God." In the bible, this is the name of one of the two Israelites whose prophecies Joshuacomplained about to Moses.
- 268. **ELIAV** (אֵלִיאָב): Variant spelling of Hebrew <mark>Eliyab</mark>, meaning "my God is Father."

- 269. **ELIEZAR**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Eliezer, meaning "God has helped."
- 270. **ELIEZER** (אֱלִיעֶזֶר): Variant spelling of Hebrew Elazar, meaning "God has helped." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a high priest son of Aaron.
- 271. **ELIHUD** (אֱלֵּיְהוּד): Hebrew name meaning "my God is majestic."
- 272. **ELIOR**: Hebrew name meaning "my God is light."
- 273. **ELIY** (עליי): Hebrew name meaning "ascending." In the bible, this is the name of a high priest and last of the Judges in the days of Samuel.
- 274. **ELIYAB** (אֱלִיאָב): Hebrew name meaning "my God is Father." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a leader of the tribe of Zebulun.
- 275. **ELIYAH** (אֵלְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "Yahweh is my God." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including the prophet who lived during the reign of Ahab.
- 276. ELIYAHU: Variant form of Hebrew Eliyah, meaning "Yahweh is my God."
- 277. **ELIYHUW** (אֵלְיָהוּ): Hebrew name meaning "He is my God." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a friend of Job.

- 288. ELY: Short form of Hebrew Eliyahu, meaning "Yahweh is my God."
- 289. **ELYACAPH** (אֵלְיֵסף): Hebrew name meaning "God increases the family." In the bible, this is the name of a leader of the tribe of Gad.
- 290. **ELYAQIYM** (אֵלְיָק ים): Hebrew name meaning "God will establish." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including the steward of King Hezekiah's palace.

- 296. **EPHRAYIM** (אֶפְרֵיִם): Hebrew name meaning "double-land; twin-land." In the bible, this is the name of the second son of Joseph.
- 297. **ERAN** (עבן): Hebrew name meaning "awake; vigilant," i.e. "watcher." In the bible, this is the name of the eldest son of Ephraim.

In the bible, this is the name of the place where the Israelites were defeated by the Philistines. It is also the name of a memorial stone set up by Samuel after the Israelites got their revenge.
- 303. EVER (עבֶּר): Variant spelling of Hebrew Heber, meaning "the region beyond; on the other side (of a stream or sea)." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a great grandson of Shem.
- 304. **EVRON** (עבְרֹן): Variant spelling of Hebrew Ebron, meaning "alliance, association."

- 308. **EYTHAN** (אֶזְכְחִיּ): Hebrew name meaning "enduring, long-lived." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a grandson of Judah.
- 309. **EZAR**: Short form of Hebrew Elazar, meaning "my god has helped."
- 310. **EZRA** (עזקרא): Hebrew name meaning "help." In the bible, this is the name of a prophet, the author of the book of *Ezra*.
- 311. **EZRAH** (עְזָרה): Hebrew name meaning "help." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Jether, Mered, Epher and Jalon.
- 312. FLINT: Jewish ornamental name, meaning "shotgun." Compare with another form of Flint.
- 313. **GABRIYEL** (גַּבְרִיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "man of God" or "warrior of God." In the bible, this is the name of an archangel.
- 314. GAD (גַּב): Hebrew name meaning "troop." In the bible, this is the name of a prophet and the seventh son of Jacob by Zilpah. Compare with other forms of Gad.
- 315. **GADDIYEL** (אָד יאֵל: Hebrew name meaning "God is my fortune." In the bible, this is the name of one of the twelve scouts sent by Moses to explore the Promised Land.
- 316. GAL (גֵּל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "mound, wave."
- 317. **GALAL** (גַּלֵל): Hebrew name meaning "influential." In the bible, this is the name of two characters, a son

