Pastor's Message

What is this singing bowl stuff all about? The

Postoria Measure singing bowl originated from pre-Buddhist culture in the Himalayas and is often referred to as a "Tibetan" Singing Bowl. The bowls were made in various countries such as Bhutan, Nepal, India and Tibet.

Traditionally, the bowls were made of seven sacred metals, corresponding to the seven planets: GOLD- Sun, Mercury-Mercury, Iron- Mars, Lead- Saturn, Silver- Moon, Copper- Venus and Tin-Jupiter.

The sound or vibration of a singing bowl is pure and universal. It helps the body to relax, slows down the busy mind, to calm oneself and induce a sense of inner peace. Singing bowls are used as part of a meditation practice or help with relaxation.

I have been experimenting with the singing bowl as a part of worship. If there is one thing, (and I agree), I hear all the time, it is that St. Paul's is such a friendly church. They are right, we are. The murmurs of folks saying good morning and/or inquiring how they are doing, is a sign of a healthy church. Amen to that.

However, there have been times when it has been brought to my attention, we might be confusing how friendly we are in fellowship hall at coffee and conversation versus in what is considered the sacred space of the church.

If you have been in church recently, you will notice we added some meditativestyle music before church and the singing bowl. Both are intended to help us enter a time of personal prayer or meditation. Perfect silence is not necessary, in fact, it's uncomfortable.

We will try ringing the bowl from the back of church, instead of me ringing it from the front. Why? Because I felt like the schoolteacher shaking her/his finger and saying sit down and be quiet. Not my intention at all.

This is what I envision: We continue the meditative music; the singing bowl is rung from the back of church; the ushers will proceed to the front to light the candles and I will follow them – also from the back. Nothing is written in stone. Ok the ten commandments were written in stone.

As always, I welcome feedback from this friendly church.

The meeting was called to order by President Charmaine Duehring at 6:00pm. In attendance were: Charmaine Duehring, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Kay O'Keane, Lucy Krapfl, Connie Johnson, Cheryl Fischer, Kim Kersten. Brett Miller was also in attendance. Carl Roock and Janene Kluever were unable to be with us.

Brett was there to start putting a package together for calling Pastor Bonnie. He had received good references and looking at vacation days to offer Pastor Bonnie.

Minutes of July's meeting were approved. The financial report was reviewed The income is coming in good from the offering envelopes. Electric company has still not made their adjustments. The budget is in good shape. Rachel is to get new envelopes. Financial report was approved. Two Sundays were part of Pastor Bonnie's vacation and we had substitute ministers.

The building and grounds have noted that we have two water sensors and one has been going off very often. They did not need to be going off and trying to fix by relocating one off the cement floor. The air conditioner has been repaired. Two directional signs to St. Paul's have been knocked down and need to be replaced. The one at St. Augustine Road and Q needs the post replaced and the sign is somewhat weathered. The one at Monches Road and Q needs a new post. The new posts for both would be \$316 and a new sign would be \$505. We would like to add a new sign at Highway 164 and Monches Road. This would total around \$1000, which is not in the budget. We voted to approve the funds from Building and Grounds. We will check with Roy Kaisler to order the signs.

Vacation Bible School was canceled for lack of children. Sunday School will be starting on September 11th with a Pot Luck luncheon, calling it Reunion Sunday. Ten people attended the Peck and Bushel Meeting. The Brat Fry is all set and in control. The Fall Stewardship will consist of Eugene Dost and Vick Dost and Connie Johnson.

Kim Kersten will get a quote for planting the tree from Breezy Hill Nursery. Jack Duehring will call the hotline for digging. The Bench may be purchased from Sister Bay.

The committees should be reminded that we need their 2023 budget by October. The Christmas services will be Saturday, the 24th at 4:00pm and Sunday, the 25th at 9:30am.

The St. John's Grant is a maximum of \$5000. They need a detailed description to be put in writing to May Gross who is in charge and to be submitted by September 30th. Ideas are needed for the proposal. We will need to see if there is more information by next month. We changed the letter that will be sent to those people who may wish to be or not to be members of this church. The membership roll was reviewed and letters will be sent out.

Our next meeting will be September 12th. Meeting was adjourned.
