Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,  
Glory be to Jesus!

In our struggle with life in this fallen world, repentance must be the central theme. Only in repentance will we find the true meaning of life, for by the grace and mercy of God and through faith in Jesus Christ it is only in repentance that one can enter into true communion with God. This life has been given to us for one purpose, that, we might be united with God in a pure and sinless relationship of love, as was His purpose from the very beginning. In our fallen state, our brokenness keeps us separated from God, for our darkened soul cannot see clearly without the work of the Holy Spirit. Repentance is the door through which the Holy Spirit enters and does His work of clearing the way for union with Christ, fellowship with God, Father, ☩ Son and Holy Spirit, and making us whole, preparing us for the work of witnessing Christ to all in this world.

Dr. Martin Luther on repentance:

"To repent means to feel the wrath of God in earnest because of one's sin, so that the sinner experiences anguish of heart and is filled with a painful longing for the salvation and the mercy of God."

"Repentance is not penitence alone but also faith, which apprehends the promise of forgiveness, lest the penitent sinners perish."

What Christ meant by His call to Repentance:

1. Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, in saying: "Repent ye" (Matthew 4:17), wanted the entire life of believers to be a repentance....
2. He does not, however, mean inward repentance only; in fact, such inward repentance is not real at all if it does not outwardly produce various mortifications of the flesh.

"This first is a living and true repentance: to separate the soul from vices for God's sake, to keep it separated, and to separate it ever more."

"It will be no small gain for a penitent to lay hold, before all else, on the memory of his Baptism, confidently to recall the promise of God which he has forsaken, and to plead it before the Lord, happy that he is still within the stronghold of salvation, is baptized, and abhors his wicked ingratitude of falling away from faith and its truth. For wondrously will his heart be comforted and he will be encouraged to hope for mercy when he considers that the divine promise which God made to him and which cannot lie is still intact and unchanged, nay, unchangeable by any sins, just as Paul says (2 Timothy 2:13): "If we believe not, He continueth faithful, He cannot deny Himself." This truth of God, I say, will so sustain him that if all else goes to ruin, this faith of his will not fail him. For in it he has a shield against the assaults of the enemy, a reply to the sins that trouble his conscience, an antidote for

the horror of death and the judgment, and, in fine, a comfort in every temptation, namely, the one truth that he expresses when he says: God is faithful in His promises; His sign have I received in Baptism; if God be for me, who is against me? (Romans 8:31)."

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, as we draw the current church year to a close, with eyes heavenward in anticipation of the glorious and triumphant return of our Lord and the life everlasting that awaits all by faith in Him,

***let us draw near [to God] with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.***

Bokenkamp Childrens Shelter, operated by UpBring (formerly called Lutheran Social Services of the South), is a temporary shelter located here in Corpus Christi. It serves unaccompanied teens ages 12-17 who flee their home countries because of war and violence. The children served at this facility receive lifesaving support, including food, clothing, shelter, case management, education and clinical, medical and spiritual care. Upbring makes sure that children at Bokenkamp receive 24-hour support and supervision. Their goal is to encourage their personal and academic development and empower them with the skills and resources they need to have productive lives once they are reunified with family members or a sponsor.



To help make their Christmas brighter, the **Women of Messiah are adopting these children** as their Christmas project. We invite the congregation to **help us give a wrist watch to every child** in the facility for Christmas. We are asking for monetary donations for the watches so that all watches will be of equal value. 