- of Asaph and a son of Jeduthun. Compare with another form of Galal.
- 318. GALIL: Variant spelling of Hebrew Galiyl, meaning "rolling, turning" or "circuit, region, ring."
- 319. **GALIYL** (גָּלִיל): Hebrew name meaning "rolling, turning" or "circuit, region, ring." In the bible, this is the name of a circuit or ring (Galilee) of the Gentiles.
- 320. **GAMAL** (מֵל): Hebrew name meaning "camel." Compare with another form of Gamal.
- 321. **GAMLIYEL** (מֵּלְיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God is my reward." In the bible, this is the name of a leader of the tribe of Manasseh.
- 322. **GAVRI** (גַּבְרֵי): Variant form of Hebrew Gavriel, meaning "man of God" or "warrior of God."
- 323. **GAVRIE**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gavri, meaning "man of God" or "warrior of God."
- 324. **GAVRIEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gabriyel, meaning "man of God" or "warrior of God."
- 325. **GEDALIAHU**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gedalyahu, meaning "God is great."
- 326. **GEDALYA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gedalyah, meaning "God is great."
- 327. **GEDALYAH** (מְּדֵלְיָה): Hebrew name meaning "God is great." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including the governor of Judah appointed by Nebuchadnezzar.
- 328. **GEDALYAHU** (אְדֵלְיָהוּ): Variant form of Hebrew <mark>Gedalyah</mark>, meaning "God is great."
- 329. **GEMARIA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gemarya, meaning "God has accomplished."
- 330. **GEMARYA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gemaryah, meaning "God has accomplished."

- 331. **GEMARYAH** (אְמֵרְ יָה): Hebrew name meaning "God has accomplished." In the bible, this is the name of the son of Hilkiah who bore Jeremiah's letter to the captive Jews.
- 332. **GEMARYAHU** (בְּיָהוּמְמֵ): Variant form of Hebrew Gemaryah, meaning "God has accomplished." In the bible, this is the name of one of the nobles who lived in the time of Jeremiah.
- 333. **GERA** (גּבָא: Hebrew name meaning "a grain." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Benjamin.
- 334. **GERAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gera, meaning "a grain."
- 335. **GERESHOM** (גְּרְשׁׁ ם): Hebrew name meaning "exile, expulsion." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Moses.
- 336. **GERESHOWN** (גֵּרְשׁוֹן): Hebrew name meaning "exile, expulsion." In the bible, this is the name of the first son of Levi.
- 337. **GIDAL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gidel, meaning "toogreat; giant."
- 338. **GIDDEL** (אַבל): Hebrew name meaning "too great; giant." In the bible, this is the name of the head of a family of temple slaves, and the head of the descendants of Solomon's servants.
- 339. **GIDEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gidel, meaning "too great; giant."
- 340. **GIDI**: Pet form of Hebrew Gidown, meaning "cutter down; hewer," i.e. "mighty warrior."
- 341. **GIDON**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Gidown, meaning "cutter down; hewer," i.e. "mighty warrior."
- 342. **GIDOWN** (יוֹדְעוֹן: Hebrew name meaning "cutter down; hewer," i.e. "mighty warrior." In the bible, this is the name of the warrior who defeated the Midianites.

- 343. **GIL** (גִּיל): Hebrew name meaning "joy." Compare with other forms of Gil.
- 344. **GIL-AD** (עַד-גִּיל): Hebrew name meaning "hard, stony region."
- 345. **GILAD** (גּלְעָד): Hebrew name meaning "hard, stony region." In the bible, this is the name of region east of the Jordan River. It is also the name of several characters, including a grandson of Manasseh.
- 346. **GINA** (גְּנָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "garden." Compare with strictly feminine forms of Gina.
- 347. **GOLYAT**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Golyath, meaning "exile."
- 348. **GOLYATH** (גּלְיֵת): Hebrew name meaning "exile." In the bible, this is the name of a Philistine giant slain by David. A shard of pottery unearthed by archaeologists digging at Tell es-Safi, bears two Proto-Semitic names (alwt and wlt) which are etymologically similar to Hebrew Galyat/Golyat/Golyath. The shard dates to around 950 BC, very close to the time when the bible says Goliath lived.
- 349. **GOMER** (גֹמֶר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "to finish, to complete." In the bible, this is the name of both the son of Japhet and the wife of the Prophet Hosea. Compare with another form of Gomer.
- 350. **GOWG** (גּוֹג): Hebrew name meaning "mountain." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Shemaiah and the name of the prophetic prince of the land of Magog.
- 351. HABACUC: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chabaqquwq, meaning "embrace."
- 352. **HADAD** (דֹתֵּי): Hebrew name meaning "mighty." In the bible, this is the name of two kings of Edom, and a son of Ishmael. Compare with other forms of Hadad.
- 353. HADAR (בתה): Hebrew name meaning "honor." In the bible, this is the name of an Edomite king. Also spelled Chadar.

