PASTOR'S MESSAGE

As a congregation, we have been naming a creation joy each Sunday. I include a photo of a creation joy for the slides. The creation joys we witness everyday don't seem special to us. We see them all the time. Why do we bother?

The thing about creation joys is that it invites us to truly see the ordinary through God's eyes. It's a time to stop and look deeply, listen intently. There may be deer that are in your yard almost every day. It could be the night sky that we neglect to look up at and truly appreciate what's beyond. It could be the eagle who sits in the tree at the edge of the field. Ordinary to folks who live here.

For Jeff and I, it's going to the same spot on Harrington Beach near Belgium, Wisconsin, the spot we affectionately call the Rock Garden. It's the same exact latitude and longitude but it is different every time. It's amazing what the power of water can do to huge rocks or how the beach increases or decreases from day to day, storm to storm.

Another creation joy I experienced. speed. But I was sure he would turn off soon. He didn't. A car came up behind us and zoomed past.

He turned onto east Elmwood and so did I. He probably thought I was crazy. There was plenty of room to pass him. Nope. I began to totally relax. At that speed I could really see the fields on either side of the road. I could take a good look at the birds flying nearby. It was nice. I could pay attention to the music I had chosen to play, which happened to be a Bach piece. There wasn't another vehicle around and so I safely observed the world (creation) around me. In fact, I allowed myself to become one with nature.

Where do you feel closest to God? We need to pay attention. Creation is awesome! God is AWESOME!!

PLASTIC BAGS LENTEN PROJECT

Lent doesn't begin until Ash Wednesday on March 5th, but in anticipation of this project, hopefully you have been saving plastic bags. There are several possible items to create using plarn, which is plastic yarn. For example, there are internet craft directions for knitting plarn into mats or bags. There are similar directions for crocheting with plarn. The jump rope made of plarn is braided and no needles are needed. It takes 12 plastic bags to make a jump rope. We will include these in our Christmas ShoeBox

project. Anytime you want to drop off your collection of plastic bags, bring them to the church office.

December 9, 2024

The Council Meeting was called to order by Council President Charmaine Duehring at 6:00pm. Those in attendance were Charmaine Duehring, Cindy Cain, Fred Dieball, Kay O'Keane, Connie Johnson, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Vicki Dost, Kim Kersten and Janene Kluever.

The November Minutes were approved after corrections. We are ahead of the Budget with envelopes and loose offerings. We are looking at the front door replacement. It needs to be a steel door and will be investigating costs for the door which is not working correctly. Final bills need to be paid for the end of the year. The Financial Report was approved.

Pastor Bonnie's report was the Creation Care will not meet now until the new year. Half of the loose change from the Christmas offering will be designated to the Washington County Foster Closet. It has become too long for "joys and concerns" along with Mission happenings and "Nature's Wonders". Pastor Bonnie suggested that she would try some ways to shorten this time during the service. Pastor Bonnie would be taking vacation December 30th through January 6th.

We reviewed the Amended and Restated By-Laws which were printed for the annual meeting. The people have been asking for the nomination Committee and we have Bill Ahles and Lynn Duwell and looking for another one. Cindy Cain and Vicky Dost have reviewed the year of music with Jill Lotzow and Jill has accepted the increase of pay to \$145.00 per performance. We are getting insurance for the church, but at a higher price. We discussed the pledge updates to determine how much we can work with on the Budget. Kay O'Keane to get the picture album completed from photos of the past. The piano will be tuned and the metal plaque will be installed to indicate it is from Beulah Timm.

The date for all annual reports to be turned into the office or emailed is January 19, 2025. The King funeral will be held at church on Tuesday, January 7th.

We went into executive session for review of Pastor Bonnie Jacque. Then we continued Budget work for 2025. Annual Meeting will be February 2, 2025.

Our next meeting will be January 20, 2025. Meeting was adjourned at 8:25pm
