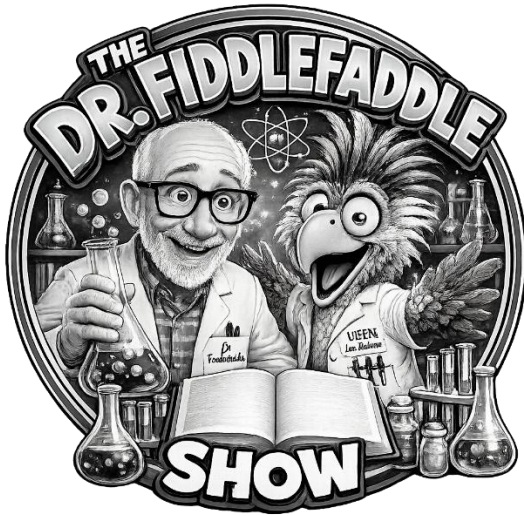




Teacher's Guide

The Fiddlefaddle Bible College Version of the Wordless Book

Purpose

This lesson is designed to help teachers clearly explain the Gospel of Jesus Christ to children using five simple colors. The Wordless Book has been used for generations because children often remember pictures and colors long after they forget a lesson.

The goal is not simply for children to know the colors, but to understand God's plan of salvation and how they can continue growing as Christians.

Recommended Age: 5–12 years old

Lesson Length: 20–30 minutes

Lesson Objective

By the end of this lesson children should be able to:

- Explain what each color represents.
- Understand why everyone needs Jesus Christ.

- Know that salvation is by grace through faith.
- Understand that Heaven is God's prepared home.
- Know that Christians should continue growing in the Lord.

Materials

- Dr. Fiddlefaddle Show video
- Wordless Book (or colored cards)
- Bible (KJV)
- Crayons or markers
- Coloring page (optional)

Opening

Ask the children:

"Have you ever read a book without any words?"

Allow them to answer.

Then say:

"Today we're going to learn about a very special book that has no words at all—but it tells the greatest story ever told!"

PAGE ONE

BLACK

Sin

Scripture

Romans 3:23 (KJV)

"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;"

Main Truth

Black reminds us of sin.

Sin is anything we think, say, or do that disobeys God.

Every person has sinned.

No one is good enough to earn Heaven.

Explain

You may ask:

- Have you ever told a lie?
- Have you ever disobeyed your parents?
- Have you ever been selfish?

The Bible says everyone has sinned.

Key Teaching Point

God loves us,
but sin separates us from Him.

Memory Phrase

Black reminds me of my sin.

PAGE TWO

RED

Jesus Paid the Price

Scripture

Romans 6:23 (KJV)

"For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Main Truth

Red reminds us of the blood Jesus shed on the cross.

Jesus took the punishment we deserved.

He died,
was buried,
and rose again.

Because of Jesus,
forgiveness is available.

Explain

A wage is something earned.

Sin earns death.

But God offers a free gift.

Jesus paid the price.

Key Teaching Point

Jesus died in our place because He loves us.

Memory Phrase

Red reminds me Jesus paid for my sins.

PAGE THREE

BLUE

Faith

Scriptures

Ephesians 2:8 (KJV)

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:"

John 3:16 (KJV)

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Main Truth

Blue reminds us to place our faith in Jesus Christ.

We are not saved by:

- being good
- going to church
- giving money
- getting baptized

We are saved only by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

Explain

Imagine someone offers you a gift.

You don't earn it.

You simply receive it.

Salvation is God's gift.

Key Teaching Point

Trust Jesus alone.

Memory Phrase

Blue reminds me to believe in Jesus.

PAGE FOUR

GOLD

Heaven

Scripture

John 14:2 (KJV)

"In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you."

Main Truth

Gold reminds us of Heaven.

Jesus is preparing a wonderful home for everyone who believes in Him.

Heaven is:

- perfect

- beautiful
- without sin
- forever with Jesus

Explain

Gold reminds us of something precious.

Heaven is the greatest place anyone could ever imagine.

Key Teaching Point

Jesus is preparing a home for His children.

Memory Phrase

Gold reminds me Heaven is my home.

PAGE FIVE

GREEN

Grow

Scripture

2 Peter 3:18 (KJV)

"But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ..."

Main Truth

Green reminds us that living things grow.

When someone trusts Christ,
that is only the beginning.

Christians should continue growing by:

- reading the Bible
- praying
- obeying God
- attending church
- telling others about Jesus

Explain

Show a picture of a tiny plant.

Ask:

"Does it stay tiny forever?"

Neither should Christians.

God wants us to grow spiritually.

Key Teaching Point

Growing Christians become stronger Christians.

Memory Phrase

Green reminds me to grow with Jesus.

Gospel Invitation

Explain carefully:

God loves every child.

Because we have all sinned, we need a Savior.

Jesus died for our sins, was buried, and rose again.

Anyone who believes on Jesus Christ may receive eternal life.

Avoid pressuring children into making a decision. Instead, clearly present the gospel, encourage questions, and invite those who want to speak privately with a trusted adult or teacher after the lesson.

Review Questions

1. What does the black page remind us of?
2. What does the red page remind us of?
3. Why did Jesus die on the cross?
4. What does the blue page teach us?
5. Can we earn salvation?
6. What does the gold page represent?
7. Who is preparing Heaven?
8. What does the green page remind us to do?
9. How can we grow as Christians?
10. Which color do you remember the best, and why?

Memory Verses

- **Black:** Romans 3:23
- **Red:** Romans 6:23
- **Blue:** Ephesians 2:8 and John 3:16
- **Gold:** John 14:2
- **Green:** 2 Peter 3:18

Teacher's Challenge

Encourage each child to remember the five colors:

- **Black** — I am a sinner.
- **Red** — Jesus died for my sins.
- **Blue** — Salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- **Gold** — Heaven is God's prepared home for believers.
- **Green** — Keep growing in your walk with the Lord.

When children can remember these five colors, they have a simple framework for sharing the Gospel with others for the rest of their lives.