- 354. **HADAS** (o to): Hebrew unisex name meaning "myrtle tree."
- 355. **HAIM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayim, meaning "life."
- 356. HAMAN (המן): Hebrew name of Persian origin, meaning "magnificent." In the bible, this is the name of a wicked prime minister.
- 357. **HANAEL**: Variant form of Hebrew Channiy'el, meaning "favored of God."
- 358. **HAYYM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayim, meaning "life."
- 359. **HAYYIM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayim, meaning "life."
- 360. **HEBEL** (הֶבֶּל): Hebrew name meaning "breath, breathing." In the bible, this is the name of the second son of Adam and Eve who was killed by his jealous brotherCain. Also spelled Hevel.
- 361. HEBER (Greek: Ἔβἑρ, Hebrew: עבֶּר): Greek and Hebrew name meaning "the region beyond; on the other side (of a stream or sea)." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a great grandson of Shem. Compare with another form of Heber.
- 362. HED (דַה): Hebrew unisex name meaning either "shout of joy" or "echo."
- 363. **HEVEL** (הֶבֶּל): Variant spelling of Hebrew Hebel, "breath, breathing."
- 364. **HEYLEL** (הֵילֵל): Hebrew name meaning "light-bringer." In the bible, this is a name for the morning star (Lucifer) and the honorific title of a Babylonian king. *Lucifer* is the Latin translation of this name.
- 365. **HILLEL** (חֵלֵּל): Hebrew name meaning "praising, singing." In the bible, this is the name of the father of judge Abdon.

- 366. Hosha'na (נא-הוֹשׁע): Hebrew unisex name derived from hosha'na, meaning "deliver us." In the bible, this was the cry of the people who recognized Jesus as the Messiah when he entered Jerusalem.
- 367. **HOWSHEA** (הוֹשֵׁעֵ): Hebrew name meaning "salvation." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including the author of the Book of Hosea.
- 368. **HYAM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Chayim, meaning "life."
- 369. **IBRIY** (עבְרָיִי): Hebrew name derived from the name Ever ("the region beyond; the other side"), hence "Hebrew." In the bible, this is the name of a Merarite Levite. Abraham was called *Ivri* because he came from ever "the other side."
- 370. **IKAVOD**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Iy-kabowd, meaning "inglorious; without glory."
- 371. ILAN (אַילָן): Hebrew name meaning "tree."
- 372. **IMMANUW'EL** (עמָנואַל): Hebrew name meaning "God is with us." In the bible, this is the name of the promised Messiah as prophesied by Isaiah.
- 373. IMRIY (אַמְרֵי): Hebrew name meaning "eloquent." In the bible, this is the name of a member of the tribe of Judah.
- 374. **ITTAY** (אָתֵּי): Hebrew name meaning "neighboring" or "with me." In the bible, this is the name of a Gittate and the name of one of King David's warriors.
- 375. ITZHAK: Variant spelling of Hebrew Yitzchak, meaning "he will laugh."
- 376. **IVRI** (עבר י): Variant spelling of Hebrew <mark>Ibriy</mark>, meaning "Hebrew."
- 377. **IVTZAN** (אַ בצָן): Hebrew name meaning "coated with zinc."

