

Pastor Bonnie Church Council Meeting Minutes St. Paul's United Church of Christ December 12, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 6:00pm by President Charmaine Duehring. Those in attendance were Connie Johnson, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Lucy Krapfl, Kay O'Keane, Charmaine Duehring, Cheryl Fischer, Janene Kluever, Carl Roock and Kim Kersten.

November Council Meeting minutes were approved. The envelopes and income are still doing well. The current electric bill is looking better, they and we are catching up. The November financials were approved. Pastor Bonnie has requested vacation for one week, 2/13 through 2/21. Pastor John Helt will cover on Sunday February 19th. Pastor Bonnie's Installation service will be March 5, 2023, at 2:00pm. Charmaine will find out who is responsible for the invitations and programs for the Installation. Pastor Bonnie will have a gmail account that will be separate from her personal account. She will use the account which we have for the church. Pastor Bonnie will have a separate cell phone account, which she has set up and found out the cost would be \$20. The discussion for the Relational Covenant will be tabled at this time.

The light on the outside sign needs to be replaced. We have some nativity scene items that need to be staked into the ground. A "Thank You" letter will be sent to those who have sent in their pledges. The Stewardship Committee will send out reminder letters to those who may have forgotten to reply. The Internet needs to be updated and Spectrum service has not been helpful. We need to increase to 300 MBytes, which should start in January, 2023.

The background check on Blondie, the cleaning person, will need to be completed. We will go through Church Mutual for this completion. The Altar Committee will get the flowers for Christmas and they will ask the congregation to donate \$5.00 for honor and remembrance of family and friends. We still need the nomination committee of three. We will ask Sue Miller and Jo Swanson to work with Steve Manuell. We will put an announcement in the Erin NewsLetter for the Chili Supper and Pastor Bonnie's installation. Pastor Bonnie suggested that we need one or two signs to distinguish the bathroom and elevator doors. The noise level in the sanctuary before church has been much too loud, for those who might be praying. We discussed what we might do to help keep the noise low, such as keeping ourselves quiet, once Jill has started playing, as one idea.

The Faith Foundation Book Studies classes must be registered by the end of December. Money may be used from the Endowment Fund. Chili Supper will be February 26th. The charge will be increased from \$9.00 to \$10.00. Betty Zimpelman will handle the pies.

Budget is now \$1123 less than the Income, as we work on it.

Our next meeting will be January 9, 2023. Meeting was adjourned at 7:30pm..
