Church Council Meeting
St. Paul's United Church of Christ
November 11, 2024

The Council Meeting was called to order at 6:00pm by Council President Charmaine Duehring. Those in attendance were Charmaine Duehring, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Fred Dieball, Kay O'Keane, Cindy Cain, Connie Johnson and Janene Kluever. Kim Kersten and Vicki Dost were unable to be with us.

The October meeting minutes were approved. The Financial report was reviewed and the finances are doing well. We received a good credit on the electric bill due to the solar system. The financials were approved. Pastor Bonnie told us that she talked with our civil servants and the following will be attending a special service for them on November 24th. We will have members from the Richfield Fire Department and Ambulance Service and they will bring their truck. The Sheriff's Department will come and bring their vehicle. We talked about the update of the By-Laws and its proofing.

We have some evaluations for Organist Jill, from Sunday School and the Choir. Jill's salary was \$135 per performance including her four vacation times. We decided a 7.4% raise would be warranted. Two people will meet with Jill to discuss, they are Cindy Cain and either Vicki Dost or Kim Kersten. They will go over the comments and evaluations with Jill. The Church Insurance has been raised by 53% for year 2025 with deductible at \$10,000. Water damage insurance deductible will be \$25,000. Charmaine shopped around with other insurance companies and found out we are lucky to find an insurance company to take us, because of the age of the church.. Insurance will be \$8334.00 per year. We were told that the sound on the UTube would fade in and out and we will have our technology people check this out. The Sunday School Christmas Program will be December 15th and the Cookie Walk is coming up on December 7th. The Outdoor Nativity Scene will be put up in December by Jack Duehring. Fall clean-up was a success and well done.

We need three people on our nominating committee. Kay agreed to ask Carol Kaisler and Charmaine will ask Peggy Ahles and Fred will ask Carl Roock. We need to nominate a total of 5 people. We need one for the Council and 2 for the Endowment Committee and 2 for the PPRC. The Financial Secretary, Sharon Schlafer can be asked if she wants to be re-elected. Those leaving the Council will be Charmaine Duehring, Kim Kersten and Janene Kluever. The Annual meeting will be February 2, 2025. The Chili Luncheon is scheduled for February 23, 2025, from 11am to 2pm. It will be \$10.00 per ticket and there will be pies, but the pies will not be available to sell until 10:30 am. The price of the pies will be \$10.00 each.

President Charmaine Duehring reminded us that our Women's Guild will have their 100-year anniversary in 2025. Also our church will be 185 years old in October, 2025. Also, we decided to get a gift of \$50.00 for the Richfield Fire Department because of their AED Training.

The Council continued to work on the budget for 2025. Meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm. Our next meeting will be December 9, 2024.
