What Makes 4SEND Different

At 4SEND, we don't just offer services, we offer understanding, advocacy, and a genuine sense of community. Our approach is shaped by experience, empathy, and a commitment to doing things differently.

Lived Experience at the Core

Our team includes parent carers, neurodivergent individuals, support workers, advocates and professional volunteers who have walked this path themselves. We get it, because we've lived it.

Holistic & Neuro-Affirming

We see the full picture. Every family, every child, every situation is unique. We champion neurodiversity and support the whole person, not just a diagnosis.

Collaborative & Transparent

We work with families, not for them. You remain the expert in your own life. We're here to support, empower, and uplift, never to take over.

Equity Over Equality

We tailor our support to meet real needs. Whether you're battling systemic barriers, cultural stigma, or just feeling overwhelmed, we meet you where you are, and walk with you from there.

Our Services

How We Support Our Community

At 4SEND, our support is practical, empowering, and rooted in lived experience. We offer a range of services tailored to meet the unique needs of SEND families and individuals:

Peer Support & Mentoring

We create safe spaces for connection, understanding, and solidarity.

- Join our supportive online community groups
- Attend networking events, coffee mornings, and inclusive meet-ups
- Access 1:1 peer mentoring or small group support sessions Families and caregivers can share experiences, gain insights, and feel part of a wider community that truly understands the challenges of navigating the SEND world.

Through these shared experiences, we reduce isolation, tackle internalised and systemic ableism, and foster a culture of inclusion, confidence, and self-awareness.

• Referrals & Signposting

Finding the right support can be overwhelming, we're here to help.

- We provide informed referrals to appropriate services and professionals
- Our team understands the landscape because we've lived it ourselves – as SEND parents, caregivers, and neurodivergent individuals
- We'll guide you to services that align with your specific needs, at the right time

Meeting Preparation & In-Meeting Support

Navigating meetings can be overwhelming – we'll help you feel confident and prepared.

We support families before, during, and after key meetings with professionals, including:

- EHCP reviews
- School meetings (e.g. SEND reviews, behaviour panels, reintegration plans)
- Multi-agency meetings
- Social care meetings
- Mediation preparation

Our support includes:

- Pre-meeting planning: helping you clarify your concerns, priorities, and questions
- Reviewing documents and reports to ensure you're fully informed
- Helping you understand your rights and what to expect
- Attending meetings alongside you, either in-person or remotely, to help communicate your views and ensure you're heard
- Post-meeting debriefs to help you reflect, plan next steps, and make sense of outcomes

We ensure that families feel empowered to advocate for their children with clarity and confidence.

Form Filling Support

We take the stress out of complex applications.

- Support with Disability Living Allowance (DLA) and Personal Independence Payment (PIP) forms
- Help with mandatory reconsiderations and appeals
- Clear guidance so that your application reflects the full picture of need

• Information & Guidance

We help you make sense of your rights, processes, and available support.

- Clear, practical information on SEND law, benefits, and local services
- Guidance around parental rights, school processes, and navigating local authority systems

Whether you're new to SEND or facing a new challenge, we're here to help you feel informed and empowered.

• Personalised Resources

- Designed in collaboration with you, to meet the needs of your child or young person
