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General Requirements for Landscape & Golf PRODUCT PURCHASES

GOLF

- Proof of General Class L1 Applicator Certificate NBECC
- ▶ IPM Valid Accreditation number issued by PHAC

LANDSCAPE

- ▶ Proof of Valid Operator's Licence or Permit issued by NBECC
- ▶ Proof of Valid IPM Accreditation number issued by PHAC
- Proof of Commercial Class D1 Applicator Certificate ENB
 Re-write exam every 5 year check dates

General Requirements for Landscape & Golf PESTICIDE STORAGE REQUIREMENTS

- Floor impermeable to pesticides contain at least 110% volume of product stored (containing no active floor drains)
- Restrict access to authorized (certified) personnel only. Doors and windows that lock.
- A contingency plan in place (a sample contingency plan is available online or upon request to the Pesticide Unit).
- Adequate Ventilation & Sufficient lighting.

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Plant Health Atlantic Appropriate materials for the containment and cleanup of a pesticide spill.

General Requirements for Landscape & Golf PESTICIDE STORAGE REQUIREMENTS

- A first aid kit, respirator with NIOSH approved pesticide cartridges and protective clothing (eye protection, gloves, coveralls, and boots) stored in an accessible location and maintained
- Posted with a bilingual sign (at all access points) containing the words "Pesticide Storage; Authorized Persons Only; No Smoking". (A sample sign is available online or upon request to the Pesticide Unit.)
- Used exclusively for storage of pesticides

General Requirements for Landscape PERMIT CONDITIONS - STORAGE

Per permit condition 20: The Permit holder shall ensure that the local Fire Department and local office of the Department of Public Safety are notified as to the location of all pesticide storage facilities for which the Permit Holder is responsible and must also supply a copy of the Permit Holder's Contingency Plan.



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General Requirements for Landscape PERMIT CONDITIONS - STORAGE

Per permit condition 21: A copy of the Permit Holder's permit and Contingency Plan, along with appropriate pesticide product labels and applicable Safety Data Sheets (SDS), must be available at all pesticide storage areas and in all vehicles carrying pesticides.

General Requirements for Landscape & Golf CONTAINER DISPOSAL

Take them back

Container Container Revolting

- ► CONTAINERS
 - Some vendors are part of AWSA Clean Farms Program pesticide container recyle program for non-deposit 23L clean plastic containers.
 - ▶ Triple rinse, remove labels & caps.
 - Return to designated vendor no charge
 - Contact PHAC for list of sites

General Requirements for Landscape & Golf DISPOSAL

- ► UNWANTED PRODUCT
 - Contact NB Environment & Climate Change for any disposal questions.
 - ► AWSA (Clean Farms Program) holds clean-up day for unwanted pesticides about every 3 years.
 - Excellent time to clean out unwanted / dated products.
 - ▶ NB Province wide collection was last done in 2021.
 - PHAC will notify members of date(s) and drop-off locations when next available.

General Requirements for Lawn Care LANDSCAPE PERMIT CONDITIONS

- Canadian registered products only. NO USA EPA products.
- Must comply with all label conditions (mixing rates, # of applications per season, timing, etc.)
- ▶ No products containing 2,4-D

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- Limited number of products available for applications over 5 meters.
 - only use oils, soaps, and biologicals registered as pesticides for the control of insects.

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- Pesticide applications to a school or day-care property are only to be conducted during prolonged periods of vacancy (48 hours or more)
- Alternative methods for disease, insect, or weed management has been considered before using pesticides.
- Shall not apply pesticides (fungicides, herbicides and/or insecticides) to an area greater that fifty percent (50%) of total lawn/turf area per property, per season.

General Requirements for Landscape PERMIT CONDITIONS

- All gas/electric powered application equipment must have digital flow meter.
- ▶ Wind speed max is 16km/hr or less if stated on the label.
- Surface water setback is 15 m.
- ▶ Posting of all applications.

General Requirements for Landscape PERMIT CONDITIONS

- When conducting a pesticide application to ornamentals, shrubs, or trees over five metres (5 m) in height
 - Written permission must be received from adjacent landowners prior to the commencement of the treatment.
 - ► Wind speed not to exceed 5 km/hr or less if stated on the label.
 - Surface water setback increased to 30 m.
 - Posting of all applications.

General Requirements for Landscape POSTING - SIGNAGE

- Must clearly post the treatment area at all points of public access. ISSUE WITH NBECC
 - ▶ Visible to anyone approaching the site on foot.
 - ▶ Typically require minimum of 2 per site
 - May need 3 for corner properties more for industrial, schools, parks
- Posting of 'non-pesticide treatment' signs.
 - ▶ Is acceptable voluntary.

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General Requirements for Landscape POSTING - SIGNAGE

Contain the following information:

- Operator name or logo and phone number
- "Post for a minimum of 24 hours (remove after 48 hours)"
 NOTE
- For all application of pesticides to a common area of a multi-unit dwelling (apartments, townhouses, etc.) all entrances to that dwelling must be posted prior to the commencement of any pesticide application.

