Building and Grounds- Jack- Presented some future projects: grade and round the hill by the parking lot, adding a second handrail at the stairwell in front of the church for safety, and raising the ceiling lights in church to accommodate screen visibility for the balcony. The May Council Meeting Minutes were approved. The May Financial Report was reviewed and approved.
