

# The Messiah's Original Hebrew Name

The Messiah's Hebrew Name is written as:

יהושע

Transliterated as:

**Yahusha**

This Name was spoken, known, and used within Hebrew culture and covenant life. It was not created by translation, nor adapted to fit foreign languages.

## Breakdown of the Name Yahusha

The Name Yahusha is a covenant declaration.

Breakdown:

- **YAH** - the Name of the Father, YAHUAH
- **USHA** - to save, deliver, rescue

Together, the Name means:

**YAHUAH is salvation**

The Name itself proclaims the mission of the Messiah and the source of salvation.

## The Prophetic Naming Pattern in Scripture

The Messiah's Name follows a consistent prophetic pattern found throughout the Tanakh, where YAHUAH places His Name within the names of those He appoints.

Examples include:

YeshaYahu  
Yirmeyahu  
Eliyahu

Each of these names:

- Contains the element **YAH**
- Declares YAHUAH as the source of the mission
- Points authority away from the servant and back to YAHUAH

The Messiah follows this same pattern fully and perfectly.

## **The Son Came in the Father's Name**

The Messiah directly testified that He came bearing the Father's Name.

Yochanan John 5:43

“I have come in My Father's Name.”

This statement establishes a covenant requirement:

- The Father's Name must be present
- The Father's authority must be carried
- The identity of the Sender must be visible in the Sent One

A name that removes **YAH** cannot fulfill this statement.

## **Covenant Implications of the Name**

The Name Yahusha does not replace the Father.  
It proclaims Him.

Salvation is not separated from YAHUAH.  
It is declared through the Son.

Tehillim Psalm 54:1  
Save me, O Elohim, by Your Name.

Yoel Joel 2:32  
Whoever calls on the Name of YAHUAH shall be saved.

The Messiah's Name aligns perfectly with these covenant declarations.

- The Messiah's Name is Hebrew, not symbolic
- The Name contains the Father's Name
- The Name declares the mission of salvation
- The Son came in the Father's Name
- Removing YAH removes covenant clarity

This is not preference.

This is **Torah order**.

The original Hebrew Name of the Messiah is **Yahusha**.

It carries:

- The Name of the Father
- The authority of the Sender
- The declaration of salvation

A Name that removes YAH cannot fulfill Scripture.

**Yahusha** means:

**YAHUAH is salvation.**
