While VA and Arlington National Cemeteries charge no fees for a veteran to be buried there. They may charge a fee for a veteran's spouse to be buried with the veteran, though. Most State Veterans Cemeteries have residency requirements, and some charge a small fee for the burial of dependents. The VA will also provide a free headstone or marker for the retiree's remains at any cemetery in the world. Read More
