PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Luke 11: 1-13 was the assigned text for last Sunday. My meditation focused on the Lord's prayer and not much about the parable Jesus told in Luke 11: 5-8: "And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything out of friendship, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs."

Have you ever had a persistent knock on the door at midnight? Jesus asked a rhetorical question about friendship and giving what someone needs. Many translations interpret this persistent knocking to instruct us to be persistent in prayer. The Greek word used here is shameless. Shame on you for not opening the door for a friend who was out of food for a guest. Hospitality requires that much of the friend.

Jesus says "even you know how to give good gifts"...shame on you for thinking that God doesn't.

I have had calls from people in distress and had to deny them. I felt ashamed. I would have helped if it was in my power to do so. I have hung up the phone and cried. What I am thankful for is that they felt comfortable enough to even call me. The really important thing is being able to ask because sometimes we let our pride get in our way.

And they thanked me despite my inability to fill their need. Their thank you was not given to be polite; this was a thanks for valuing them by listening, really listening. I made a follow up call to one particular person. She was doing alright.

How far would you go for a friend? How far would you go for a stranger?