- 378. **IY-KABOWD** (וֹכְבוֹד-אִיי): Hebrew name meaning "inglorious; without glory." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Phinehas.
- 379. **IYOV**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Iyowb, meaning "hated, oppressed."
- 380. **IYOWB** (אִיּוֹב): Hebrew name meaning "hated, oppressed." In the bible, this is the name of a patient man who was severely tested by God. Job is the Anglicized form.
- 381. **IYTHAMAR** (אִיתָמֵר): Hebrew name meaning "land of palms." In the bible, this is the name of the youngest son of Aaron.
- 382. IYTHIYEL (אִית יאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "God is with me." In the bible, this is the name of a Benjamite and a disciple.
- **383. IYRA** (עִירָא): Hebrew name meaning "watchful of a town." In the bible, this is the name of one king David's officers and two of his warriors.
- 384. IYYOV: Variant spelling of Hebrew Iyov, meaning "hated, oppressed."
- 385. **KAFZIEL** (קפציאל): Hebrew name meaning "speedy one of God." In Jewish legend, this is the name of an angel. Unlike most of the other angels, *Kafziel* is a watcher, rather than a doer. He is called the angel of solitude and tears, and presides over the deaths of kings. *Kafziel* is associated with the Seventh Heaven, the planet Saturn, and has been worshiped by Satanists. He is also known by the Latin name Cassiel.
- 386. **KALEB** (מֵלֵב): Hebrew name meaning "dog" or "rabid." In the bible, this is the name of one of the twelve spies sent into Israel by Moses. Also spelled Kalev.
- 387. KALEBH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Kaleb, meaning "dog" or "rabid."
- 388. **KALEV** (מֵלֵב): Variant spelling of Hebrew Kaleb, meaning "dog" or "rabid." Compare with another form of Kaley.

- 389. **KALIL** (פֵּלִיל): Hebrew name meaning "crown, wealth." Compare with another form of Kalil.
- 390. **KARMEL** (בֵּרְמֶל): Hebrew unisex name meaning "garden-land." In the bible, this is the name of a mountain in the Holy Land.
- 391. **KARMIY** (בּרְמִי): Hebrew name meaning "a vinedresser" or "my vineyard." In the bible, this is the name of a Judaite, father of Achan, and the name of the fourth son of Reuben.
- 392. **KARNI** (קרְנִי): Hebrew unisex name meaning "my horn," a symbol of strength. Also spelled Carni.
- 393. **KASHTI** (קֹשׁיְתִּיי): Hebrew name meaning "my bow; my rainbow."
- 394. **KEHAT**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Kehath, meaning "assembly."
- 395. **KEHATH** (קהת): Variant form of Hebrew Qehath, meaning "assembly."
- 396. **KENANIAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Kenanyah, meaning "Jehovah establishes" or "whom Jehovah defends."
- 397. **KENANYAH** (פְּנֵיְה): Hebrew name meaning "Jehovah establishes" or "whom Jehovah defends." In the bible, this is the name of a Levite who was the chief of the Temple singers who conducted the music when the Ark of the Covenant was moved from the house of Obed-edom to Jerusalem.
- 398. **KESED** (وَهِاتِ): Hebrew name meaning "increase." In the bible, this is the name of the 4th son of Nahor. Chesed is the Anglicized form.
- 399. **KORACH** (קֹבְת): Variant spelling of Hebrew Qorach, meaning "bald" or "ice." In the bible, this is the name of a Levite who led a rebellion against Moses and Aaron.
- 400. KOWRESH (ਘੜਾਂ): Hebrew form of Persian Kič½rush, meaning "like the sun." In the bible, this is the name of the king of Persia, Cyrus the Great, conqueror of Babylon, who freed the captive Jews.

