Happy New Year!

On Tuesday, January 27 mixed teams of ladies and senior men will compete in a scramble tournament at Vista Valencia in a format similar to our recent December scramble. Shotgun start is set for 8:00 AM, with lunch and presentation of cash awards following in the clubhouse. The entry fee for this special event is \$63, which can be paid in any of the usual ways – Zelle to Roger, check in the box at the course, or check in the mail – with the exception that checks should be mailed directly to me rather than to Risto or Bill. Entry deadline is Friday, January 16.

Hello Fellow Golfers,

We all enjoyed the December Scramble tournament. Thanks to the Vista Course for setting up a nice lunch area for use.

Our next home tournament is a Low Net event on January 15th. Entry deadline is Friday Jan 2nd. Enter now. I will be picking up any entries in the course box on Tuesday the 6th.

Our agreement with the Vista course is that we must provide a head count and a payment 8 days prior to the tournament. I can add a player if there is room in an existing foursome, but cannot add a foursome. I can drop you from the tournament if needed. You would get a refund of entry fees only if there is someone on the wait list willing to take your place.

During the winter rainy season, only the Vista course management has the option to cancel a tournament. If the course is open and playable, our tournament will proceed. I cannot refund any money if you decide not to play.

To enter a tournament:

- Electronic form on the website (under the “More” heading select “Vista Event”)
- Manual entry form (under the “Events” heading and scroll to the bottom of the tournament schedule page), print and fill out. Place it in the box at the course or mail to my address.

To pay for a tournament:

- Checks should be placed in the box at the course or mailed to my address.

Setting up Zelle is simple, and there are two ways to do it: through your bank or through the Zelle app. Sending your entry fees to VVSMGC goes to: vvsmgc@gmail.com

Option 1: Set Up Zelle Through Your Bank

Most major U.S. banks already include Zelle in their mobile banking apps.

Steps

1. Open your bank's mobile app (or log in on to the website).
2. Look for "Send Money," "Payments," "Transfers," or "Zelle."

Select Zelle®.

3. Enter your email address or U.S. mobile phone number to enroll.
4. Choose the bank account you want to link to Zelle.
5. Verify enrollment (usually via a code sent to email or text).

You're done! You can now send or receive money.

Option 2: Set Up Zelle Using the Zelle App Use this only if your bank doesn't offer Zelle.

Steps

1. Download the Zelle® app from the App Store or Google Play.
2. Open the app and select "Get Started."
3. Enter your U.S. mobile number or email.
4. Create and verify your Zelle account.
5. Link a U.S. bank account or debit card (must be a Visa or Mastercard debit card).

After linking your bank account, you can send and receive money.

Requirements

1. A U.S. bank account.
2. A U.S. phone number or email address.
3. Must be at least 18 years old.

Important Tips

1. Always double-check the recipient's phone or email—Zelle transfers are instant and usually can't be reversed.
2. Zelle is for people you trust (friends, family, known contacts), not for purchases or strangers.

Greetings all. I hope you all enjoyed your Christmas holiday. A couple of questions came up during the last month.

First off, I was asked what the proper etiquette was for where you should place the rake in a bunker. Inside the bunker or outside? I talked to one of the desk workers at Vista and he said they really didn't have a rule for this. I did a little more research and consensus is as follows: We should place the rake tines in the bunker with the handle being placed outside of the bunker. This makes sense to me and I would appreciate everyone's efforts towards using this method.

The second question was regarding if we get free relief if we can't find our ball in all the leaves. We discussed this at our November board meeting and decided there is no free relief. You have three minutes to find your ball and if you can't, you play it as a lost ball.

Finally, I came across a great YouTube video for anyone who wants a refresher on the rules. It's called "Every Golf Rule Explained Like You're 10" by Golf Xplained. Check it out if you'd like.
