But I cannot stay in that mode because this coming Sunday is the first Sunday in Advent! This year's Christmas story is from the Gospel of Matthew. The author gives us a closer look at Joseph than the others. Read Matthew 1: 18-25 through 2: 11-12 (and if you are brave enough read the escape to Egypt and the massacre of the infants.)

Advent brings us weekly themes of hope, peace, joy and love. The color of Advent is purple or blue. Blue as in **Blue Christmas** which this year will be held on **December 10th at 7 PM.** I know this year has brought difficulty on so many levels for so many people. This service acknowledges the grief and loss that many of you are experiencing. And, it doesn't have to be just this years' loss but any form of loss that Christmas time triggers for you. It can be a challenging season.

SOMETHING TO SHARE

As I was gathering my thoughts about the meaning of Blue Christmas, I found the following credited to Kelly's Treehouse.

If you know someone who has lost a very important person in their life and you're afraid to mention them because you may make them sad by reminding them that they died — you're not reminding them, they didn't forget that they died. What you're reminding them of is that you remembered that they lived. And that is a great, great gift.

French Toast Casserole

½ loaf French bread (approx. 8 oz.) cubed

½ c. butter

1 c. packed brown sugar

6 eggs

2 c. milk

2 tsp. vanilla extract

2 tsp. cinnamon (divided)

1 T. brown sugar for topping

Powdered sugar for topping (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 425. Butter 13x9 baking pan and set aside.
- 2. In a small saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in brown sugar until dissolved and mixture is smooth. Pour into 9x13 pan and spread evenly.
- 3. Add bread cubes, spreading over sugar/butter mixture.
- 4. In medium sized bowl, whisk eggs, milk, vanilla and 2 tsp cinnamon. Pour over top of bread cubes, ensuring that all pieces of bread are saturated. Sprinkle with remaining 1 tsp cinnamon and 1 T. brown sugar.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven for 25-30 minutes until top is golden brown. Remove from oven and sprinkle with powdered sugar if desired.

From Misti — I used bakery made Walmart French bread. Try using PAM rather than butter to keep from sticking on the bottom. I used powdered sugar but wish I hadn't—it looked prettier without. Finally, I drizzled maple syrup (small amount in a zig-zag pattern) across the top right before serving) The assembled casserole can be refrigerated overnight and baked for a morning breakfast.

The Church Council Meeting came to order at 6 p.m. Those in attendance were Kay O., Fred D., Curt H., Connie J., Debbie S., and Vicki D. Kay read an opening prayer.

The September Council Meeting minutes were approved with corrections. The September Financial Reports were reviewed and approved. Pastor Bonnie's report is that she is working on a place to move that can help Jeff.

The New Church Directory is complete, and we are pleased with how it looks. We plan to hand it out starting at the 185th Church Anniversary. The Financial Planning/Investment Committee is looking for members. Kay will ask some potential members for interest. The snowplowing season will be starting soon. Kay will contact Jeff Schulteis regarding this years' plowing.

Pastor John H. will not be able to attend the 185th Church Anniversary. Still waiting to hear from Pastor Don N. Pastor Rachel B. will be speaking at the 185th Anniversary service. The Stewardship letters and pledge cards have been sent out. Will have a Stewardship moment for the next 2 Sundays. The Blessing of Pledges will be November 9. Hymnal shortage is noted at special events. There are 10-15 hymnals in the balcony. They should be moved to the main church pews. Will monitor to see if shortage continues and possible order more.

Kay will print the review form for Pastor Bonnie for church members to fill out. The review form will be handed out with the bulletin. They are due November 23. Kay will edit the form, so it can be used for Jill. Jill's form will be given to choir, pastor, and Sunday School teachers. Upcoming dates: Blue Christmas 12/10 7 p.m., Chili Dinner 2/22/26. Discussion regarding service times for Christmas at 2:30 and 4:30 p.m. Will need to discuss further with Pastor Bonnie.

For the upcoming budget, the council should review financial reports and flag anything that is over or expected to increase. Creation Care may propose improvement project for 2026 and should bring that to the annual meeting. Motion to combine Creation Care and Garden Committee into one budget was approved.

Liaison Report- Building and Grounds-Fred- No news. Concern regarding the outhouse. Is it functional? Is it locked? Will check with Jack D. and Bill E. Christian Education-Debbie- Continue to look for help, even for a day. Guild-Vicki- Guild planning 110th and 185th Anniversary potluck on 11/2. Technology-Kay- No news. Creation Care-Curt-Developed recycling brochure. Lynn D. made a recycling display by kitchen cart. May hand out recycling brochures with bulletin. Fellowship-all- No news. Music-Vicki- No news. Mission-Kay- Christmas Child Boxes and Brown Street Academy coats and Waukesha County Clearing House gift card collection to start soon.
