Pastor's Message

Our Stewardship Theme this year reminds us from Bread and Cup to Faith And Giving.

How does that play out in our life? Do we recognize that when we break bread and drink from the cup, we make a commitment to God to serve in any way we are able. We say, "These are the gifts of God for the people of God." Think about what that means...the gifts of God. The Gifts we receive through pledging cover material expenses and local and wider missions.

"For the people of God" - that's us. But it's more than us. It's certainly missions, like supporting the Mission Maniacs by collecting books to go with Rock's Adopt a Pet. It's the Adult Changing Table project that may still become a reality. I don't have to tell you how important mission is to this church. The people of God means no conditions. It's about the support we offer to anyone, anywhere...no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey.

Did you know there are churches who no longer pass a collection plate? That's right, they have

encouraged the congregation to give electronically or by an annual or quarterly check, to the point that they only place a collection plate at the back of church for loose offerings or those who prefer to continue with weekly envelopes.

I only share this information because I would like it to become a normal and accepted practice to place nothing in the collection plate as it is passed. I want to celebrate when we give nothing but give everything...no matter what form that takes.

St. Paul's is a church that "Prays together, Plays together and Serves together".

I chose "The Peace of Wild Things" to share this month because of late despair seems to dominate so much of our lives. We all know someone with an illness that needs to be held in prayer. There have been disasters like fires, hurricanes and floods that have touched our lives. We ask, "Where is God?" Wendell Berry expresses those feelings so well.

1 10 % oz. condensed cream of chicken soup 1/3 cup sour cream

1 16 oz. pkg. frozen mixed vegetables, thawed, drained

Heat oven to 400

Prepare stuffing as directed on package Combine remaining ingredients; spoon into 13x9 baking dish, sprayed with cooking oil Top with stuffing

Church Council Meeting Minutes St. Paul's United Church of Christ September 12, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Charmaine Duehring at 6:00pm. In attendance were: Charmaine Duehring, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Kay O'Keane, Lucy Krapfl, Connie Johnson, Cheryl Fischer, Kim Kersten, Carl Roock and Janene Kluever. Brett Miller was also in attendance.

Brett had joined us to get the Council's approval to recommend Pastor Bonnie Jacque as St. Paul's permanent minister. Pastor Bonnie was approved by the Council. It was decided to have a Congregational meeting on October 30th, for the approval of the congregation.

The minutes from August were approved with the amendments. The envelopes are behind, but we are ahead on the budget. The Electric Company has acknowledged our discrepancy on their billing and they will make the adjustments with the building and the outside electric billing. Connie Johnson will watch to make sure they make the corrections. The Financial Report was approved.

Pastor Bonnie reported that she had attended one counseling session and may attend one more as she found it to be informative. She will have a baptism on September 25th. We have one confirmation student, Nathan Weber. Pastor Bonnie was accepting ideas for learning opportunities. Confirmation for Nathan will be May 7, 2023.

The Legacy Grant: We are looking at perhaps helping YMCA in West Bend for special needs children and adults' swimming class and their changing spaces. We will check with Mary Gross, our contact, to see if we are on the right track. The deadline is in March, 2023.

We will have Jack Duehring call to ask the same person to do the snow plowing this winter. The children's Christmas program will be December 18th. We will look into seeing if we can help with "Feeding our Children" for confirmant and anyone else who would like to help. The Memorial Tree has been planted and it should be watered well into November. It will have a trunk protector. The bench has been ordered from Sister Bay.

We had a profit of \$1800 from the Brat Fry in August. We will discuss what we can do next year to increase the participation. We will review membership in January or February, 2023. Chili Supper will be in February, per Marilyn Dieball. We will continue to review our Mission Statement as we need something catchy and memorable. Also, when it can be used and how often, etc.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:32pm.
