The Chinese Virus continues to impact our Nation, State, and Community - although the impacts on Post 243 have thankfully been indirect. A direct impact came on 12 July as an order from the State of Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR), which licenses and regulates businesses that serve alcohol and provide professional services. The DBPR issued an Executive Order that ALL American Legion and VFW Posts should be shut down until further notice.

Post 243 and other posts without bars, are not licensed or regulated by the DBPR and may not be subject to the shut-down order. This is being contested on behalf of the many dry Posts such as 243, for a clarification that we are not subject to the DBPR and can continue meeting in support of our mission of service to veterans and our community. Post 243 is presently shut down until further notice, but we hope to resume wearing our masks, maintaining our spacing, and exercising our personal judgement and responsibilities. Stand by!
