John has done a great job in getting our course into shape for early season. **HOWEVER** it is imperative that we all pitch in and do our part to help maintain the current shape of the course as we move into the hot summer months. The following suggestions will help keep our course in the best shape possible and **frankly is regular golf etiquette expected at ANY respectable course:**

- 1. Please keep golf carts on paths and fairways as much as possible**
- 2. If you must drive across the native areas please do so at a 90 degree angle, it is not irrigated and cart traffic will turn it to dust and hard pan in no time, nobody likes to hit off of hard dirt**
- 3. DO NOT drive carts within 100 feet of the greens, we have already noticed cart traffic around the green collars, this is not only disrespectful to John and the course, but it quickly deteriorates the areas around the greens and it is not acceptable**
- 4. Please keep carts on cart paths where they exist especially around tee boxes and greens.**
- 5. Repair your ball marks on the greens**
- 6. Sand divots on par 3 tee boxes, sandboxes are located next to the tees**

We appreciate your efforts to help keep our course nice so that everyone can enjoy it in the best shape possible. It is up to us to maintain a nice course to enjoy all summer, please encourage other members to do the same.
