#### **COUNCIL NOTES**



Don Niederfrank attended to discuss his book "*House of Toast*" and to answer our questions about the process of writing and publishing a book. For those who are newer to St. Paul's, Don was St. Paul's pastor in the 1990s.

The book is about a retired pastor who decides to open a restaurant that only sells toast. Although the restaurant doesn't do very well, the characters that frequent the restaurant and the pastors' involvement with them make for a delightful and sometimes surprising tale.

The book club members greatly enjoyed reading the book and Don freely discussed how the characters and story evolved over the years of writing and rewriting. He himself didn't know how it was going to end when he started writing! The process of getting the book published involved hiring an editor, sending out many manuscripts, and eventually using Amazon to self-publish.

No, he hasn't become rich or famous from selling his book, but has accomplished something he always wanted to do. He is currently working on a book that takes place in the same small town as the first book. Church Council Meeting Minutes St. Paul's United Church of Christ April 15, 2024

Meeting was called to order by President Charmaine Duehring at 6:00pm. Those in attendance were Pator Bonnie Jacque, Connie Johnson, Fred Dieball, Cindy Cane, Vicki Dost, Kim Kersten, Charmaine Duehring and Kay O'Keane and Janene Kluever.

The March meeting minutes were approved. The financials, we are doing good on the envelopes. The electric bill was zero, but previous months were more, so we are getting caught up. We are having trouble keeping the Pastor's office warm. This will be checked. Financial report was approved. Pastor Bonnie's report was reviewed. We discussed Maundy Thursday church service. We had a very good attendance for the service. There was a suggestion that the basket to receive the nails should have been closer to the main floor, as the lights were dim and some had trouble using the steps and that was noted and will be reviewed next year. Pastor Bonnie is looking to take vacation Sunday, June 23rd through Saturday, July 6th. This was approved and Pastor Bonnie will seek the substitutes for June 23rd and June 30th. The Creation Care Committee will receive a line item on the budget for \$300 to be added in next year's budget, but in the meantime, they will be able to spend money and they will be reimbursed. Pastor Bonnie will not attend the Southeast Association meeting scheduled April 27th, but she will watch the video. The Annual Association Meeting will be June 6th through June 8th. Cindy Cain said she was interested in going and Pastor Bonnie will ask the congregation if anyone else is interested in going. The Creation Care Committee members, Obie and Neal Oberholzer will be cleaning the solar panels. It was suggested that the Care Committee could do a lesson on what can be recycled and in what condition, etc.

We have received the lawn mowing contract and it is \$408. There will not be a vacation Bible School this year. May 19th will be the last day of Sunday School and we will provide a small gift for the teachers, which Kim Kersten will purchase. The Brat Fry in the fall will be September 8th and they are working on it. The wooden offering plate was repaired by Charmaine Duehring and we will check on the other one to see what condition it is in. Jack Duehing is working on repairing the front steps and railing. Christian Education will have pizza for after church on Sunday April 21st, using the vegetables they planted this past summer. The flowers that decorated the altar area for Easter had cost \$500, which was paid for by the congregation. The Dieball family will plant a lilac bush in memory of Russell.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:20pm. Our next meeting will be May 13th.
