That pew will be re-positioned to an alternate location until the Annual Meeting on February 2. The folding chairs can be re-positioned or removed, as necessary, to accommodate our guests and members with disabilities. In the meantime we can watch the flow of our guests and members to determine whether a permanent change in the front pew seating area is the best long term solution.

- 1) Opening Prayer
- 2) Approval of October minutes October minutes were reviewed and unanimously approved (Glenn moved, Curt seconded)
- 3) Approval of October Financials October financials were reviewed, discussed and unanimously approved. (Wanda moved, Sue seconded)
- 4) Pastor's Report-Written report presented and reviewed with Council. Report included October through November ministry highlights, upcoming events and prayer needs. Vacation requested for November 26 – December 1 (Rev. Russ Knoth preaching on Dec. 1) and December 16 – 30 (Alan Timm preaching on Dec. 29) John motioned, Jill seconded. Unanimously approved.
