


MISSION COMMITTEE

COUNCIL NOTES

The Church Council has spent a great deal of time this summer reading, discussing, and updating the by-laws of our church. This is a process that is done every 5 years or so and was last done in 2018.

The changes that we are proposing will require a Congregational Special Meeting to pass the changes. This will be scheduled in October or November, but we wanted to let you know what the changes will entail. The actual document, with changes noted, will be available for you to peruse in October through email and printed copies.

Generally, here are the 3 main changes we are proposing:

- Reducing the number of council members from 7 to 5 due to the smaller number of members in the church and the difficulty to find members to serve on the council. The number was raised from 5 to 7 in 2006 when the membership was 190. Our membership is now 122.
- Simplifying the requirements for active membership to reflect only the things we can actually keep track of such as attendance, financial support, or involvement in activities.
- Removing the requirement of 2 years of membership to be on the church council. Two years of membership would still be required to be a council officer, treasurer, or financial secretary. This would allow new members to be involved early in their church membership.

The remainder of the changes are often grammatical or wording changes to reflect our church today.

If you have any questions or comments about these proposed changes, please speak to any council member. Look for the printed or emailed change copies in early October. The meeting date will be published as soon as decided upon.

SOMETHING TO SHARE

July 7, 2024 Seventh Sunday after Pentecost "Sent with Power" Mark 6:1-13

Mark 6: 7-9 tells us that (Jesus) called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. (from the NRSV)

Some folks in the United Church of Christ jokingly refer to evangelism as "the e-word." Evangelist simply means "messenger of good news." And yet, the word has become associated with the most damaging aspects of Christian experience. Even the idea of evangelism can call to mind uncomfortable or even traumatizing past experiences. And yet, as Jesus called those early disciples to a life of evangelism, he calls followers today.

Take some time today to consider the word evangelist.

Do you think the idea of the United Church of Christ evangelism can be refreshed and renewed for a new generation? How might that be accomplished?

How do you feel when you hear the word evangelism? Pay attention to where the word settles in your body. Do you feel uncomfortable? Very uncomfortable? Why do you think you have that response?

What do you think the role of an evangelist is? How does the role in modern times echo the call that Jesus made to his original disciples?

What are some ways that your faith community engages in evangelism now? What are some ways that your community could evangelize that it does not yet?

Church Council Meeting Minutes St. Paul's United Church of Christ July 8, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President, Charmaine Duehring, at 6:00pm. Those in attendance were Charmaine Duehring, Kay O'Keane, Cindy Cain, Connie Johnson, Pastor Bonnie Jacque, Vicki Dost, and Janene Kluever. Kim Kersten and Fred Dieball were unable to join us.

The June meeting minutes were approved after amended. Investments and offerings have been good and the Financial Report was approved. We had the Pastor's report of her many visits to our members. The Brat Fry plans are moving ahead. There will be a sign up sheet soon. It was suggested we have a flag or sign of some kind at the ticket sales table to let people know who and what we are. The garbage pick-up will be discussed later.

We are still waiting for a dry week to complete the shingling on the steeple roof. Jack Duehring noticed that the roof above the front door is missing some shingles and Jack will discuss this with the current shingle crew. We will add this extra work and the increase would be \$1850. CPR training will be conducted by Keith Gorherd and the limit is 18 people. This will take place in September. The septic system was pumped June 24th, The charge of \$40 for the water test was for April, 2023.

The postage is going up again by \$.05. We think it would be less expensive if we use emailing versus snail mail wherever possible for those who have emails. We will limit those who will get the snail mail.

We discussed further on the By-Laws. Our next meeting will be held August 12, 2024. Meeting was adjourned at 7:17pm,