General Requirements for Landscape POSTING - SIGNAGE

- The property owner must be informed that these signs must stay in place for a minimum of 24 hours after the application of pesticide and must be removed no later than 48 hours following the treatment.
- NBECC has received complaints regarding signs still posted well after the 48 hour removal time. We don't want situation as in PEI with mandatory removal so be sure to inform client to remove after 48 hours.
- NBECC has not been considering it as direct noncompliance. Want industry to pay some attention,



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General Requirements for Landscape PERMIT CONDITIONS

TREATEMENT RECORD KEEPING

- Maintain a record of each property that was treated (address, property description).
- Date and time of the application.
- ▶ Weather conditions, wind speed and direction.
- Specific type of pest that was being targeted.
- ▶ Quantity of pesticide that were used in the treatment.

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Can use example in PHAC Desk Audit.

General Requirements for Landscape PROVISIONAL PERMITS

► A Provisional Permit may be obtained from NBECC to conduct blanket applications for insect infestations only where the control application would cause you to exceed the maximum of 50% of the turf area for that property.

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 Applies for European chafer & Hairy Chinch Bug control applications.

General Requirements for Landscape PROVISIONAL PERMITS

- For control of Hairy Chinch Bug you must submit with the application a photo showing the area of the infestation and damage on the property planned for treatment.
- For control of European Chafer you must submit with the application a photo of the area of the infestation and damage on the property planned for treatment or damage from another property within 250m of the property planned for treatment.

General Requirements for Landscape PROVISIONAL PERMITS

- Application and payment for Provisional Permits can be made online by visiting: Call Tanya London https://www.pxw1.snb.ca/snb9000/product.aspx?productid=A 001P390017&l=e
- Good for single application per property only.
- Applies to insecticide applications only
- Application made on-line with photo of damage -\$50/request.
- Provisional Permit must be received prior to application.
- Further comments at Panel Discussion.

ENVIRONMENT ENFORCEMENT & COMPLIANCE

- NBECC will be using regional inspectors to help monitor & enforce regulations in 2023.
- NBECC plan some unannounced Spot Audits of golf courses & landscape facilities in 2023.
- COMPLIANCE Inspecting permit condition, only registered products being used, site record keeping, provisional permits, signage & storage facilities.

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- Signage issues (removal & location) & record keeping wanting in 2022.
- ▶ Health Canada may also do some spot audits in 2023.

Plant Health Atlantic Council Enforcement & Compliance Process

- Enforcement & Compliance Committee
- Standards of Practice established for each sector
- PHAC auditor will investigate all reported violations and complaints. Held in confidence. Advise Committee.
- Auditor can conduct unannounced Spot Audits. Number done each year - complaints, blanket spraying, wind.
- Executive may suspend, revoke, or cancel an individual's certificate or may reduce, suspend, revoke, or cancel IPM Accreditation status. Has happened.

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Plant Health Atlantic Council Enforcement & Compliance

Action taken if member:

- Fails to follow the PHAC Standards of Practice
- Found to be in violation of provincial or federal pesticide legislation (non-registered product – no licence, etc.)
- Knowingly present false or misleading information to an auditor on a Desk Audit or during an On-site or Spot Audit

Plant Health Atlantic Council Enforcement & Compliance

- Action taken if member:
 - At the Baseline or Introductory IPM Accreditation level and are misrepresenting their status of IPM Accreditation – Example: by using PHA logo.
 - Knowingly present false or misleading information to a client

Status of MECOPROP for 2023

- ▶ There maybe a shortage of Mecoprop again in 2023.
- In anticipation PHAC approached Health Canada Enforcement Section and received confirmation that it would not be a violation of the either label if you choose to tank mixed MCPA and Vanquish.

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Recommended Rates:

- MCPA 500 at 25ml/100m2 AND Vanquish at 1.5 -2.8ml/100m2
- MCPA 600 at 21ml/100m2 AND Vanquish at 1.5 -2.8ml/100m2

PRODUCTS CONTAINING IMIDACLOPRID – LAST YEAR OF USE

- May 19, 2023 after this date retailers can no longer sell any of these products with the old label. Landscape and golf courses can still apply any of these products on hand, provided they have the old label.
- May 19, 2024 The last date any of these products can be used by landscape or golf, even if stated on the label. Products with the old label must be destroyed.
- Registered Pests European Chafer and European Crane Fly only.

2023 LIST OF INSECTICIDES REGISTERED FOR TURF MANAGEMENT

Clothianidin 2023 season update for use on Golf Courses only.

Products containing the active ingredient Clothianidin (e.g. Arena PCP:29383) can still be used by golf courses and sod farms through the 2023 season for European Chafers, Japanese Beetle, Masked Chafers, Oriental Beetle and Asianic Garden Beetle at a maximum foliar rate on turf to a single application of 125 g a.i./ha per season
