

The Goal of Covenant

The covenant is not an end in itself it is a path toward **restoration, righteous living, and peace among peoples** under YAHUAH's instruction.

From the Torah through the prophets, the vision is clear:

Humanity learning to walk in YAHUAH's ways together.

Covenant Leads to Restoration

The prophets describe a future where scattered peoples return to covenant alignment and moral clarity.

Micah 4:1–2

“...many nations shall come and say, ‘Let us go... that He may teach us His ways...’”

This shows restoration as:

- return to instruction
- shared pursuit of righteousness
- willingness to learn

Restoration is about **realigning life** with divine instruction.

Covenant Establishes Righteous Order

The Torah frames obedience as the foundation for justice, ethics, and social stability.

When nations walk in instruction:

- justice increases
- violence decreases
- harmony becomes possible

The prophets envision Torah as the moral framework for society.

Covenant Produces Peace Among Peoples

The prophetic picture is not domination it is cooperation under shared righteousness.

Micah continues by describing:

- reduced conflict
- security
- mutual respect

Peace flows from aligned conduct.

Nations Walking in Torah

The prophets do not imagine isolated obedience they describe **many nations** choosing to learn.

This emphasizes:

- participation
- unity through instruction
- moral transformation

The covenant becomes a shared path.

Dwelling in Relationship with YAHUAH

At its deepest level, covenant is relational:

- closeness
- trust
- reverence
- shared life

The prophets portray humanity learning to live in conscious relationship with YAHUAH.

Zephaniah 3:9

“...I will restore pure speech... that they may call on YAHUAH... and serve Him together.”

The goal is unified reverence and cooperative service.

The covenant aims toward:

Restoration of people

Righteous social order

Peace among nations

Shared instruction

Living in relationship with YAHUAH