- 401. KUSH: Variant spelling of Hebrew Kuwsh, meaning "black," i.e. "Ethiopian."
- 402. KUWSH (খাচ): Hebrew name meaning "black," i.e. "Ethiopian." In the bible, this is the name of a land and its people. It is also the name of a Benjamite and the son of Ham and grandson of Noah. The Anglicized form is Cush.

- 548. RAM ( ): Hebrew name meaning "high." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Hezron.
- 549. RAMAH (כּעְמֵה): Hebrew name meaning "a lofty place." In the bible, this is the name of many places, including a place of battle between Israel and Syria.
- 550. RAPHA (בְּפָא): Hebrew name meaning "feeble, flaccid, weak," i.e. "a shade" living in Hades, void of blood and animal life; therefore weak and languid like a sick person, but still able to think. In the bible, this is the name of a son of Benjamin and a descendent of Saul.
- 551. RAV (23): Hebrew name meaning "great" or "teacher."
- 552. **RAVID** (כָבִיד): Hebrew name meaning "jewelry, ornament."
- 553. **REBA** (בֶּבֶע): Hebrew name meaning "a fourth part." In the bible, this is the name of one of the five kings of Midian. Compare with feminine Reba.
- 554. **RECHABAM** (רְחַבְעִם): Hebrew name meaning "who enlarges the people." In the bible, this is the name of the son and successor of Solomon, who governed the kingdom of Judah.
- 555. **REFAEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Rephael, meaning "healed of God" or "whom God has healed." In the books of Enoch and Tobit, this is the name of an archangel.

- רעמיאל): Hebrew form of Arabic Ramiel ("thunder of God"), meaning "mercy of God." In Christian and Islamic tradition, this is the name of a Watcher. - 561. Rauwel (לְעוֹאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "friend of God." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Esau. In the Book of Enoch, this name is included as one of the seven archangels. He is known as the archangel of fairness, harmony, and justice; he oversees the other angels to make sure that they are all working peacefully together with mankind. All angels and archangels who transgress must face this angel who passes judgment and issues punishment. - 564. **RINNAH** (בְּהַה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "shouting for joy." In the bible, this is the name of descendant of Judah. Although this is a masculine name in the bible, it is otherwise used primarily as a feminine name.
- 565. **RO'I** (1-רֹאִי-): Hebrew name meaning 1) "my shepherd" or 2) "my seer."
- 566. RON (ווֹר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "joy, song." Compare with another form of Ron.
- 567. **RONI** (רוֹנִי): Hebrew unisex name meaning "my joy" or "my song." Compare with strictly feminine Roni.
- 568. ROTEM (בּחָה): Hebrew unisex name derived from the word rethem, found in the bible, meaning "juniper" or "broom plant," a shrub growing in the deserts of Arabia with yellowish flowers, and a bitter root which the poor were accustomed to eat.
- 569. SABA (סָבָא): Hebrew unisex name meaning "aged, old." Compare with another form of Saba.
- 570. **SABATH**: Variant form of Hebrew Shabat, meaning "rest, Sabbath."
- 571. SALMA (שַּלְמָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "garment." In the bible, this is a masculine name only, the name of the father of Boaz. Compare with strictly masculine Saba.
- 572. **SAMA'EL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Samael, the name of an Angel of Death, meaning "whom God makes" and "yenom of God."

