Looking for a book to read? Here are the books the St. Paul's Ladies Book club has read so far in 2022. Hope you will enjoy them as much as we did!

The Forgotten Garden by Kate Morton – A forgotten garden on an 1800's estate connects to many of the aristocratic families secrets in this epic tale.

The Newcomer by Mary Kay Andrews – Letty and her niece flee to a old fashioned motel in the south after she finds her sister murdered. Can she find safety and answers among the quirky motel residents?

The Vanishing Half by Britt Bennet – Twins- one passing as white and the other embracing her black heritage go their separate ways but find their lives intertwining again when their children learn their secrets.

Hotel Portofino by J. P. O'Connell – The book the PBS series is based on set in Southern France with a hotel full of characters, family problems, and mystery.

American Dirt by Jeanne Cummins – Learn what it might be like to be a Mexican mother and son trying to make their way to the United States as an illegal immigrant after their family is murdered by the Cartel.
