In the last month, I completed

a course on Boundary Training. Boundary training is a requirement of all UCC pastors every four years. I usually dread what can be a boring subject. Not the case this time. The subjects included were: What is boundary training, pastoral relationships with adults, finance, self-care, pastoral relationships with children and youth, and social media. I completed the online portion which included reflection pieces on each subject and a final paper. I was signed up for the in-person piece as part of attending the Annual Meeting. I canceled my spot due to my father's passing. I will be making this up this coming fall at the Southeast Association meeting.

I attended the Southeast Annual Meeting on May 7th via zoom. As I look back at my notes now "faith calls you to not give up", "we have to be bigger and broader than our building" and "push beyond our comfort zones to adapt to new ways to serve God" stand out from Rev. Laura McLeod's introduction. The keynote speaker, Professor Thomas Thibodeau, spoke of the power of the word...a word of prayer... a word of hope, etc. These are the words that make the church a safe place for all. "The way we talk to and with each other with appreciation and acknowledgement are simply a different way of saying,'I Love You'." Professor Thidodeau was a very dynamic speaker and moved away from the pulpit, which meant his voice was not picked up on zoom. I regret not being able to listen to the rest of his presentation.

Finally, I have enrolled in a course of study utilizing the book Grace and Gigabytes written by Ryan Panzer through the UCC Damascus Project. This is a five-week course which utilizes a platform similar to Zoom. We meet once a week and discuss what we have read. To date, we have covered a section on questions and the power of questions.

At some point in the near future, my hope is to integrate all this learning into a sermon, or sermon series, and/or a discussion group. There is so much to learn!

Something To Share

While this selection may seem more like a tongue twister, it is something to think about. If you would like to share your thoughts with me, I'm more than open to hearing from you.

Parker Palmer wrote in his book *Let Your Life Speak*: The God I know does not ask us to conform to some abstract norm for the ideal self. God asks us only to honor our created nature, which means our limits as well as potentials. When we fail to do so, reality happens – God happens – and the way closes behind us.

The God I was told about in church, and still hear about from time to time, runs about like an anxious schoolmaster measuring people's behavior with a moral yardstick. But the God I know is the source of reality rather than morality, the source of what *is* rather than what *ought to be*. This does not mean that God has nothing to do with morality: morality and its consequences are built into the God-given structure of reality itself. Moral norms are not something we have to stretch for, and moral consequences are not something we have to wait for: they are right here, right now, waiting for us to honor or violate, the nature of self, other, world.

One dwells with God by being faithful to one's nature. One crosses God by trying to be something one is not. Reality – including one's own – is divine, to be not defied but honored.



Our Pastoral Search Committee continues our work and has completed our Church Profile which has been approved by our Church Council and published for potential pastoral candidates to see. When the Church Council hired Pastor Bonnie as our interim pastor, Pastor Bonnie and our Search Committee each expressed a desire to be able to potentially consider her as our settled pastor. Normally the UCC prohibits a congregation from considering an interim pastor for the settled pastor's role, however, when the interim pastor and Search Committee are open to it from the beginning, the UCC makes an exception and deems the interim pastor a "Designated Interim Pastor." In our case, Pastor Bonnie was hired by the Church Council as a Designated Interim Pastor, which allows Pastor Bonnie and our Search Committee to consider whether we are the right fit for each other.

Over the last few months, we have received nearly twenty pastor's profiles, and, for various reasons, none of them have been a good fit for our congregation. We have also observed and met several times with Pastor Bonnie and, based on that experience, Pastor Bonnie and the Search Committee have agreed that we will move forward in a sort of "on the job interview" over the next two months. In the interim, we will regularly meet with each other and listen to the feedback of the congregation. We have shared this plan with the Church Council as well and they are on board with the process. During this time, we will not be looking at other pastor's profiles.
