

# WHERE THE NAME CAME FROM

## The Name Originates at Sinai Through Revelation

The Name **YAHUAH** did not come from language development, scholarship, or translation it came through **direct revelation**. At Mount Sinai, YAHUAH revealed Himself by Name to the children of Israel as He established covenant instruction. This shows that the Name is not human-assigned but **divinely disclosed**, tied directly to covenant relationship and obedience.

- **Exodus 3:14–15** - YAHUAH declares His Name and commands that it be remembered for all generations.
- **Exodus 19–20** – The-Name is given in the context of covenant formation and instruction.

If the Name came from Sinai, then no later language has authority to replace it.

## The Name Precedes All Translation Traditions

Greek, Latin, and English translations came **centuries later**. The Name already existed in Hebrew Scripture long before these languages were used to translate the text. This proves that translations did not *create* the Name they only **handled** it.

A translation can transmit meaning, but it does not have authority to rename the One being translated.

## The Dead Sea Scrolls Confirm Preservation, Not Creation

The Dead Sea Scrolls do not introduce the Name they **confirm it**. Ancient Hebrew manuscripts consistently preserve the Tetragrammaton (יהוה), showing that the Name remained written even when spoken usage began to decline.

- **Psalms 135:13** - The Name of YAHUAH endures forever.

Preservation proves continuity. A Name written thousands of times across manuscripts cannot be accidental or symbolic.

## Written Preservation Continued Even When Speech Changed

Over time, traditions arose that avoided speaking the Name aloud. However, even when speech customs shifted, the **written Name remained**. This distinction is important: tradition affected pronunciation, not revelation.

Human tradition may change behavior, but it does not change what YAHUAH revealed or what Scripture preserved.

## Sinai Is the Source the Scrolls Are the Evidence

Sinai is where the Name was revealed.  
The scrolls are where the Name was preserved.

Together, they show:

- The Name was revealed by YAHUAH Himself
- The Name existed before translations
- The Name endured through generations
- The Name was never lost only later replaced in speech and translation

The Name YAHUAH came from divine revelation at Mount Sinai, not from translation traditions. Ancient Hebrew manuscripts confirm that the Name was preserved long before Greek, Latin, or English translations existed. Sinai is the source of the Name, and the scrolls are the evidence of its preservation.