- 573. SAMAEL (סמאל): In Jewish mythology, this is the name of an archangel, a fallen angel, the Angel of Death or Poison, the accuser, seducer, and destroyer famously known as The Grim Reaper. He is said to be both good and evil, having been one of the heavenly host. He rules over seven habitations called Sheba Ha-vechaloth, infernal realms of the Earth. The Talmud states: "the evil Spirit, Satan, and Sama'el the Angel of Death, are the same"; and Samael is also therein equated with the biblical serpent who tempted Eve in the Garden of Eden. He is called the Prince of Darkness and chief of the Dragons of Evil and is held responsible for the scorching wind of the desert called the simoom. It is probably the Hebrew form of Syrian <mark>Shemal</mark> ("left"), but composed of *'el* "god" and suwm "to create" or "to place, to set," hence "whom God makes." It is also sometimes rendered "venom of God." Also spelled Samil and Sammael.
- 574. **SAMIL**: Variant form of Hebrew Samael, the name of an Angel of Death, meaning "whom God makes" and "venom of God."
- 575. SAMMAEL (סמאל): Variant spelling of Hebrew Samael, the name of an Angel of Death, meaning "whom God makes" and "venom of God."
- 576. SARAF: Variant spelling of Hebrew Saraph, meaning "burning one" or "serpent."
- 577. **SARAPH** (שְׁבֶּר): Hebrew name meaning "burning one" or "serpent." In the bible, this is the name of a son of **Shelah**. It is also the name of a species of venomous serpents mentioned in Numbers 21:6, and the name of an order of six-winged angels mentioned by **Isaiah** who attend upon God.
- 578. SAVA (סָבָא): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex Saba, meaning "aged, old." Compare with other forms of Sava.
- 579. **SEIYR** (שֵּׁעִיר): Hebrew name meaning "hairy, rough." In the bible, this is the name of several place, and the name of a patriarch of the Horites.

- 580. **SHABAT**: Variant spelling of Hebrew **Shabbath**, meaning "rest, Sabbath."
- 581. SHABBATH (שַבָּת): Hebrew name meaning "rest, Sabbath." In the Old Testament bible, this is the name of the seventh day of the week, a day of rest.
- **SHACHAR** (שַחֵר): Hebrew unisex name meaning "dawn" or "morning."
- 583. **SHADRACH** (שַּדְּרֵבְּך): Hebrew name meaning "little friend of the king" or "rejoicing in the way." In the bible, this is a name given to Hananiah in the court of Babylon."
- 584. **SHAHAR** (שַחֵר): Variant spelling of Hebrew unisex **Shachar**, meaning "dawn" or "morning."
- 585. SHAI (ישֵי): Aramaic and Hebrew name meaning "gift."
- 586. **SHALLUWM** (שַלּוּם): Hebrew name meaning "retribution." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including the husband of Huldah the prophetess.
- 587. **SHALOM** (שֵּלוֹם): Hebrew name derived from the word *shalowm*, meaning "peace," or perhaps more correctly, of body, "healthy and sound."
- **SHAMGAR** (שַמְגַּר): Hebrew name, possibly meaning "sword." In the bible, this is the name of a judge of Israel an son of Anath.
- 589. **SHAMIYR** (שָׁמֵיר): Hebrew name meaning "a sharp point," hence "thorn." In the bible, this is the name of two towns.
- 590. **SHAMUWR** (שְׁ מוּעָה): Hebrew name meaning "a message, tidings" or "that which is heard." In the bible, this is the name of a Levite.
- 591. **SHANI** (שָׁנִי): Hebrew unisex name meaning "crimson red." Compare with another form of Shani.
- 592. **SHAPHAT** (שְּפָּט): Hebrew name meaning "to erect" or "to judge." In the bible, this is the name of the father of the prophet **Elisha**, and several other characters.

- 593. **SHARAR** (שֶׁכֶּר): Hebrew name meaning "enemy" or "to be firm, hard." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Ahiam.
- 594. **SHAUWL** (שָאוּל): Hebrew name meaning "asked for, desired." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including the first king of Israel.
- 595. **SHAY**: Variant spelling of Aramaic/Hebrew Shai, meaning "gift." Compare with another form of Shay.
- 596. **SHEALTIYEL** (שְאַלְתִּיאֵל): Hebrew name meaning "borrowed from God." In the bible, this is the name of the father of Zerubbabel.
- 597. **SHEFATYA** (שְּלְטֵּיְהַ): Variant spelling of Hebrew Shephatyah, meaning "whom Jehovah defends." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a son of David.
- 598. SHEBA (1-שֶבַע-2): Compare with feminine Sheba.
  - 1. Hebrew name meaning "oath" or "seven." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a son of Joktan.
  - 2. Hebrew name meaning "seven." In the bible, this is the name of a Benjamite, a Gadite, and a town.
- 599. **SHELACH** (שֵלַח): Hebrew name meaning "a missile, weapon." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Arphaxad.
- 600. **SHELAH**: Hebrew name meaning "a petition, prayer." In the bible, this is the name of a son of Judah. Compare with another form of Shelah.

