Coronavirus

A family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases, such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS-CoV). The novel coronavirus recently discovered has been named SARS-CoV-2 and it causes COVID-19. (Source: WHO)

Self-quarantine

Issued to restrict people from leaving their homes for anything other than essential activities. By March 30, at least 27 states will have those orders in effect. Those states contain more than 225 million people -- more than two-thirds of the country's population.

Vaccine

Any preparation used as a preventive inoculation to confer immunity against a specific disease, usually employing an innocuous form of the disease agent, such as killed or weakened bacteria or viruses, to stimulate antibody production.

Virus

Entered English around 1590–1600. It comes directly from the Latin *vīrus*, meaning "slime, poison." (Dictionary.com)
