

How the Feast Days Point to Yahusha HaMashiach

The Spring Feasts Redemption and Deliverance

The spring feast days focus on **rescue, freedom, and new life**.

They teach:

- Deliverance from bondage

Yahusha lived and walked these appointed times during His earthly life.
He did not cancel them.
He **fulfilled them by walking in them perfectly**.

For beginners, this shows:

- Redemption is lived, not just believed

The Fall Feasts Restoration and Kingdom Order

The fall feast days focus on:

- Reflection
- Repentance
- Restoration
- Dwelling in right order

These appointed times teach that redemption does not stop at rescue. It continues into **alignment, accountability, and restoration.**

This is not about prediction or fear.
It is about hope and order.

Fulfillment Does Not Mean Abolishment

A common misunderstanding is that fulfillment means something ends.

In Scripture, fulfillment means:

- Something is carried out correctly
