The church is the assembly of God's children, those forgiven, redeemed, and saved by the shed blood of Jesus on the Cross of Calvary. Holy Scripture teaches us that Jesus died for all sinners. Even if there would have been only one person to ever live on earth, the Son of God, Jesus, the Christ, would have become incarnate and died on the cross for the sins of that individual. Yet, Holy Scripture also makes it very clear that we are not saved to stand alone as individuals, but we are saved together as a body of believers, as the assembly, the Church of God on earth. We are called to love and serve each other and to join all our gifts together as one body in Christ, to declare through word and deed our faith in Jesus as Savior and Lord and to invite all to receive the Word of God by the power of the Holy Spirit, unto forgiveness, salvation and the promise of eternal life.

The Church of God is the assembly of believers, coming together to stir one another to love and good works. We need the blessings of God to remain faithful in this life, the blessings of coming together as a forgiven, redeemed believers who devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:42).

Therefore, may I humbly and lovingly encourage you to prayerfully consider once again a to begin a regular habit of meeting together with your brothers and sisters in Christ, here in God's house at Messiah Lutheran-Corpus Christi, Texas, **encouraging one another**, **and all the more as you see the Day drawing near**.
