Kate Bowler wrote a blessing for when you don't feel blessed:

"Blessed are we drowning in grief.

When wave after wave after wave crashes over us.

Who start to feel okay, then something reminds us of what we've lost,

And we're pulled under once again.

God promises to comfort us.

Blessed are we when someone hurts us When we are offended and we don't return insult for insult. Instead, we forgive, recognizing the number of times We've needed to be forgiven."



The component of blessing that is often overlooked in the common usage of blessed or blessing is thankfulness. A benediction then includes being thankful for being a part of a faith community. During a guided tour we learned the house had been finished in 1854 and built over 13 years by the John Richards family. Four stories tall and built entirely of brick in the shape of a perfect octagon the house is one of the largest residences from pre civil war Wisconsin. It featured a central spiral staircase, running water provided by a funnel shaped roof, and a roomy octagonal tower room for a fifth floor. The grounds also included a restored barn and the first kindergarten in the United States-begun in 1856 in Watertown.

A stop at Mullen's Dairy Bar (1932) in downtown Watertown completed a memorable day.

The April meeting minutes were approved. Regarding the financial reports, we are still doing good, ahead of last year. We have a family donating money for the steeple to be shingled. The utilities problems have now been worked out and prices are correct. The Tech Committee is under budget so far. The Financial Report was approved.

We were told the water was checked by the bill of \$40.00 from Washington County. But no one was here at the time and we cannot verify this water check. Charmaine will find out if our water was indeed checked and who signed off for this. The Coffee gathering on Thursdays may stop for the summer. Pastor Bonnie will make that decision. We discussed who would be going to the Annual Association Meeting at Green Lake. Pastor Bonnie will be going and Cindy Cain has said she would go and possibly Jill Lotzow will go. The cost of each attending would be around \$153.51 and we will make a note of the cost so that we can put it into the budget for next year. The Brat Fry planning is ongoing. Eugene has two kickball teams so far and is looking for more. Lucy Krapfl has recruited her daughter to help, because she did a fabulous job last year.

The steeple shingle planning and work is not complete, we are waiting for a dry/no rain week to complete the project. Clean-up turned out good. There was a pine removed and the Creation Care Committee will plant a tree to replace it. Also, the Creation Care Committee would like to look into recycling and garbage pick-up. They will need to investigate the costs to see if this would be possible. Perhaps we will need to put it into the budget next year.

We reviewed the By-Laws of the church,, to be continued next month.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:34pm. Our next meeting will be June 10th.
