- 2. October minutes were read and approved.
- 3. October financials were reviewed with Connie's notes. Another \$9,000 from Memorial Fund has been moved to United Church Fund. The church is ahead in giving this year, but there are several larger bills due in December. Financials **approved**.
- 4. There was **no Pastor's report**. Susan will reach out to Pastor Bev to see how pastoral care is progressing .
- 5. A list was made of who will need to be elected at the Annual Meeting and potential nominating committee members will be contacted. When the committee is established, they will be responsible for aquiring nominees for the positions open.
- 6. Building and Grounds, Altar Committee, Christian Education, and Mission Committee will be contacted to turn in **2022 budget requests by December 5**. Charmaine will email Rachel Hoch to have **pledge results available for the December 12 council meeting.**
- 7. Church closing due to inclement weather was discussed. Susan will confer with Pastor Bev, change answering machine message, and contact media. Donna Runte will be asked to send out an email. Each council member will call a portion of the members.
- 8. Christmas Eve Services will be at 4:30 and 6:30. Greeters will be needed and someone will need to be responsible for locking up. To be assigned at next meeting when families plans are confirmed.
- 9. Liason reports: WE energies will be replacing our parking lot lights with LED's since one of old ones is burned out. Sign room door has been replaced. Jack Duehring will give snowplower a list of dates for plowing. Organist was granted a delay in use of 2021 vacation day to January 2022. Cold sensor for building is being looked into by Church Mutual who installed it. Blondie's work was reviewed, and Lucy will ask Adam Staus if he takes out kitchen garbage along with large outside garbage cans. If not, Blondie will be asked to take out kitchen garbage while doing weekly cleaning. Debbie Braden has given Guild the addresses of new families in area and they will send out a brochure to each along with a cover letter as soon as it is drafted by Susan.