- 622. SHMUEL: Contracted form of Hebrew Shemuwel, meaning "heard of God," "his name is El," or "name of God."
- (שְלוּמִיאֵל): Contracted form of Hebrew Shelumiyel, meaning "friend of God." In the bible, this is the name of a prince of the tribe of Simeon.
- 624. **SHOSHAN** (שׁוֹשַׁן): Hebrew unisex name meaning "lily." Compare with another form of Shoshan.
- 625. SIMCHA (שַּמְחָה): Hebrew unisex name meaning "joy."
- 626. **SIMIEL**: According to Pope Gregory I, this is the name of an archangel. It may be a short form of Hebrew Yesiymael (Jesimiel), meaning "whom God makes" or "whom God makes grow old." *Samael* is also sometimes rendered "yenom of God."

- 643. **TOVIT** (טובת): Variant spelling of Hebrew Tobit, meaning "good."
- 644. **TOVIA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Toviya, meaning "God is good."
- 645. **TOVIYA**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Towbiyah, meaning "God is good."
- 646. **TOVIYYAH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Towbiyah, meaning "God is good."

- 749. **YEHEZKEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Yechezkel, meaning "God will strengthen."
- 750. **YEHOASH**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Yehowash, meaning "given by Yahweh" or "whom Jehovah gave."
- 751. YEHOCHANAN (יְהֹחְנֶן): Variant spelling of Hebrew Yehowchanan, meaning "whom Jehovah gave."
- 752. YEHONATAN (יְהוֹנֶתְן): Variant spelling of Hebrew Yehownathan, meaning "God has given."
- 753. **YEHORAM**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Yehowram, meaning "God is exalted." In the bible, this is the name of several characters, including a king of Judah.

Gesenius states that "leprosy" (צָרַ ע) may be the same as (צָרַ ע) "scabby," so that it means to be struck by a scabby disease. In the bible, this is the name of a Simeonite chief of the family of Shimei. Jesimiel is the Anglicized form.

- 799. **YISHAI**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Yishay, meaning "I possess" or "wealthy."
- 800. YISHAY ('): Hebrew name meaning "I possess" or "wealthy." In the bible, this is the name of the father of King David. Jesse is the Anglicized form.
- 801. YISHMAEL (ישִׁמְעֵאל): Hebrew name meaning "God will hear." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including a son of Abraham. The Anglicized form is Ishmael.

- 822. **YOQTAN** (קְּמָן): Hebrew name meaning "small." In the bible, this is the name of a descendant of Shem. Joktan is the Anglicized form.

- 823. YORAM (שֹׁבֶּם): Contracted form of Hebrew Yehoram, meaning "exalted by God."

- 861. **ZERACH** (ng): Hebrew name meaning "light." In the bible, this is the name of many characters, including an Edomite leader, a son of Simeon, and a son of Judahand Tamar. Zerah is the Anglicized form.
- 862. **ZERUBBABEL** (זְרוּבָּבֶל): Hebrew name meaning "born at Babylon" or "scattered to Babylon." In the bible, this is the name of the leader of the first of the returning exiles.
- 863. **ZERUBAVEL**: Variant spelling of Hebrew **Zerubbabel**, meaning "born at Babylon" or "scattered to Babylon."
- 864. **ZEV**: Variant spelling of Hebrew Zeeb, meaning "wolf."
- 865. **ZEVACH** (nag): Variant spelling of Hebrew Zebach, meaning "a slaying."
- 866. **ZEVACHYA** (זֶבֵחְ יֶה): Hebrew name meaning "sacrifice of Yahweh."
