Dear Saints of the Messiah, Glory to Jesus forever!

On Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate the Feast of the Day of Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to His Church. This begins the season of Pentecost, the long-green season. It is the time of the Church year when the readings focus on the application of the Word of God into the Christian life. Blessed by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit through Holy Baptism, we are empowered to live Christ-like lives.

It was the Holy Spirit who had inspired the Prophet Jeremiah to speak of the establishment of the New Covenant in Christ. This New Covenant would lead to an inner conversion of the heart rather than only an outward observance of God's laws. This inner conversion brings the divine promise: "I will be their God and they shall be my people" (Jeremiah 31:33b).

The will of God Father, accomplished through the work of the Son on the cross of Calvary, is the complete and total forgiveness of sins for all mankind. Therefore, there is no more need for the sacrifices of the Old Testament as there has been, but one all-effective sacrifice made by Christ Jesus. This forgiveness brings more blessing.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (Hebrews 10:19-25)

The sacrificial work of Jesus Christ, as the final priest, has given all believers in Christ access to the heavenly sanctuary. We enter through prayer, with all boldness and confidence, finding a listening compassionate Lord who hears and answers our prayers. In the Divine Service, God first comes to us with forgiveness, then, through our worship with sincerity of heart and full confidence that in Christ our sins are forgiven, we thank and praise God.

Therefore, we are urged to remain faithful to the One who always remains faithful to us. We are called to be concerned for each other as love and good works for our neighbor are the natural fruit of true faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior. Finally, especially during the long, hot, humid months of summer, we are encouraged to continue in the practice of coming together with our brothers and sisters in Christ for worship and fellowship in Word and Sacrament ministry. The unity manifested and displayed in the assembly of believers around the altar of God, gathered to partake of the Holy Supper, is the Church's greatest weapon against Satan. St. Ignatius of Antioch comments in chapter 13 of his *Epistle to the Ephesians*:

"For when ye assemble frequently in the same place, the powers of Satan are destroyed, and the destruction at which he aims is prevented by the unity of your faith."

It is in the assembling of God's people in worship around the Word and Sacraments where the bond of Christian love and concern is maintained, strengthened, and exercised. It is there where the prayers of all Christians in all times and places unite and are made powerful by the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst and through us to the world. It is there where the hope in the promise of everlasting life with God is renewed and kept strong. It is there where we receive the knowledge of truth, with which we go out into the world, bringing God's love and forgiveness to all.

As we now go forward into the summer of 2022, and all the vacations and outdoor activities, let us be ever diligent in attending to the feeding of our spirits in worship around God's Word and Sacraments. God bless and keep us all.

Sharing Jesus' Love in India Lutheran Braille Workers — \$100,000 Jesus said, "I am the light of the world" (John 9:5). This verse is important to the individuals who are Blind or Visually Impaired as



they seek to know the love and light of Christ. This is especially true in India where there are over 62.6 million people who are Blind or Visually Impaired, and most do not know Jesus or have access to the Scriptures. Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) already produces Braille and specialized large print Bibles and other Christian materials in multiple languages used in India and has extensive experience distributing these materials with partner ministries and churches. This grant would help fund the formation of a Ministry Production Center in India to produce and distribute its materials and train workers on the equipment.

### Mission & Outreach to the Least of These Victory Lutheran Church, K. I. Sawyer Community — \$51,356

Christ has charged us in His Holy Word to share the Gospel and minister to the poor. Victory Lutheran Church is an inner-city church located in the unincorporated area of the K.I. Sawyer Community in Gwinn, Michigan. This inner-city church is a means of providing mercy ministries that spread His Word to all people, especially "the least of these." The purchase of a new and larger van will allow them to bring children to hear the love of Jesus and provide a safe place to learn. The church needs a safe haven for the congregation and the unchurched to attend worship and Bible study.

#### Mercy House Belize Lutheran Campus Belize Mission Society — \$100,000

The Belize Mission Society (BMS) has a dental clinic in a multipurpose building that is located in the village. This grant money would fund the building of a Mercy House next to the elementary school and Christ Lutheran Church. By bringing the dental clinic and other programs to the Lutheran campus, it will lead people to the Church and connect them with the missionaries. The BMS is intent on "strengthening their cord" (a reference to Ecclesiastes 4:12) with the Belize FORO (forum), the missionaries, and the local residents. By building relationships with children, they also reach their extended family with the Good News of their Savior, Jesus Christ. Mercy House — Belize Mission Campus will further the mercy work and relationship-building of the BMS while providing a tangible connection to Christ Lutheran Church.
