There are just some authors who get you, speak directly to you, grab your imagination. Madeleine L'Engle was the first to do that for me. I read and reread her "children's" Newberry Award winning A Wrinkle in Time and its sequels first. However, it was her "A Circle of Quiet" (Book 1 of her published The Crosswicks Journal) that I read until the book had pages full on underlining and notes in the margins. I actually bought a new clean copy just to share with others.

In seminary, I was exposed to lots, and lots of mind-expanding authors. As I think back on some of them now, I doubt I will ever read them again and there are some who I seriously hold dear. Ann Weems is one of those. Like Madeleine L'Engle, she was a prolific writer. As you read any of her books, you can feel her passion. Among her seven published books or collection of poems, I own four of them and I'm convinced I must have all of them. Note to self: Order Ann's book, Kneeling in Jerusalem.

She is widely acclaimed for her poem, Balloons Belong in Church, about her then four-year-old son, Todd, who brought an orange balloon with pink stripes to church school one Sunday morning. You can read in in Something to Share. All of her writings are deeply rooted in the scriptures, and in daily living, both joys and sorrows. She once said that "writing was, for her, a spiritual exercise, a form of prayer in which one can imagine what might be and, in the writing, help it to become true."

Do you have an author who has touched your life? If you cannot bear to part with your personal cherished copy, I invite you to purchase a clean copy to add to our library. Oh, you do know we have an active library, right? Check a book out or check a book in! I'm adding A Circle of Quiet and I'll purchase a clean copy of Reaching for Rainbows by Ann Weems. a need to now take these new finds and put them in albums too. If you are interested in working on this project please let Charmaine D. know.



Balloons Belong in Church, written by Ann Weems included in her book Reaching for Rainbows

I took to church one morning a happy four-year-old boy Holding a bright blue string to which was attached his much-loved orange balloon with pink stripes... Certainly a thing of beauty And, if not forever, at least a joy, for a very important now. When he later met me at the door, Clutching blue string, orange and pink bobbing behind him, He didn't have to tell me something had gone wrong. "What's the matter?" He wouldn't tell me. "I bet they loved your balloon..." Out it came then, mocking the teacher's voice: "We don't bring balloons to church." Then that little four-year-old, his lip a bit trembly, asked: "Why aren't balloons allowed in church? I thought God would



like balloons." I celebrate balloons, parades, and chocolate chip cookies. I celebrate seashells and elephants and lions that roar. I celebrate roasted marshmallows and chocolate cake and fresh fish. I celebrate aromas: bread baking, mincemeat, lemons... I celebrate seeing: bright colors, wheat in a field, wild flowers... I celebrate hearing: waves pounding, rain falling, soft voices... I celebrate touching: toes in the sand, a kitten's fur, another

person...

I celebrate the sun that shines slap dab in our faces...

And I celebrate the green of the world, the life-giving green, the hope-giving green...

who chew cough drops

who ask questions

who give us sticky, paste-covered creations

who want their pictures taken

who don't use their napkins

who bury their goldfish, sleep with the dog, scream at their best friends

who hug us in a hurry and rush outside without their hats

I celebrate children who are so busy living they don't have time

for our hang-ups,

And I celebrate adults who are as little children.

(I'm going to leave out the next several stanzas, which pains me to do, but I challenge you to look up the entire poem on your own. I am jumping to the last several verses as something to share.)

That Christ hung there Loving the unlovable. What beautiful gift cannot be offered unto the Lord -Whether it's a balloon or a song or some joy that sits within you Waiting to have the lid taken off? The Scriptures say there's a time to laugh and a time to weep. It's not hard to see the reasons for crying in a world where hatred for others is so manifest; But it's also not hard to see the reasons for laughter in a world where God's love is so manifest. Church Council Meeting Minutes St. Paul's United Church of Christ February 11, 2024

Meeting was called to order by President Charmaine Duehring at 6:00pm. The attendees included Vicki Dost, Connie Johnson, Kim Kersten, Cindy Cain, Charmaine Duehring, Kay O'Keane, and Janene Kluever. Fred Dieball was unable to come. Pastor Bonnie joined us via the telephone and led our prayer January meeting minutes were approved. We also reviewed the Annual Meeting Minutes. The financials incoming did very well, which was expected, because of the start of the year. The electric bill was high and we will check this out but the solar panels are getting old and there was not much sun. There is now an additional fee from the Electric Company for the solar panels. Financial report was approved.

Pastor Bonnie will be meeting with the new members, Oberhozers, Scott Hellesen and Terry Phillips. She will be going over the history of our church and the history of the United Church of Christ formation, and its history. She is hoping to install the new members on March 3rd, with a reception following the church service. Easter Sunday is March 31st and she would like to find out if there would be a number of people to get together with those people who do not have plans for a celebration and perhaps have a potluck. She will find out from the congregation. Her change in office hours will be entered on the church service program and in Chapel Bells. Baptism of Ava and Aspen Ranta to take place on a Saturday at church, but the date is unknown. Pastor Bonnie is looking for some funds to provide snacks or some hospitality type lunch or food for visitors with the minister. The money that is provided to her will cover this cost.

We had the election of the officers, as we welcomed our new Council Members, Vicki Dost, Cindy Cain and Fred Dieball. Charmaine Duehring will continue as President, Kim Kersten has accepted the role of Vice President and Kay O'Keane will continue as Secretary. The selections were approved. We went over the location of necessary items in the church for the new members. The installations of the Council members will be the following Sunday, February 18th. We have to select two new members for the Endowment Committee. Kim Kersten will ask one of the Guetzkes and Vicki Dost will check with Eugene Dost and if needed Cindy will check with Peggy Ahles. This is a one year appointment.. Kurt Hulterstrum and Cindy Cain will be leaving the committee. Regarding the By-Laws, one council member will be selected to be on the PPRC Committee and Cindy Cain has accepted this position.

We reviewed the final membership and a letter was sent out to those who did not fulfill the membership roles as indicated in our By-Laws. We had feedback where some people were upset to get this letter and perhaps we will need to change the contents of the letter. We have 131 members which we submit to the Association. Christian Education has a Pizza Day coming up soon. Palms have been ordered for Palm Sunday. A form has been made for people to buy Easter Flowers. Dave Zimpelman is working with Tech to help make up the new Tech system with a TV. We reviewed the liaisons for committees, Vicki Dost will be liaison for Guild and Charmain has Building and Grounds and Fellowship and Christian Ed.and Altar.. Connie Johnson has Mission Committee. The Chili Luncheon is all set along with the pie sale, except we are a little shy of people to help. The 36 pounds of meat was donated by Lucy Krapfl and the Johnsons.

We are looking for a cleaning person to replace Blondie. Wanda Dieball might accept the position, we are still checking.

Our next meeting will be March 11th. Meeting was adjourned at 7:34pm.
