

"We just want to spread the glory of God around," said teen missionary Zach Webb.



CHINA

Ürümqi

Xinjiang Province has historically been Uyghur, an Islamic minority group. But a flood of Han Chinese in the 1950s diluted Uyghur presence and introduced racial tensions to the area. The hearts of many Han Christians have become hardened toward their lost Uyghur neighbors.

Harbin

Famous for its annual snow and ice festival, Harbin is home mostly to poor people just in from the countryside.

Baotou

In the early 1920s, a Chinese pastor quickly won several thousand people to the Lord after founding a church near Baotou. Today, there are about 30,000 believers in the city—about 2 percent of the population.

Datong

Datong is a struggling city. Poor, polluted from years of coal production and devastated by earthquakes, Datong's only drawing card is the historical and cultural relics nearby.

Shijiazhuang

A recent flood of immigrants has swelled this capital city from a village of 500 to an industrial center of 2 million.

Tai'an

Dozens of Daoist, Buddhist and Confucian statues dot the city's landscape. Religious leaders have opposed Christian workers.

Lianyuan

Christian activity flourished in Hunan Province until the communist takeover. While the Hunan church is growing once more, cults and false teachings plague the church.

Lhasa, Tibet

Each year tens of thousands of Tibetan pilgrims make their way to the Potala Palace—former home of the Dalai Lama. The palace is named after the holy mountain Potala in southern India, which is sacred to the Hindu goddess Shiva as "Lord of the World."

Chongqing

Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Mississippi, the Carolinas and Virginia have a combined population equal to Chongqing. With 32 million residents, Chongqing is the largest city in the world in both size and population.

Zunyi

Only 0.96 percent of Zunyi's 6.7 million people are known to be Christians.





